



CONSTITUTION

OF THE

NOVA SCOTIA CONFERENCE.

ARTICLE I.—OF THE NAME.

This Conference shall be called the "Nova Scotia Conference of the Evangelical Lutheran Synod of Pittsburg."

ARTICLE II.—OF MEMBERS.

This Conference shall consist of the Lutheran ministers and congregations in the Province of Nova Scotia, received into its connection.

ARTICLE III. - OF REPRESENTATION.

Sec. 1—Each parochial district in which religious service is regularly held once in each month, by a pastor in connection with this conference, shall be entitled to a delegate.

Sec. 2.—These delegates shall be elected at a general meeting of the congregations they represent, notice of which meeting shall be duly given beforehand.

Sec. 3.—Each delegate shall present, to the officers of Conference, credentials of his election, attended by the signature of the pastor and of the Secretary of the joint vestry of the charge from which he comes.

Sec. 4.—On the proceedings of Conference these delegates shall have the same rights and privileges as the ministers, namely; the right to move, to second, to debate and to vote.

Sec. 5--No minister or delegate shall absent himself from any regularly called meeting, without a valid ex-Ordinary duties shall not be considered a valid excuse.

ARTICLE IV.—OF THE CONFESSION OF FAITH.

This Conference adopts the doctrinal basis of the Pittsburg Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, as set forth in its revised constitution, (Vide Ministers of Pittsburg Synod—Session—page); being in full held q harmony, with the Confessions as agreed upon and been of held by the General Council of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in North America.

ARTICLE V.—OF THE POWERS OF CONFERENCE.

Sec 1.—The Powers and Duties of this Conference shall be to guard the purity of Faith and the right admistration of the sacraments among its members; to de vise and execute plans for the increase of the holy, able and effective ministry; to circulate religious literature to promote the religious training of the young, and to co operate with Synod in carrying on the work of mission abroad and ecially among the scattered members of our Church as home.

Sec. 2.--To use all its influence to recommend and encourage the use of such books, in particular, as ar recommended by the Synod and General Council with which it is identified.

Sec. 3.—To collect statistics and information in regard to the Church within its limits, to publish the same ballot as may be deemed advisable; and to send a delegate t necess: the annual meeting of Synod.

Sec. 4.—To watch over the purity of doctrine and life of its ministers, as well as over the observance of their constitution, with its appended Bye-Laws; and to look after the maintenance of discipline both among t himself the clergy and congregations connected with it.

Sec. 5.—To examine all regularly preferred charges against its ministers and to express its judgment, subject to the final action of Synod, with regard to the same.

Sec. 6.—To take charge of all monies entrusted to its charge for any benevolent purpose.

ARTICLE VI.—OF MEETINGS.

nisters of Sec. 1.—A regular meeting of Conference shall be ng in full held quarterly, at such time and place as shall have apon and been determined upon at a previous meeting.

Sec. 2.—A special meeting may be called by the President when authorized or requested, in uniting, by any two pastors, or two Church Councils, so to do.

Sec. 3.—A notice of the time and place of each regular meeting shall be sent, by the Secretary, four weeks before the meeting, to the Lutheran and Missionary for publication; and announced twice at regularly appointed divine service in the principal church of each pastorate.

Sec. 4.—One third (1) of the ministers connected with this Conference, and present at the time and place regularly appointed, shall, with the delegates in attendance, constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE VII.—OF OFFICERS.

Sec. 1.—The Officers of Conference shall be a President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer.

Sec. 2.—The Conference shall elect its officers by h the samballot; a majority of all the members present being delegate to necessary to a choice.

Sec. 3.—The officers shall continue office for four ments regular meetings, or until new officers shall have been elected; incumbents in office being eligible to reelection.

ARTICLE VIII.—DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

Sec. 1.—Duties of the President.—It shall be the duty of the President to preside over all meetings of Confer-

Sec. 2.—The Conference Sermon shall be preached during the regular meetings of Conference, either by the President or by some one whom he has appointed.

Sec. 3.—The President shall present to Conference at the close of his term of office, a written report of the official business transacted by him during the year, as well as of all important events which have occurred during the same time in the history of the Conference. He may, at the same time also, recommend any measures which are calculated to promote the welfare of the Church.

Sec. 4.—The President is authorized to appoint committees not otherwise provided for. With the concurrence of the other officers, he is authorized to report to Synod, and request the suspension or disposal from office of any minister, when any charge of immoral conduct, preaching false doctrine, or neglect of pastoral duty, substantiated by sufficient evidence, has been preferred against him.

Sec. 5.—So far as within his power lies he shall see that the decisions of Conference are carried into effect.

Sec. 6.—Should a vacancy, from any cause occur in the Presidency, during the interim between such vacancy occurring and the meeting of Conference, the Secretary shall, pro tempore, discharge the duties of the office and shall take possession of all papers and docu-

ARTICLE IX.—OF THE DUTIES OF SECRETARY.

Sec. 1.—The Secretary shall keep a faithful and accurate account of all the proceedings of Conference; read at the opening of each session, the minutes of the previous meeting; record the same, after their correction and adoption, in the minute-book; and call the roll.

Sec. 2.—He shall prepare all official documents and deliver the same, attested by his signature, to the Pre-He shall also attest the record of the proceedsident.

Sec. 3.—Should the office of Secretary become vacant, from any cause, during the interim between the occurrence of such vacancy and the meeting of Conference, the President should take posession of all papers and documents belonging to Conference, and keep them in charge until the office can be filled by an election.

ARTICLE X.—OF THE DUTIES OF TREASURER.

Sec. 1.—The Treasurer shall receive and have custody of all monies belonging to Conference, and shall hold the same subject to its orders. He shall pay all sums regularly appropriated, taking receipts for the same and shall present, at each meeting of Conference, a written as been report, with a copy of his account.

Sec. 2.—He shall furnish the Secretary a tabular statement of the amounts received from the several pastoral charges, and of the expenditures made, and attest the

same with his signature.

Sec. 3.—At the close of his term of office, the Conference shall appoint a Finance Committee to audit these several accounts and to advise with the Treasurer-elect in regard to the investment of monies.
