THREE MEN AND ONE WOMAN ARE ARRESTED FOR ARSON

Charged With the Commission of Series of Outrages in King Township.

A somewhat sensational climax to the incendiary outrages in King Township, which, beginning last fall, culminated in an official enquiry early this year, as a result of which, however, nothing was done, and were renewed last week, when James Bell's strawstack was burned, occurred yesterday, when Thomas Godson and his son Joseph of Tecumseh Township, near Tottenham; Mrs. Hamilton Bateman, his daughter, and her husband, were arrested, charged with the crimes.

The arrests followed the investigation of County Constable Burns into the recent fire. On Wednesday night Constable Burns, Stewart and Brown, and City Detective Forrest went to Aurora and then out on a snowstorm. A blustery snowstorm impeded them and they were able to go only six miles in two hours. They returned at 10 a.m. on their way again and an hour later the Godsons were routed and taken in custody. The prisoners were locked up at Schomberg, and the police then returned to King and arrested the Bateman couple. The quartet were brought to the city and will appear before a magistrate today. No bail will be allowed. It is claimed that direct evidence has been secured in the last Tuesday.

The Godsons are charged with the fire which was investigated last week by Provincial Detective Rogers. The first fire occurred on July 10, 1903, near the division court on a dispute over \$232, which Thomas Godson, who occupied a portion of Bell's farm, claimed Bell owed him. When the case was called Godson refused to appear on Bell's farm has gone up in smoke except the fences. Bell is now living on another farm of his own, and the police then returned to King and arrested the Bateman couple. At the enquiry last December the evidence was very conflicting.
