Poultry and Market Gardening

MARKET gardening and the keeping of poultry is a combination that I have found to be very profitable. In my opinion, the two work together much better than either alone.

My garden is fenced with six-foot poultry netting, which effectively holds the chickens out. When frosts have killed all the vegetation and completed the garden work for the year, I rake up all the dead vines, weeds and grasses and compost them in one corner of the garden.

PLUM CAKE. Three-fourths pound of flour, one half pound of butter, six ounces brown sugar, one half pound of Sultana raisins, six ounces of currants, two ounces of chopped candied peel, one half teaspoon baking powder, two eggs, one half cup milk (use small cup).
