EIGHTEENTH YEAR

WERE THE PROCEEDINGS IN THE COMMONS YESTERDAY.

THE ATTENDANCE WAS SLIM AND EVERYBODY WAS AGREEABLE TO THE SUGGESTION OF A HOLIDAY.

Senatorial From the Intercolonial Railway. Because of Partisanship - Toronto Exhibition Gets No Show From Mr. Laurier - He Has the Fall in Regard to Blander Tynes - The Quebec Bridge - Sir Charles Tupper Asks to Place the Question and Says Things to Please the Government in an Embarrassing Position - Mr. Laurier's Effort to Crawl Out.

Ottawa, May 3.—(Special.)—In the House, the attendance was slim and the topics discussed were not of great public interest. Both sides readily assented to the Premier's proposition for an evening's holiday.

One of the first questions asked was in regard to a dismissal from the Intercolonial Railway. The question was put by Mr. Gillies for Mr. Casgrain, and the answer of the Minister of Railways shows how the majority of these were effected. Mr. Blair said that Pierre Dubeau had been dismissed from the Intercolonial Railway for active and offensive partisanship in the late election. There had been no investigation, the Minister having acted simply on the representations made by Dr. Guay, the member for Ontario.

Mr. Wallace asked if the Government intended to make a grant towards the Dominion Exhibition in Toronto this year. "I have reason to believe," replied Mr. Laurier, "that the secretary of the exhibition has been informed by the Minister of Agriculture that the Government does not see its way clear to give any financial aid to the Dominion Exhibition this year."

Replying to Mr. McLennan (Glengarry) the Premier said that the total cost of establishing the binding works factory in Kingston was \$40,250; that there were employed in 1894 in the manufacture of twine four hundred and aggregate salaries \$36,220, and about 40 convicts; in 1895, four officers, salaries \$2,800, and 40 convicts. He said further that the Government had made this year to the Hobbs Hardware Company of London, the sale including the actual quantity of 500 tons, but as the goods had not yet been put on the market, the price cannot be stated at present. The terms and conditions of sale are cash on delivery.

Mr. Martin asked if the Government had taken precautions to stipulate with the purchaser that the twine should be of the same quality as that sold by the Government. The Premier replied that such conditions had been exacted, the Premier adding that the competition for the twine in 1894 had made this unnecessary.

In answer to a question by Mr. Casgrain, Mr. Laurier said the Government had not yet decided upon the Le Noelle, Mayor Parent of Quebec declared he had a letter from Ottawa, giving the reasons for the Government's refusal to build the Quebec bridge over the St. Lawrence. RETURN MUST BE PREPARED.

Showing All Details of Effects Entered by Prospective Settlers.

Ottawa, May 3.—(Special.)—Minister Sifton is anxious to procure as much information as possible bearing on immigration. Accordingly it has been ordered by the Government that a return shall be prepared by collectors of customs at all ports and outposts in Manitoba, the Northwest Territories and British Columbia, and shall be forwarded to the Customs Department with entry of the settlers' effects passed at customs by intending settlers from the United States.

Chinese Envoy Chang, who is in quarantine at William's Road, E. C., and who is en route to London to represent the Emperor at the Diamond Jubilee, does not like the idea of being quarantined, and has appealed to England. The Deputy Minister of Agriculture said that Chang had called Mr. Chamberlain and that the Colonial Secretary had called the department to show as much consideration as possible for the distinguished visitor. The department was unwilling to show whatever consideration he could towards Chang, but at the same time act in the public safety.

Collectors of customs have been notified that Mr. Fred L. Jones, having given up his position as preventive officer of customs, they are instructed to give him every facility for the removal of his family to the island of St. John's, Nova Scotia, and assist him in the suppression of smuggling.
