Dallas and Harry Hyams were again at the Magistrate's Court yesterday morning, charged with conspiracy to murder Mr. Curry, and for the Crown, produced a letter from O. St. Marie, a witness relied upon to give important evidence with reference to some insurance transactions, and who was supposed to be in Montreal. He wrote that he was now in the Southern States, and that it would require considerable in the way of traveling expenses and compensation for being compelled to sever his business connections to induce him to return to give evidence. In view of the fact, Mr. Curry asked for the discharge of Harry Hyams, that he might be used as a witness against his brother. Mr. Curry cited precedents for the discharge proposed, but Mr. Johnston, the solicitor for the defense, declared that even if the court did discharge Harry Hyams, (Johnston) would advise him not to answer the questions put to him, in view of the forged charges pending. Mr. Curry, nevertheless, persisted in asking for the discharge of the prisoner, and he was accordingly discharged. He was at once put in the witness box, but refused to answer any questions, further than to give his name and the name of his wife.

THE LATE DR. REID.
Sketch of the Career of the Eminent Presbyterian Divine.
Presbyterianism in Canada has sustained a great loss in the death of Dr. Reid. He had been expected, for the medical attendants for several days held no hope of his recovery. About two months ago his health became so seriously impaired that he could no longer discharge his duties as agent of the schemes of the Presbyterian church. Last June, in consequence of advanced age and failing health, he resigned his resignation as clerk of the General Assembly and financial agent of the Presbyterian church in Canada.

Dr. Reid was a native of Scotland, and was born in the parish of Ardshearn, Aberdeenshire, in 1836. In 1858 he took his degree of M.A. at King's College, Aberdeen. The Presbyterian church in Canada was organized in 1860 and induced to the pastoral charge of Grafton and Colborne, which was then in the Kingston Presbytery. For nine years he labored there, and was then called to Fifton, where he remained until 1868, when he was called to succeed the late John Burns as general agent of the schemes of the Presbyterian church in Canada, and editor of the Ecclesiastical and Missionary Record. In 1859 Dr. Reid was moderator of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, which was constituted by the union of the United Presbyterian Church with the Free Church in 1847. In 1879 he was appointed moderator of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada. The honor of a degree of D.D. was conferred upon Dr. Reid by Queen's College, Kingston, in 1876.

The Week Opens Up Merrily With Police Magistrate Denison—An Even Dozen Petty Cases Settled.
At the Police Court yesterday Thomas Jones, who begged from pedestrians, admitted being a "vag" and was sent down for 60 days.
May Irvine, the young lady who has been annoying Dr. Davison, was committed as a lunatic.
John McGrath, 686 Dufferin-street, was fined \$1 and costs or 30 days for being drunk, and \$10 and costs or 30 days for rescuing a prisoner from Inspector Armstrong on Queen-street west last Saturday night.
Heleen Strain, the mysterious woman from Havelock, has been adjudged insane and will probably be committed to a lunatic in a day or two.
Myrtle Cooper, who wounded May Carnegie in an altercation in a Peirce-street dive, was sentenced to a month.

AT THE ASSIZE COURTS.

The Damage Case of Craig V. Canada Permanent Loan & Co. for Improper Seizure—Two More Settlements.
Mr. Justice Ferguson is presiding at the assize court this week in place of Mr. Justice Ferguson, who is ill. The trial of the case of James McWilliams against Detective Harrison for slander adjourned. The reason given was that it was necessary to obtain new evidence. His Lordship refused to postpone the case further than to-morrow.
The first case taken up was that of Craig V. the Canada Permanent Loan and Savings Co. This is an action for \$5000 damages for the improper seizure of the plaintiff's property (the plaintiff is James P. Craig, and he formerly carried on a sawmill business in this province) from the defendants, Dundas-street. The taxes on this property were in arrears for 1933 and 1934 and shortly after Mr. Craig entered into possession the defendants notified the City Treasurer "to make the taxes payable." The seizure was made and it so happened that nearly all of the property upon which distress was made belonged to Mr. Craig. It also alleged on the part of the plaintiff that the money realized by the sale of the plaintiff's goods was not paid into the City Treasury, but was handed over to the defendants. Collector Wood, who is expected to be thrown overboard the disposition of the money, is wanted as a witness, but he claims to be out of the country. The collector to serve him with a subpoena is Mr. J. A. Austin, 1482 Queen-street west.
