CONSTITUTION OF THE SOCIETY.

I.
The Society shall be called the **DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY OF NEW BRUNSWICK.**

II.
No constitution, bye law, rule or regulation of the Society, or any abrogation, repeal, change or alteration of the same, shall be of any force until it shall have been sanctioned and confirmed by the Bishop of, and administering the Diocese for the time being, by writing under his hand.

III.
The payment at any one time of a sum not less than Ten Pounds, shall constitute a Life Member; and the payment annually of any sum, however small, shall constitute the person paying the same a Member of the Society.

IV.
The Society shall have a President, who shall be the Lord Bishop of the Diocese; two or more Vice Presidents, of whom the Archdeacon shall be the first; one or more Treasurers; one or more Secretaries; two Auditors of Accounts; and an Executive Committee of twenty four Lay Members of the Society, being Life Members of the Society, or Subscribers of, at least, One Pound to the funds of the Society; who, with the exception of the President and Vice Presidents, shall be annually elected at the Anniversary Meeting.

V.
The Officers of the Society and the Clergy of the Diocese shall be *ex-officio* Members of the Committee: five to be a quorum, and three of the five Laymen.

VI.
The Society shall embrace the following objects, and none other, viz.—

1. Missionary Visits to places where there is no settled Clergyman, and aid to new and poor Missions.
2. The establishment of Divinity Scholarships at King's College, Fredericton; and assistance, where necessary, to those who may be under preparation for the Ministry, especially Sons of Clergymen.

3. Aid to Sunday and other Schools in which Church principles are taught, and the training and encouraging of Schoolmasters and Catechists.

4. The supply of Books and Tracts, in strict conformity with the principles of the Established Church.

5. Aid to the building and enlarging of Churches and Chapels.

6. Aid to the building of Parsonage Houses.

7. The creation of a fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of Clergymen who are poor; and towards the education of the Children of such Clergymen; and towards the making a provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity.

8. The creation of a fund for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy.

VII. The Society will employ no Clergyman or Missionary services without the Bishop's license and appointment, and will submit its choice of Divinity Scholarships to His Lordship's approbation.

VIII. The Society will circulate no Books which are not in the Catalogue of the Society for promoting Christian Knowledge, except such as the Bishop shall approve.

IX. It shall be competent to any Member of the Society to limit his subscription to any one or more of the objects above recited, which he may be most anxious to promote.

X. The Members of the Society in each Mission, or in each Parish of each Mission, at the discretion of the Missionary, shall constitute a Local Committee.

XI. It shall be competent to each Committee to recommend any of the above recited objects to the special consideration of the General Committee, in the appropriation of the funds of the Society.

XII. The Society shall hold its Anniversary Meeting at Fredericton and Saint John alternately; at the latter place on the Thursday after the third Tuesday in January, and at the

former place on the Thursday after the second Tuesday in February in each year.

XIII.

The Committee of each Parish or Mission shall hold an Annual Meeting, on some convenient day, previous to the Anniversary Meeting, when the recommendation to the General Committee of special objects shall be determined on.

XIV.

Each Local Committee shall be empowered to depute two Lay Members of the Society to be elected at the Annual Meeting of the Committee, to assist the Missionary in submitting the recommendations of the Committee to the consideration of the General Committee.

XV.

For this purpose the Missionaries and Lay Deputies shall meet in General Committee on the two days, or more if need be, previous to the Anniversary Meeting, to make the annual appropriation of the funds of the Society.

XVI.

The Executive Committee shall meet either at Fredericton or Saint John, on the first Wednesday in January, on the day after the Annual Meeting, on the first Wednesday in March, on the first Wednesday in June, and on the Wednesday after the first Tuesday in October.

XVII.

The Clergy are requested to preach annually two Sermons in their respective Churches, with a collection on each occasion for the General Purposes of the Society.

XVIII.

No article of the Constitution of this Society shall be rescinded, altered or amended, except with the concurrence of two thirds of the Members present at a General Meeting: and notice of any motion shall be given at the General Meeting previous to the one at which such motion is to be made.

XIII

The Committee of each Parish or Mission shall hold an Annual Meeting on some convenient day previous to the Anniversary Meeting when the recommendations to the General Committee of special objects shall be determined on.

XIV

Each local committee shall be empowered to elect two lay members of the Society to be elected at the Annual Meeting of the Committee to assist the Missionary in submitting the recommendations of the Committee to the consideration of the General Committee.

XV

For the purpose of the Missionaries and Lay Deputies shall meet in General Committee on the two days or more if need be previous to the Anniversary Meeting to make the annual appropriation of the funds of the Society.

XVI

The Executive Committee shall meet either at the residence of the Secretary on the first Wednesday in January, on the day after the Annual Meeting, on the first Wednesday in March, on the first Wednesday in June, and on the Wednesday after the first Tuesday in October.

XVII

The Clergy are requested to preach annually two sermons in their respective Churches with a collection on each occasion for the General Purposes of the Society.

XVIII

No article of the Constitution of this Society shall be amended, altered or amended, except with the concurrence of two thirds of the members present at a General Meeting and notice of any motion shall be given at the General Meeting previous to the one at which such motion is to be made.

REPORT.

A few general remarks are naturally suggested in submitting the Annual Report of the Society. First of all, we can scarcely fail to give expression to feelings of gratitude to the Giver of all good for His continued blessing on our unprofitable endeavours. The high and holy objects which our Society seeks to gain, come now prominently before us. Our failures, our difficulties, and our hopes make us to turn away from unassisted human efforts to that Almighty aid, for which we have good reason to ask, and which we may trust will not be denied.

Zealous members of this Society may at times be dispirited when its means of usefulness do not more speedily increase, and success does not become more evidently manifest. But is this really to be expected when we take into account all the circumstances by which the Society is surrounded, and the difficulties it has to encounter? And has not experience always taught that slow and gradual progress forms the best assurance of ultimate success? If the funds of the Society have not rapidly increased, the Treasurer has always been prepared to meet its demands, and for many seasons past the General Committee have been able to exceed the appropriations of the preceding years. With generous contributions from various parts of the Diocese, we are assured of an increasing confidence and continued exertion in behalf of the Society. Its two chief requirements become every year more unquestioned by the well-instructed Churchman, viz.: that a portion of what God has given should by each one be laid apart for "the furtherance of the Gospel," and that all, as far as possible, should take counsel and act together for that holy object. Had the Society only effected this, and in other respects have seemed to fail, we should not have laboured in vain. Churchmen have been aroused from a most dangerous lethargy by its appeals. Each year it has recalled the Gospel precept, "freely ye have received, freely give." With the Apostle it has protested against covetousness, "let no man seek his own, but every man another's wealth." By its annual assemblies, and call to united action it would strike at the root of that disunion and mistrust among brethren, which the Gospel so expressly forbids.

Meanwhile each year the Society goes on its quiet course. Missionaries are supported, Churches are built, the Word of God, works of piety and instruction are circulated, the widow and the fatherless are assisted. Surely in this we are doing our blessed Redeemer's will, and carrying out the charge he gave to all believers when his work on earth was done. And who is unwilling to believe that he has afforded us his blessing? By this instrumentality, however imperfect, some we may safely hope, have been instructed and confirmed in the faith; some "turned from the power of Satan unto God." It is truly a great comfort to be called to labour where we are thus assured of a blessing from above. This is enough to stimulate us to exertion, to cheer us in acts of self-denial, and to enable us to surmount the difficulties which we have reason to anticipate.

In accordance with a Resolution passed by the Society in February, 1852, a table has been prepared from the returns of Churches, kindly furnished by the Clergy, shewing the dimensions, amount of accommodation and date of the erection of all the Churches and Chapels in the Diocese. This document, it is hoped, will afford interesting and useful information.

The Society will be gratified to learn that on the departure of His Excellency Sir Edmund Walker Head to assume the high office of Governor General of Canada, and on the arrival of his successor, the Honourable J. H. T. Manners Sutton, His Excellency was pleased to approve of the objects of this Society, to contribute the same amount as his predecessor had done and to intimate to His Lordship the President, his readiness to accept the office of Patron to the Society.

The following is a brief abstract of the Reports of the various Local Committees:

ST. ANDREWS AND CAMPOBELLO.—Rev. J. Alley, D. D., has much pleasure in reporting a continued favourable feeling towards the Society. "At Chamcook," he writes, "I had two Collections which I now remit, and with respect to that place, I am gratified in reporting an attentive and increasing congregation, and a prosperous Sunday School. I hope the Society will make that Chapel a separate grant of books for their Sunday School, as well as Bibles and Prayer Books for distribution. I visited Campobello and officiated there on the 17th December. The congregation is numerous and attentive and their Sunday School well attended. The communications on that day were few. It is quite unnecessary, I should think, to press the importance of this Parish upon the notice of the Society, which will, I am convinced, do all in their power to foster and encourage the good Church feeling already existing on this Island. The new Church is now in a forward state towards completion, and will, I hope, be ready for consecration next Summer. I beg leave to recommend this Church to the Society for aid, and to ask for the usual grant of books for St. Andrews." Contributions are £20 3 1; 1st Collection, £2 18 5;

2d do. \$3 9 3. Collection at Chamcock Chapel, £2 13 10; Total, £29 4 7; and from Campobello, \$10 7 8.

LANCASTER.—This Committee met on the 8th inst. The Rev. Geo. Bedell, Rector, in the Chair.

A resolution was passed expressing their regret at the removal, by death, of their late Rector, the Rev. T. W. Robertson, from the sphere of his zealous and untiring labours.

The additions to St. Ann's Church, Musquash, toward which the Society has contributed, are immediately to be proceeded with, and further aid is solicited. In order that the Society may in time be relieved from its contribution to the support of its Missionary, the Rector has promised to give \$25 towards the contemplated work, provided the Parishioners make up \$50 towards his stipend.

A Sunday School is shortly to be commenced at Musquash, and books are asked for, suitable for children, as well as an appropriation in aid of a Parochial Reading Library.

A lively interest in the success and welfare of the Society is evinced by the increased amount of contributions.

The Rector is much encouraged in his work, by the full attendance on the Services and the devout attention manifested in the house of God. Many of the parishioners walk more than three miles to be present at the Services and during the past Summer, several walked seven miles to the Church.

The Committee desire to express their confidence in the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, and they trust that his unremitting labours in the field of which he has the spiritual oversight may be rewarded by the consciousness that the people are growing in grace and in the knowledge of their Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. The Contributions are in all \$28 4 6.

CHATHAM.—Rev. Samuel Bacon writes that the following resolutions were passed at a meeting of this Local Committee held in St. Mary's Chapel on the festival of St. Thomas.

1. That this Committee continue to take the deepest interest in the prosperity of the Diocesan Church Society, possessing that no better institution could be devised for promoting true religion, and possessing the strongest claims to the united prayers and zealous co-operation of all faithful members of the Church.

2. That this Committee regret that their Contributions do not amount to so much as they fondly anticipated, which must alone be attributed to the almost unprecedented pressure of the time.

3. That this Committee return their warmest thanks for the liberal grants of books, which have proved an invaluable acquisition to our Sunday School Library, and are duly appreciated by every one connected with this institution. They trust the same liberality will be extended to them in the next appropriations. Contributions reported, £14 9 9; 1st Collection, £2 17 6; 2d do. \$4 5 0; Total, £21 13 5, for General Purposes.

KINGSBORO.—Rev. J. Black reports Contributions, £6 1 10; 1st Collection £1 8 3; 2d do. £1 4 5; Total, £20 13 6, for General Purposes.

SPRINGFIELD.—Rev. G. P. Ellis writes that the contributions from this Committee will not exceed those of the past year, owing to the need of repairs on the Parsonage, for which assistance is asked from the Society. The congregation at each of his stations is good; the average number of communicants at the Parish Church is thirty five. Assistance is asked towards the completion of the Church at the Irish Settlement, which is already enclosed, but which the people are unable to finish.

The following Resolution was unanimously passed at a Meeting of the Springfield Local Committee, on the 1st of January, 1856.

That the thanks of this Committee are justly due, and are hereby tendered to the Diocesan Church Society, for the liberal grants to the Missionary and to the Library, and we further pray that the same may be continued.

GREENWICH AND PETERSVILLE.—In the absence of the Rev. J. Bartholomew, W. B. M'Keel, Esq., Church Warden, has enclosed £11 8 1, as the amount of Contributions from Greenwich, which he regrets do not equal the return of last year. Additional subscriptions are however anticipated. "The Local Committee," he writes, "feel themselves under renewed obligations to this Society for the very liberal support it has given to this Mission, and ask for its continuance, and earnestly pray that under the Divine blessing this Society may encre and inc. e increase."

The Rev. J. Bartholomew writes from London that he was unable, previous to his departing from the Mission, to complete the return. He can only report the amount of the public Collection in Petersville, which was £29 9; and he regrets that the interests of the Society may have suffered from his temporary absence from the Diocese.

WESTMORELAND.—Rev. D. M. Bliss reports Contributions, £11 5; 1st Collection, £1 2d do. 16s 4; Sale of books, 7s 9d.; Total, £18 7 9.

MOXTON.—Rev. W. N. Boyer reports Subscriptions, £9; Collection, £1 8; and states that the people are endeavouring to erect a Parsonage, which hinders them from contributing more, however well disposed towards the Society, which has dealt liberally to this Parish. The Church, he says, still continues to prosper, and the congregation is very kind to himself.

ST. JOHN, TRINITY.—William P. Dole, Esq., Secretary to the Local Committee, reports Contributions, £89 15; and a Collection of £10 0 0 of which £10 is limited to the Widows and Orphans' Fund.

ST. MARK'S.—Mr. C. H. Fairweather, Secretary of this Committee, reports Subscriptions, £41 2 6; and a Collection, £10 6.

This amount exhibits a falling off from that of last year, which may be accounted for by the demands upon the members of the Church in this Parish for local purposes, and the depression in every branch of trade and industry existing at the present time.

ST. JAMES.—H. W. Frith, Esq., Secretary of this Committee, reports for the Widows and Orphans' Fund, £7 14; being the proceeds of twelve shares of Water Company Stock, given for that object to the Society by Miss Thomason, of the City of Saint John; (a further dividend, amounting to £1 16, having since been paid to the Secretary of the Society); and Subscriptions, £25 17 1; 1st Collection, £5 3; 2d do. £3 14; making in all, £30 4 1.

FREDERICTOWN.—This Committee met on the 22d December, when the following resolution was unanimously passed.

That this Committee, satisfied more than ever, that the importation of books from the Catalogue of the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge for sale and distribution, is productive of much good, and leads many to take a lively interest in the Society, do earnestly recommend that this most important part of the Society's operations may be extended as far as possible.

ANDOVER, GRAND FALLS, &c.—Rev. S. J. Hamford thanks the Society for the last year's grant of books to his Mission. He can testify that such appropriations are very acceptable as well as most useful in our country Parishes, where access to good and profitable books is exceedingly limited. "I shall be glad therefore," he writes, "if the funds of the Society will admit of it, to receive a further grant to the Libraries at the two Churches at Tobique and Rivier des Chutes, in the lower portion of this Mission. I am thankful to report that the Collections a little exceed those of the past year, although there has been a great falling off in business generally and the people are not so able to give as they were during the two past years." RESTIGOUCHE, GLENELG, NELSON AND THE SEVENTH MOUNTAINS IN THE SOVEREIGN MOUNTAINS.—Rev. J. Hudson, Visiting Missionary, reports that the Glenelg Committee met on New Year's Day, and a resolution was unanimously passed, heartily recommending the Diocesan Church Society to the continued favour of all their fellow Churchmen. A resolution was also passed at a similar Meeting held in Nelson on the 8th inst., expressing the people's devout thankfulness to Almighty God for the prosperity of the Society during the past year.

The Missionary paid a visit to Restigouche in August last, by permission of his Diocesan. During his brief sojourn in that part of the Province, still nearly destitute of Church offices, he had the pleasure of frequently celebrating Divine Service for very little flocks of Churchmen at Dalhousie, Flatland and Bel River; but in Campbellton he could only officiate once. At the two former places, he also celebrated the Holy Communion and baptized a few children in a poor settlement, on the top of one of the "Strong Mountains," along the base of which the river winds its course, and till then untraced by the foot of any messenger of peace.

It was not possible to leave those few and scattered sheep without "first praying God to send them a Pastor after His own heart, full of knowledge,

compassion and zeal; that pitying their sad condition he may instruct them in the ways of truth and eternal life. The Missionary's services were kindly received by the people, and whenever he went he was met with a welcome far beyond his expectation and desire. The Contributions from his various stations amount in all to £88 16.

SHEDDIE.—Rev. G. B. Jarvis, D. D., reports Contributions to the Widows and Orphans Fund, £1; Subscriptions, £7 5; 1st Collection, £1 10; 2d do. 16s.; General Purposes, £11 5; Total, £11 10. Included in this amount is £1 5, contributed by the labourers at the Railway works, in the Lay Reader stationed at Sheddie, who has much pleasure in bearing witness to the readiness of the workmen to subscribe to the Society. The grant for books placed at his disposal by the Lord Bishop enabled him to commence a Sunday School and Lending Library, which has been fully appreciated, and he trusts the Society will consider this an object worthy their further consideration.

By the Curate at Couplage nothing has yet been collected.

St. MARY'S.—Rev. W. Jeffrey has paid to the Treasurer Contributions, £0 1 3; 1st Collection, £1 2; 2d do. £1 2 3; Total, £11 5 3 for General Purposes, and also the additional sum of £10, being the first instalment paid for a lot of land in the Parish of Stanley, given to the Society by the Rev. James Necker to be appropriated to the Widows and Orphans' Fund.

DEACON OF St. PAUL'S, PORTLAND.—Rev. G. Lee makes the following return from this Mission. Widows and Orphans' Fund, £1; Subscriptions, £08 5; 1st Collection, £11 7 3; 2d do. £8 6 3; Total, £26 16 3.

SUNNY.—The Rev. T. McGhee encloses a return as follows: Churches and Chapels, £1 7 5; Aged Clergy Fund, £1 5; Widows and Orphans', £1 10; General Purposes, £3 3; 1st Collection, £1 15 6; 2d do. £2 7 6; Total, £12 5. He writes that the state of the travelling and other causes prevented his sending the amount at an earlier date, and that the requirements for Church purposes at home have hindered his parishioners at Southbarn from contributing to the Society this year.

WYRING.—Rev. C. Milner has remitted the sum of £17 6 4 as the Contributions from this Mission, and requests a grant of books.

St. GEORGE AND PARISHMAN.—Rev. J. McGivern has enclosed the following resolutions passed at a meeting of this Committee, held on the 9th January last.

1. That first of all, we thank and praise the Author and Giver of all good for his abundant blessing vouchsafed upon the past labours of this Society. That while we pledge ourselves to the continued support of a cause which has for its object the glory of God, and the extension of the Redeemer's kingdom in this land, we cannot but regret that in consequence of the scarcity of money and the high price of provisions now prevailing, the contributions in Saint George are somewhat less in amount than those of the past year.

2. That our best thanks are due, and are hereby tendered to the Society for the last year's grant of books in this Mission, and that from the advantage derived to the members of the Church by the circulation and perusal of the books, it be an instruction from this branch to the General Committee that grants of the same amount be requested for each of the Parishes in this Mission for the present year.

In a letter accompanying the foregoing resolutions, Mr. McGivern remarks, "I have little to add more than to assure you that the usual good feeling and interest are manifested by the members and friends of the Church here in behalf of the Society. I shall and might truly and safely say, that every year tends to strengthen the conviction, that to support this good cause is no longer a question of doubt, but a duty which they must and ought to discharge. I thank God for this good purpose, and pray that they may continue "steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord." The small deficiency in the amount from Saint George, is nearly made up by the increase from Penfield.

Contributions, including the Collections in the Church, are in all £28 2 4.

Bromfield.—Rev. J. Neale has forwarded an increased amount of Contributions, viz: £33; 1st Collection, £1 10; 2d Do, £2 10; Total, £37, for General Purposes.

Minster.—Rev. W. E. Scovil writes that the amount of Contributions from this Parish is again a little in advance of that of former years, being in all £94, of which £1 10 is allotted to Missionary purposes.

The Meeting, he writes, at the election of our Lay Delegates, took occasion to express their sympathy for the sufferings and mournful bereavements among our fellow subjects, arising from the sanguinary war in which Great Britain has been forced to take part for the preservation of the liberties of Europe; and proposed the unanimity which this part of the Empire has hitherto enjoyed from these calamities, as an incentive to exert ourselves, in connexion with our Church Society, in diffusing abroad the blessings of the Gospel of Peace.

MARBY AND HOPWELL.—Rev. R. D. Palmer in enclosing the returns from this Mission, which are in all £13 2 6, writes that he has much gratification in stating that from Hopwell they exceed those of any previous year, and that he has every reason to believe that there is a growing interest in the prosperity of the Church. He hopes to obtain an additional grant of books for distribution at the Albert Mine, where he has for some time past held Service every other Sunday.

The following resolution was passed at a meeting of the Local Committee held at Hopwell the 25th December, 1854.

Resolved, That the thanks of this meeting be tendered to the Parent Society for the grants made to this Mission during the last year towards the support of the Missionary and in aid of erecting the Church, and for books; and this meeting requests that the Mission may still be remembered in the distribution of the funds of the Society.

WOODSTOCK.—Rev. S. D. Lee sweet writes, that the Annual Meeting of this Local Committee was more numerously attended than usual, and the interest in the Society is evidently on the increase. The following resolutions were passed.

1. That this Committee beg to offer their sincere thanks for the grant of books to the Lending Librarian at Woodstock, Richmond and Jackcountown, and hope they will again be remembered at the approaching meeting of the Society.
2. That this Committee would return their sincere thanks for the grant of £20 towards making the Globe House habitable, and they are happy to state that the work has been completed, and the building is now in a far more comfortable state for the Rector and his family than it was before, though the cost of completing the same has far exceeded the amount originally contemplated.
3. That whereas the increasing usefulness of the Diocesan Church Society is a manifest proof of God's blessing resting upon it, therefore resolved, that it be our duty as Christians and Churchmen to promote to the utmost of our ability the several objects embraced by the Society. The Contributions are, in all, £22 10 9½.

DOVERHAM.—Rev. A. V. Stuart reports Contributions, £18 2 6, and Collections, £2 10, which he regrets are a little less than those of last year. The same good feeling exists towards the Society, and a conviction of its usefulness and of the blessing which evidently attends it. His time, he writes, has been mainly occupied of late in consequence of the prevalence of an epidemic in the upper part of his Mission, which has proved fatal to a large number of his people, more especially of the young.

The attendance at his Churches continues as good as usual, and is very large in the neighbourhood of the new Church, where he has Divine Service once a fortnight in a School house.

He thinks the books granted by the Society are of especial service. They are read with great pleasure by many. He hopes for further aid in this respect.

At the meeting of the Local Committee on the 27th December, an application was made for a further grant of £20 to aid in finishing the Church in the

lower part of Douglas. It is now enclosed, but there is a debt of £70 upon it, and £100 more will be required to complete the work.

At the request of the Church Wardens and the Committee a further application is made for the annual sum of £20 towards the stipend of the Missionary whose services are most laborious.

ST. STEPHEN.—Rev. Mr. Rogers, Thomas, L.L.D. writes that this Local Committee held its Annual Meeting on Saint Stephen's Day; a unanimous sentiment prevailed in the Committee that the Diocesan Church Society was fully entitled to the cordial support of all Churchmen. They regret that the heavy expense incurred by the repairs of their Church necessarily diminish the amount of their subscriptions. The pastor and efficient Treasurer of this Local Committee, N. Marks, Esq., has done all in his power to gain contributions, although he had just before undergone much labour in getting the Church repaired, and in the purchase of our excellent organ, at an expense amounting to £200.

The Lay Delegates, W. Porter and S. Thomas, Esquires, are interested to see for all the proposed addition to the Parish Church, in which additional accommodation is usually sought for, and especially to urge upon the Lord Bishop and the Society the necessity for an addition to the duties of this Mission, which age and multiplied afflictions have rendered it impossible for the Rector fully to discharge. Contributions, £19 3 6.

NORWICH.—Rev. E. A. Warneford Esq., writes that the Contributions from this Parish exceed those of the past year, being in all £22 0 6. At the Meeting on the 26th December, the Local Committee thanked the Society for its liberal grants to the Parsonage, and for the books, and trust they will receive a further grant for the same object again this year.

HAMPTON.—Rev. Wm. Walker reports contributions to the Widows and Orphans Fund, £8; General Purposes, £24 0 5; Total, £32 0 5.

MANCHESTER AND BURTON.—Rev. A. V. G. Wiggins, D.D., reports from Manchester, £18 12 10, and from Burton, £12 10 8; a large sum would probably have been collected had not the loss of a horse prevented the work. The Local Committee at Manchester passed at their meeting a vote of thanks to the Society for the grant made last year towards the erection of their Church, of which owing to the high price of materials and labour, they did not immediately avail themselves. "We have now," Dr. Wiggins writes, "commenced in good earnest; contracted for the erection of the frame, and hope to have the building enclosed next summer. I trust the Society will give us another grant of £35, which with our own subscriptions, amounting to nearly £350, will enable the Committee to complete the work." Of the Contributions from Burton, £3 5 3 are limited to the Widows and Orphans Fund.

WARRINGTON.—Rev. D. J. Wetmore has remitted the sum of £10 for the General Purposes of the Society.

ST. DAVID.—Rev. J. S. Thomson writes that his people have been so called on to contribute towards the erection of their new Church, that but £6 15 has been collected for the Society. The congregation, in addition to this, are obliged to pay rent for a hall for public worship. They rejoice, however, in the prosperity of the Society, and when relieved from their present burden, will contribute to its objects according to their ability. This necessity will be apparent from a comparison of the accounts of the past year, in which the Treasurer has paid out of a grant to one Missionary for the services of another, the correctness of which the opinion of the Auditors cannot be sustained, under terms of the grant. The Auditors are also of opinion that as the grant for Missionary purposes during the past year, were made to the fund for the Mission, and not as heretofore to the Clergyman, no payments should have been made by the Treasurer without the written authority of His Lordship.

The Auditors again urge upon the Society their recommendation to the Executive Committee on the 21st January, 1884, with regard to payment to the credit of the Society, and the necessity of having a separate account for that purpose. Unless this is done the accounts will not be properly audited; and as the Society is now incorporated, it is necessary that it have a correct system of accounts introduced.

He also read a list of applications, and the several sums recommended by the Committee.

On motion of Mr. W. Jack—Resolved, That the sum of £104 7, exclusive of the sum of 18s. to the credit of that fund, be granted towards the building and enlarging of Churches and Chapels, to be appropriated as follows—

- The Church at Douglas £20. Payable when it is certified that the Church is completely finished, and will thereby be made free from debt.
- To the Church at the Irish Settlement £15. Payable on a certificate given to the Diocesan Church Society in trust for a Parish Church, when a separate Parish is formed, and a certificate that the building is finished externally.
- To the Church at Camphello £25. Payable on a certificate that the land on which the Church is built, is held in fee simple by and for the use of the Church.
- To the Church at St. Stephen £10; the Church at Lancaster £10. Payable on condition that the work is completed.

To the Church at Young's Cove £10. On a certificate that the Church is thereby made free of debts.

To the Church at the Postage, Sussex, the sum of £150. On a certificate that the building is finished internally.

Resolved, That the sum of £50 be granted to the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy, viz. to Mrs. J. M. Stirling, £25; to Mrs. T. W. Robertson, £25. (Payable out of the old 7th object fund.)

Resolved, That there be granted for contingencies, £50; for the expenses of the Travelling Missionary, £35; for the salary of the Secretary, £25.

Resolved, That there be granted for the importation of Books £170; £70 thereof for a Hymn Book for the use of the Diocese. And that the grant of Books for the Local Committees, to be divided by the Executive Committee, be £150.

Resolved, That there be granted to the Rev. A. V. Stuart of Douglas, £20, on condition that the like sum is contributed by his Parishioners; to the Rev. W. N. Boyer of Moncton, £20; to the Rev. J. S. Thomson of St. David, £10, as a donation for the current year.

Resolved, That £50 be placed at the disposal of the Lord Bishop to assist in the education of the children of certain Clergymen.

On motion of Mr. F. A. Wiggins—Resolved, That each Missionary receiving a salary from this Society, be requested to make an annual return to the Secretary, to be handed in by him at the first Meeting of the General Committee, as follows, viz:—

The number of Churches under his Charge; the number of weekly or other stated Services held in such Churches or Stations; the number of Communications; and the number of the Sacrament administered in each Parish towards the support of such Missionary.

APPENDIX.

RESOLUTIONS OF THE GENERAL COMMITTEE.

That the title to all Churches towards the erection or completion of which any grant is made from the funds of this Society, be vested either in the Church Corporation of the Parish in which such Church is situated, or in some party or parties in trust to convey the site, as soon as practicable, of such Church to the Church Corporation as soon as the same may be legally constituted. (16th Report, page 24.)

That no grants from this Committee, subject to conditions, be paid until the same is sanctioned by the Executive Committee, who will carefully ascertain that the conditions of the grants have been fulfilled. (17th Report, page 4.)

That no application for grants shall be considered, which are not made on the first day of the meeting of the General Committee, as previously. (18th Report, page 24.)

That such Missionary receiving a salary from this Society, be required to make an annual return to the Secretary, to be handed in by him at the first meeting of the General Committee as follows, viz.:

- 1. The number of Churches under his charge.
- 2. The number of weekly or other stated services held in such Churches or Chapels.
- 3. The number of Communicants.
- 4. The average number of attendants.
- 5. The amount contributed in such Parish towards the support of such Missionary. (18th Report, page 24.)
