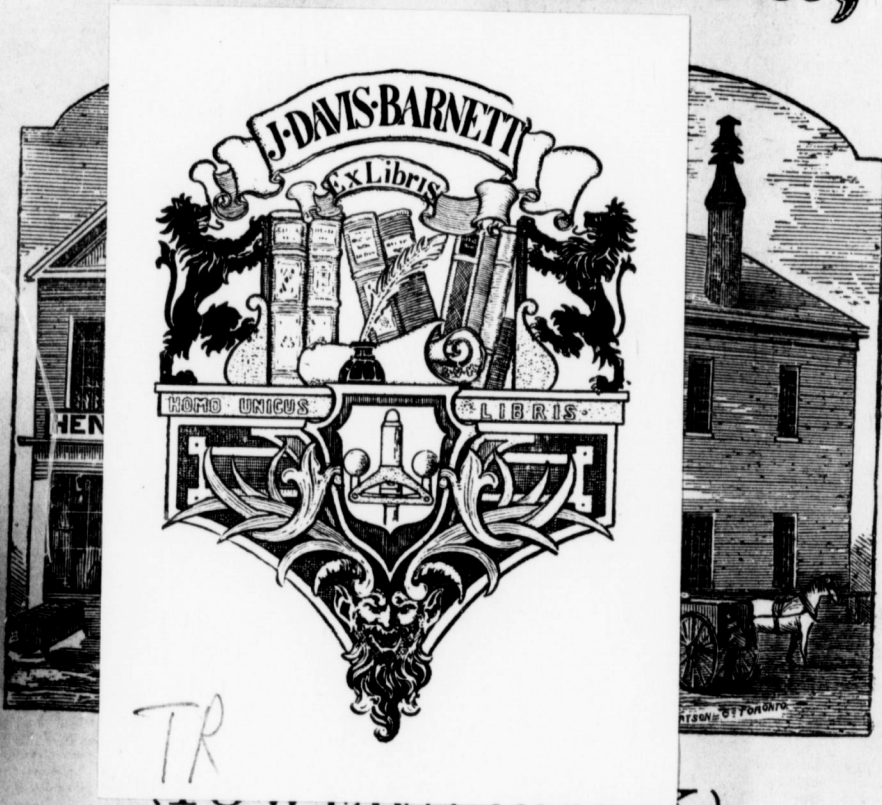

PREFACE.

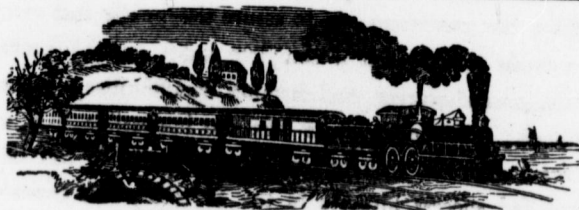

## ST. CATHARINES.

---

THE Town of St. Catharines is situated in the township of Grantham, county of Lincoln, on the Welland Canal and Twelve-Mile Creek, four miles from Port Dalhousie, the point at which the Canal connects with Lake Ontario. The town lies beautifully on a tract of table land above the valley through which the canal is cut, and surrounded by a section of country unsurpassed in the province for fertility and cultivation. In point of commercial importance, it ranks at the head of the towns in Western Canada, being the chief point on the Welland Canal, which unites the great chain of western inland seas with Lake Ontario; thus giving an unbroken line of communication by water from Lake Superior to the Atlantic seaboard, and thence to every commercial metropolis in the world. It also derives great advantages from its railway communications,—the Welland Railway having its head office and works here, and the Great Western Railway having a first-class station within a mile of the town. The Welland Railway runs parallel with the Welland Canal, and during the season of navigation, has a line of propellers running from Chicago, Milwaukee, Detroit, and intermediate ports, connecting at Port Colborne with the railway, where all freights are transhipped, and forwarded to Port Dalhousie, the northern terminus of the road, and thence shipped again for the various ports along the shores of Lake Ontario, the St. Lawrence river, and the Atlantic seaboard. The Company has an elevator at Port Colborne, and one at Port Dalhousie, each capable of containing a hundred thousand bushels of grain.

The Great Western Railway, going east, brings St. Catharines within

half an hour of the New York Central Railroad, with its many connections throughout the United States, and an hour of Buffalo, thus giving to the traveller a choice of routes to any point west or south, not forgetting the New York and Erie Railway, as a short, cheap and pleasant route to New York, Boston, Philadelphia and points further south; while going west from St. Catharines, on the Great Western Railway, we pass through Hamilton, on the main line, to Paris, Brantford, Woodstock, London and Chatham, to Detroit,—there again making connections further west. At Hamilton, the traveller for Toronto, Kingston, and Montreal, takes the Toronto Branch line, and arrives at those places without delay. Hence it will be seen that St. Catharines is unsurpassed in Canada for the facilities it offers both to the traveller and the shipper, for transit either by rail or water.

St. Catharines will vie with any of the larger Canadian cities or towns in the architectural beauty and design of a large proportion of its buildings, both public and private. The Town Hall, an elegant cut-stone building, erected at a cost of sixteen thousand dollars, is now having a large uniform addition put to it, to be used as a Court House and County Offices—the inhabitants of the county having decided to make St. Catharines, instead of Niagara, the county town. This addition, when completed, will make the aggregate cost of the building about thirty-two thousand dollars. The churches, the majority of which are situated on Church Street, are, for the most part, fine edifices, and finished after the modern styles of church architecture. Chief among the hotels are the Stephenson, Welland, and Murray Houses: all first-class establishments, built with a view to the accommodation of the travelling public, and fitted up in a manner to suit the tastes of the most fastidious. The Grammar School, together with the Public School buildings, are all neat and substantial brick structures; while many of the private residences have beautifully laid-out grounds surrounding them, planted with almost every variety of shade tree, and present abundant evidence of the liberality, taste, and refinement of the citizens of this flourishing town.

The water power afforded by the canal is unlimited, and has already been largely taken advantage of for milling purposes and other industrial pursuits, an account of which will be found under the proper heading.

St. Catharines possesses great attractions for the invalid as well as the pleasure-seeker and business-man, there being a mineral Well in

existence here, the indisputable efficacy of whose waters have enabled the town, under the energetic efforts of Col. Stephenson, the proprietor, in an unprecedented short space of time, to attain a high rank among the watering-places on the continent. The Stephenson House, an elegant, spacious and costly structure, not excelled for comfort and accommodations in America as a first-class hotel, was built by the proprietor with a view to the accommodation of the invalid as well as transient travel. It contains a comfortable bathing apartment in the first story, and efficient bath attendants and rubbers are always in waiting to attend to the wants of the guests. An extensive verandah, and long, well-lighted halls, will permit a sufficient amount of exercise in cold and stormy weather. There are accommodations for over four hundred bathers, and a variety of douches and vapour baths, after the latest and most approved models, have been introduced. All the important and useful appliances for the employment of water in disease, usually adopted at hydropathic institutions are also provided. The well is an Artesian boring, about 600 feet deep, into corniferous limestone, capable of yielding 30,000 gallons per diem. The water is pumped up by a steam-engine, into reservoirs on the summit of the bank. In one of these it is heated by a simple contrivance, without injury to its composition, and thus distributed by pipes to the "cabinets" in the bath house. The silurian rocks of Canada afford a great number of mineral waters, reduced into three principal classes: the saline, the sulphureous, and the acid. The first of these divisions, to which this spring belongs, holds generally in solution alkaline chlorides, chlorides, iodides, bromides of calcium and magnesium, and sulphates of the alkaline earths. The following analysis, by Professor Henry Croft, of the Toronto University, shows the composition of the water:

During the hostilities of 1812, the embargo upon American salt rendered it imperative for Canadians to resort to every expedient to make their own salt. Every available salt-lick was consequently laid under contribution, and salt in small quantities was manufactured at all these brine springs. A few years subsequent to the declaration of peace, a company was incorporated, and proceeded to sink a well upon the spot where one of these salt springs existed, on the banks of the Twelve-Mile Creek, within the present limits of St. Catharines. Salt was profitably and largely manufactured for some time, but hoping to obtain a more powerful brine, the depth of the well was increased to about six hundred feet, and the water of the present well was obtained, yielding a smaller per centage, and deliquescent salt, but containing a larger proportion of valuable medicinal substances. The Company dissolved, and the well passed into the hands of a gentleman engaged in the drug business, and a rude bathing-house was established in 1843. After enjoying a high local reputation for more than twenty years, the property came into the hands of the present proprietor, who has brought its healing virtues so prominently before the public.

St. Catharines is distant from the Suspension Bridge, 11 miles; Hamilton, 33 miles; Toronto, 72 miles by rail, and about 33 miles by water. Mails daily, and money order office. Population, about 10,000.

#### MANUFACTURES.

**AGRICULTURAL IMPLEMENTS.**—The principal establishment in the manufacture of Agricultural Implements is that of N. M. Samson, who employs a large number of men, and turns out threshing, reaping and mowing machines, and every description of farming implements.

**BREWERIES.**—That of Taylor & Bate is situated on Yate street, near the canal. This is one of the largest breweries in this section of Western Canada.

**FLOURING MILLS.**—Of these there are four: Hutchinson's Mills, on the Welland Canal, rear of Niagara District Bank; Thomas Hostetter's, on St. Paul street; Norris & Neelon's, on Head street, corner Race; and the Welland Canal Mills, carried on by Thomas R. Merritt.

These mills do a very extensive flouring business, manufacturing over one hundred thousand barrels per annum for exportation, besides supplying a large local market.

**FOUNDERS AND MACHINISTS.**—George N. Oill, on St. Paul street, near James, is doing a good business in this line, employing from twenty to twenty-five hands. Chauncey Yale, on Ontario street, corner of Church, employs about thirty men, an engine of ten horse power, and turns out about forty thousand dollars' worth of manufactured wares per annum.

**MARBLE WORKS.**—There are two marble yards: one on James street, near St. Paul, carried on by William Baron; and the other by Thomas Gadsby, on Queenston street, near the Thorold road.

**PAPER MANUFACTURERS.**—There is a large paper mill at Centreville, carried on by John Riordan, who employs over forty hands in the manufacture of various descriptions and qualities of paper.

**PLANING MILLS.**—Charles W. Hellems, on Geneva street, corner St. Paul, employs a large number of hands in the manufacture of sashes, blinds, doors, planing lumber, &c.

**POTASH MANUFACTURING.**—In this branch there are two establishments: that of W. & H. Campbell, on St. Paul street, between Court and Centre; and Thomas Cloney, on Division street.

**PUMP MAKING.**—There is only one shop, carried on by A. M. Mills, on St. Paul street.

**SAIL MAKING AND SHIP BUILDING.**—James McCourt, St. Paul street, near Canal Bridge, is doing a large business in fitting and rigging vessels—many of them being built at the extensive ship-yard of L. Shickluna, who employs about two hundred men, and does a business of over one hundred and fifty thousand dollars per annum.

**SASH, BLINDS AND DOORS.**—S. G. Dolson, on Church street, head of King, is doing a good business in this line.

**TANNERIES.**—There are two tanneries, carried on by James Cairns, 84 St. Paul, and Thomas Bunting, 82 St. Paul street.

**TOBACCO AND CIGARS.**—In this branch, Harris & Berston do a very extensive trade, employing about fifteen hands, and turning out sixty thousand dollars' worth per annum.

**WOOLLEN MILLS.**—Abell & Wilkerson employ six hands, and

turn out about fifty yards per day, equal to \$15,000 per annum in value.

**CARRIAGE WOOD-WORK.**—R. McKinley & Co., manufacture bent stuff for vehicles, hubs, spokes, &c. : they employ twelve men. This establishment was started in 1861.

**CABINET WORK, &c.**—McIntyre & Co., in this branch of industry, employ a large number of men and manufacture every description of furniture, bedsteads, chairs, &c.

**SAW MANUFACTORY.**—At J. Flint's establishment, situated on the canal, near the woollen factory, William A. Rawlings, managing, a large business is carried on, giving employment to ten hands, and turning out goods to the amount of \$44,000 per annum. The building is frame, and the machinery run by water.

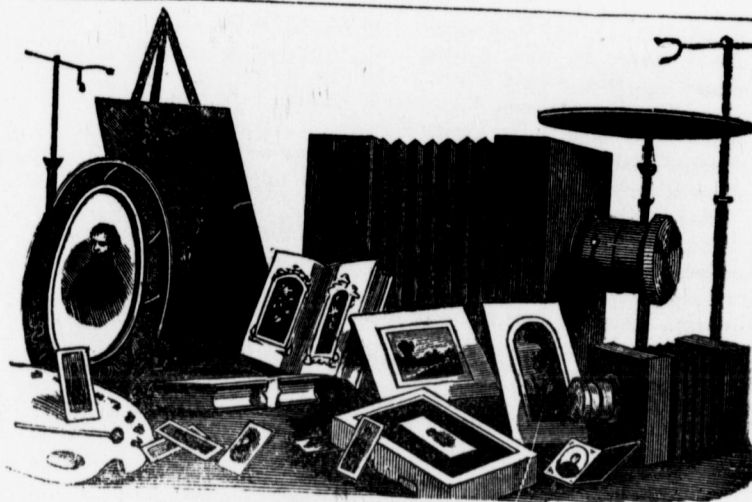

## NIAGARA.

---

AN incorporated town, formerly called Newark, and the county seat of the county of Lincoln, situated at the confluence of the Niagara river with lake Ontario, in the township of Niagara. It lies beautifully on a level plain, surrounded by a good agricultural country ; and being one of the most healthily situated towns in the province, is much resorted to in the summer season, by families having spare time and spare money, for its quiet, as well as its fresh and invigorating breezes. The fishing in the vicinity is excellent ; and white fish, bass, perch, pickerel, and pike are caught in great abundance.

Niagara is one of the oldest settlements in Upper Canada ; and, previous to the removal of the government to York (now Toronto), was the residence of Governor Simcoe. It has been the scene of many stirring events during the early history of the country ; and on the night of the 10th December, 1813, it was laid in ashes by General McClure, commanding the United States army, while on his retreat from the province. At one time it was a place of considerable commercial importance, being the terminus of a railway running from Fort Erie, a village lying immediately opposite Buffalo, U.S., but after the establishment of the Welland Canal, and the crisis of 1857-8, trade began to decline, and St. Catharines, being situated immediately on the canal, it began gradually to assume the position in the shipping and agricultural interests, that the failures of '57-8 had lost to Niagara. The Niagara Harbour and Dock Company, also, formerly did a large business : many first-class vessels having been built here, and at their ship-yard at Chippawa ; but owing to the same causes which interfered with the prosperity of the railway, its financial affairs became in an embarrassed state, and the whole establishment was sold by the sheriff, and passed into private hands. Ship-building is still carried on to some extent, and last summer, the elegant and fast steamer, *City of Toronto*, was built here, for Captain Milloy, to take the place of the steamer *Zimmerman*, (which was destroyed by fire the previous season,) on the route from here to Toronto.



In 1863-4, the railway was again revived, under the auspices of the New York and Erie Railway, and it is now entitled the Erie and Niagara Branch of the Atlantic and Great Western Railway. The road-bed of the old road was purchased, the track relaid, and the rolling stock put on ready to commence operations this coming season. It is in contemplation to erect a railway bridge across the Niagara river from Buffalo to Fort Erie, in connection with this company, giving a direct line of communication, by the Erie Railway, from the coal regions of Pennsylvania to Niagara, making this a coal depot for all the ports on the northern shore of lake Ontario, as well as their tributary towns in the interior.

A little below the town, on the point, commanding the mouth of the river, and immediately opposite Fort Niagara, is Fort Mississauga, and a short distance above, are the ruins of old Fort George. About the centre of the town, the court-house and town-hall are situated, while the jail is about three quarters of a mile to the south. The court-house is a substantial building, of cut-stone, and an ornament to the place. Niagara contains five churches, all good structures, and one (the Church of England) was erected as early as the year 1794. The hotels are good, and the private residences are mostly neat and substantial; and some of them display considerable taste and skill in their surroundings.

Niagara is distant from St. Catharines, 12 miles, daily stage on the route; Clifton, 14 miles; Hamilton, *via* St. Catharines, 45 miles; Toronto, by water, 35 miles—steamer *City of Toronto* plying daily on the route. Mails, daily; and money order office. Population, about 2000.

The Roman Catholic Separate School is situated near the Church, on Queen street. The average attendance here is about 60 pupils. John Maher, teacher.

**BEAMSVILLE.**—A thriving post village situated in the township of Clinton, county of Lincoln, two miles from lake Ontario, and a station on the Great Western Railway. It was first settled in 1825, and laid out by Jacob Beam, from whom it took its name. The post office was established in 1830, and Charles Guerney was appointed first postmaster, but J. B. Osborne is the present official. The village contains three stores; an agricultural implement and general foundry establishment, established in 1841, carried on by Messrs. A. Harris & Son, employing seven hands, and an engine of six-horse power; a carriage manufactory, established in 1840 by the present proprietor, William Kew, employing eleven men, turning out about sixty carriages annually; a cabinet manufactory, established in 1857, and carried on by Mihell & Kilborn, employing about five hands, and turning out all kinds of cabinet work; two potteries; one tin, copper, and sheet-iron manufactory; one grammar school—average attendance, 24—J. H. Hunter, M.A., teacher; one common school—average attendance, 54—David Pysher, teacher. There are also three churches, viz., Baptist—church built, in 1858, of brick, with capacity for seating 500 persons—Rev. John Cameron, pastor; Wesleyan Methodist—church built, in 1838, of frame, with seats for 300 persons—Revds. J. H. Starr and J. G. Keagy, ministers; and Canada Presbyterian—church erected, in 1840, of frame, with seats for 200 persons—Rev. John G. Murray, pastor. The Fourth Division Court is held here, J. M. Lawder, county judge, judge; John C. Kerr, clerk. Beamsville is distant from Niagara, the county town, 24 miles; St. Catharines, 12 miles; and Hamilton, 23 miles. Mails, daily. Population, about 550.

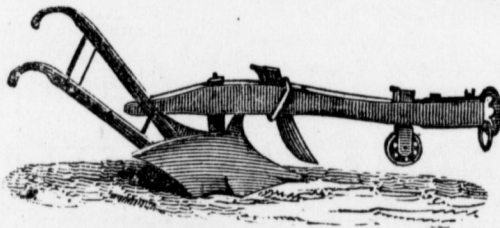

**GRIMSBY.**—A village and station on the Great Western Railway, situated on lots 9 and 10, 1st concession, township of Grimsby, County of Lincoln, at the junction of Forty-mile Creek with Lake Ontario. The first settlement was made on the 10th lot, by

Colonel Robert Nelles, in 1784; and on the 9th lot, by Judge Nathaniel Pettit, in 1785; and William Nixon, son of the late Capt. Allen Nixon, was the first white child born in the township, in 1787. The post office was established in 1816, and William Crooks was appointed postmaster, but the village was not laid out till about the year 1824. The present postmaster is John A. Nelles. The village contains five stores, two flouring mills—one with two, and the other with three run of stones—one saw-mill, one carriage factory, one foundry, established in 1832, and now owned and carried on by Messrs. Palmer & Grout, employing an eight-horse power engine, 12 hands, and turning out mowing and reaping machines, agricultural implements of all kinds, mill machinery, &c.; two cabinet shops; one common school, William Doran, teacher; one grammar school, Daniel Campbell, teacher. There are also four churches, viz.: Church of England, church first built in 1801, and a new one afterwards erected in 1835, of stone, Rev. Dr. F. J. Lundy, rector; Free Church of Scotland, church built in 1845, of brick, Rev. J. G. Murray, pastor; Wesleyan Methodist, building of brick, erected in 1865, Revs. J. Herbert Starr, and John G. Keagy, ministers; and Roman Catholic Church, building of stone, erected in 1864, under the charge of the Very Rev. Dean Grattan, of St. Catharines. The Union Lodge A.F. & A.M. hold their regular meetings here, on Thursday on or before full moon in every month; W. F. Biggar, W. M.; T. C. Brownjohn, Sec. Grimsby is distant from Niagara, the county seat, 29 miles; St. Catharines, 17 miles; and Hamilton, 17 miles. Mails daily. Population, about 500.

**PORT DALHOUSIE.**—An incorporated village, situated on Lake Ontario, at the mouth of Twelve-mile Creek, and the *deboucher* of the Welland Canal into the lake. It was first settled about the year 1776, and originally laid out by Mr. N. Pawling; and the post office was established in 1830, and Mr. N. Pawling was appointed first postmaster; but the present official is Mr. John H. Martindale. It is the northern terminus of the Welland Railway; and besides its freight depot, the company has a large elevator, with storage capabilities for a hundred thousand bushels of grain. Port Dalhousie is a port of entry; and the value of exports for the year

1863 was \$85,046, while the value of imports for the same year was \$428,366, and the amount of duties collected was \$32,347. The number of vessels passing through the canal for the same year was 6899, and the tolls on the same amounted to \$28,312.18. At the entrance of Twelve-mile Creek, a good harbor has been constructed, where vessels can find a safe refuge in all seasons. The canal affords excellent facilities for manufacturing, and there are several mills in successful operation. Besides, the village contains two ship yards, seven stores, a good common school, with an average attendance of 180 pupils, Rev. Mr. Arthurton, Miss Gregory, and Miss Abbey, teachers. There are also three churches, viz., Church of England, erected, in 1834, of frame, at a cost of about \$1000, and having a capacity for seating 300 persons, Rev. Alexander Dixon, incumbent; Canada Presbyterian Church built, in 1850, of frame, at a cost of \$1000, Rev. R. F. Burns, pastor, and the Catholic Church, a frame building, costing about \$300, Rev. Father Grattan, Dean. There is a lodge of Good Templars, numbering 90 members, which meet in the Templar's Hall, Richard Wood, W.C.T.; A. A. Smith, Secretary. The hall was built in 1863, at a cost of about \$400. Port Dalhousie is distant from Niagara, the county town, 12 miles; St. Catharines, 4 miles; and Toronto, 31 miles by water, and 76 by rail. Daily mails, with money order office. Population, about 800.

**QUEENSTON.**—A post village, situated on the Niagara river, seven miles from its mouth, and eight miles from Niagara Falls, just at the foot of the rapids, where this wonderful stream widens into smooth water, and thence, after madly dashing and roaring through the precipitous and rocky gorges that form its banks from the Falls, it demurely and placidly finds its way to Lake Ontario. Queenston was first settled in 1792, and lies just at the foot of the chain of hills that skirt along from the extreme western part of Lake Ontario, around on the south to the Niagara river, overlooking that magnificent plateau of land lying on the western bank of the river, which is not inaptly termed, the garden of Canada West. The village was laid out by the Hon. Robert Hamilton and Mr. Dickson, and occupies quite a prominent place in the early history of Canada. The scenery in the vicinity is very beautiful, and there are many places in the neighborhood well worthy of the attention of the pleasure-seeker. The summit of the mountain overlooking Queenston, was the scene of a severe engagement between the British troops under the command of the brave General Brock, and the United States troops, on the morning of October 13th, 1812, in which the British troops were eventually successful. Early in the engagement, General Brock received a fatal shot in the breast, while rallying the grenadiers, who had been severely repulsed. Shortly afterwards, General Sheaffe arrived on the ground with a small reinforcement, assumed the command, and after a fierce contest against superior numbers, finally put the enemy to flight, driving them down the mountain in the greatest possible confusion. Many of them, hoping to reach the opposite shore, ran into the river, and thus found watery graves, while upwards of nine hundred others were taken prisoners. On the site of the spot where General Brock lost his life, a monument was erected to his memory, which was

destroyed in 1841, and rebuilt about the year 1854. The present structure is a slight piece of architecture, and shows the great estimate that was had of him by the people for whom he so generously gave his life in defending. Several years ago, a Suspension Bridge was built across the river, connecting Queenston and Lewiston, on the American side, but in the winter of 1863-4, during a violent gale, the ice was driven out of Lake Erie in such quantities, that the river was gorged at this point, and the ice cut several of the cables which stayed the bridge, and the wind capsized it, as it were, turning it completely over, and it is now a useless and unsightly ruin, swinging high over the water like a narrow piece of netting. Queenston is a station on the Erie and Niagara branch of the Atlantic and Great Western Railway, and contains a post office, James Wynn, postmaster; three stores; one school, with an average attendance of 75 pupils; three religious denominations, viz., Church of England, Rev. Mr. Van Linge, incumbent, using the Presbyterian Church; Presbyterian, church erected in 1848, of frame, capable of seating 200 persons, no settled pastor; and Baptists, church built in 1842, of stone, Rev. Mr. Stone, minister. Queenston is distant from Niagara, the county town, 7 miles; St. Catharines, 11 miles, and Clifton, 7 miles. Mails daily. Population about 400.

**ST. DAVIDS.**—A small post village, situated in the township of Niagara, and county of Lincoln, on Four-mile Creek, within one mile of the Great Western Railway, and the same distance from the Erie and Niagara Railway. The first settlement was made in the year 1800, by Richard Woodruff; and the village was laid out by John Casselman. The post office was established in 1858, with James C. **SMITHVILLE.**—A post village, pleasantly situated in the southeastern part of the township of Grimsby, county of Lincoln, on the river Jordan, also known as Twenty-Mile Creek. The first settlement was made, about the year 1800, by Smith Griffin, and by whom it was laid out as a village in 1825. The post office was established in 1825, and Smith Griffin was appointed postmaster: the present official is Robert Thompson. The manufacturing facilities derived from the river Jordan are fair, and the village contains two grist-mills—one established in 1857, and owned by Daniel Roy, power, steam, engine 25 horse-power, with two run of stone, and one carding machine; and the Smithville Mills, established and carried on by Solomon Teeter, building of brick, being run by a 40 horse-power engine, as well as by water-power, and having three run of stone. Smithville also contains one foundry, two machine shops, one cabinet factory, eight stores; one common school, with an average attendance of 50 pupils, Gilbert E. Bridgman, teacher; one private school, average

attendance, about 50 pupils, Mrs. Hewson, teacher; a grammar school, building erected in 1861, at a cost of \$1100, with an average attendance of 25 pupils, William Cruikshank, B. A. head master; and four churches, viz., Roman Catholic, building of frame, erected in 1856, at a cost of \$1100, Very Rev. Bartholomew Grattan, of St. Catharine, Dean; Wesleyan Methodist, church of brick, built in 1851, at a cost of \$3000, Rev. Joseph Reynolds, minister; Episcopal Methodist, church erected of frame, in 1840, at a cost of \$1200, Rev. F. M. Smith, minister, and Universalist, church built of frame, in 1861, at a cost of \$1200, Rev. James Marsden, minister The Fifth Division Court is held here and at Grimsby, alternately, Robt. Thompson, clerk, Dan. Huntsman, bailiff. Smithville is distant from Grimsby, a station on the Great Western Railway, 8 miles; Beamsville, also a station on the Great Western Railway, 8 miles; Niagara, the county town, 30 miles; Hamilton, 24 miles; and from St. Catharines, 19 miles. Mails daily. Population, about 500.

The land is good, and under a high state of cultivation—a portion of it being level, while that lying in the southern part, back from the lake, is hilly. The timber is a mixture of hardwood and pine. From the crop of 1861, 37,285 bushels of wheat, 16,907 bushels of barley, 44,059 bushels of oats, 21,295 bushels of potatoes, 84,265 lbs. of butter, and 19,949 lbs. of cheese were produced.

THE township of Gainsborough is bounded on the north by the townships of Grimsby and Clinton, on the east by the township of Pelham (county of Welland), on the south by the township of Wainfleet (county of Welland), and on the west by the township of Caistor. The township contains 38,451 acres; and in 1835 it contained 1543 inhabitants, which had increased to 2133 in 1850, and to 2959 in 1861. The face of the country is generally rolling; and the timber a mixture of hardwood and pine. From the crop of 1861, 6333 bushels of wheat, 13,169 bushels of barley, 57,761 bushels of oats, 15,937 lbs. of maple sugar, 10,872 lbs. of wool, and 78,537 lbs. of butter were produced.

TOWNSHIP OF GRANTHAM.

THE township of Grantham is bounded on the north by lake Ontario, on the east by the township of Niagara, on the south by the township of Thorold (county of Welland), and on the west by the township of Louth. This township contains 23,415 acres; and is, with the exception of a narrow ridge along its south-west border, situated below the mountain. The first settlements were made in 1784, when the land was selling at sevenpence half-penny per acre. In 1817 it contained about 1200 inhabitants; and in 1850 its population had reached 2887, which had increased to 3956 in 1861. The Welland Canal runs through the township, and St. Catharines is also situated in it. The farms are under a high state of cultivation; and the land is generally level; the soil, loamy; and the timber, a mixture of hardwood and pine, the hardwood predominating. From the the crop of 1851, 23,498 bushels of wheat, 16,424 bushels of barley, 7440 bushels of peas, 45,688 bushels of oats, 57,822 bushels of potatoes, 77,014 lbs. of butter, 1060 lbs. of cheese, and 9088 lbs. of wool were produced.

TOWNSHIP OF NIAGARA.

The township of Niagara is bounded on the north by Lake Ontario, on the east by Niagara river, on the south by the township of Stamford, (county of Welland,) and on the west by the township of Grantham. The face of the country is level, the farms are well cultivated, and the timber is generally hardwood, with a small scattering of pine. In 1861, the township contained 2400 inhabitants; and 10,899 bushels of fall wheat, 15,065 bushels of spring wheat, 48,228 bushels of potatoes, 70,539 lbs. of butter, were produced from the crops of that year,—besides oats, peas, barley, and many other articles of produce in smaller quantities.

**ALLANBURG.**—A small post village situated in the township of Thorold, county of Lincoln, on the Welland canal, and a station on the Welland Railway. It was first settled in 1832, and laid out by Samuel Keefer. The post office was established in 1844, and John Rannie was appointed first postmaster, and still holds that position. It has good facilities for manufacturing, derived from the canal, and contains a snath factory, one flouring mill, one saw mill, two general stores, two blacksmith shops, one boot and shoe shop, four taverns, one common school with an average attendance of sixty-six pupils, Egerton Ryerson Hellims, teacher. It also contains a Wesleyan Methodist Church, built in 1854, of frame, at a cost of \$700, capable of seating 200 persons. Distant from Welland, the county town, 16 miles; St. Catharines, 7 miles; and from Hamilton, 40 miles. Daily mails. Population, about 200.

**CHIPPAWA.**—An incorporated village, situated on both sides of the Chippawa, or Welland river, at its junction with the Niagara river, in the townships of Stamford and Willoughby, county of Welland, and a station on the Erie and Niagara Railway. The first settlement was made in the part of the village now lying in Willoughby township, by Thomas Cummings, in 1783. John Burch, who settled there in the same year, was the first to build a mill on the site now occupied by that of Mr. Street, on the Niagara river, a short distance above the Falls, the power as now, being furnished by the river. The township forming now a part of the incorporated village of Chippawa, was laid out by the Government in 1787, and up to that time, there were about ten families in the whole township. On the 5th of July, 1814, while the American war was being carried on, between England and the United States, an obstinate and sanguinary battle was fought between the Ameri-

can forces, under the command of Major-General Jacob Brown, and the British, commanded by Major-General Riall, (who was afterwards taken prisoner at the battle of Lundy's Lane, on the 25th of July, 1814.) James Cummings, now a resident of Chippawa, was on General Riall's staff, as assistant quarter-master general, with rank of captain. Chippawa contains a large distillery, owned by Messrs. Macklem, Thomas & Co., erected in 1852, of brick, at a cost of about \$50,000, and employing 35 men, and turning out 1200 gallons of whisky per diem; two tanneries, one owned by John Bartle, which has been in operation about forty years, containing 38 vats, employing five men, and turning out leather to the amount of about \$10,000 per annum; a steam planing-mill, and sash, blind and door factory, owned and carried on by Thomas Davidson, built in 1858, of frame, employing an engine of six horse power, and five hands, and turning out manufactured goods to the value of \$10,000 per annum; one steam-cabinet manufactory, owned by Michael Urlocker, built of frame, two stories in height, employing an engine of eight horse power, and four hands, and turning out work to the value of \$8,000 per annum; one foundry, two saw-mills; one saddlery, two waggon shops, and eleven stores. The village also contains two common schools, with an average attendance of about 150 pupils, William Gerard, and Mr. Smith, teachers, one separate school; three churches, viz.:—Church of England, erected in 1860, at a cost of about three thousand dollars, and will accommodate three hundred persons, Rev. Donald McLeod, incumbent, Thomas C. Street and R. H. Kirkpatrick, wardens; Presbyterian (Church of Scotland,) erected about 1853, of frame, costing about two thousand dollars, and will seat about three hundred persons—no settled pastor; Episcopal Methodist, erected of frame, at a cost of about one thousand dollars. Chippawa is distant from Welland, the county town, 13 miles; and from Niagara Falls about two miles. Mails daily. Population about 1,222.

**CLIFTON.**—An incorporated town, situated in the township of Stamford, county of Welland, at the eastern terminus of the Great Western Railway, and a station on the Erie and Niagara Railway. The town lies just on the summit of the left bank of the Niagara River, about two miles below the Falls. The Suspension Bridge one of the architectural wonders of the age, connects the Great Western Railway with the New York Central Railroad on the opposite side of the river, and thence to all points east and south in the United States. Clifton was laid out in 1847, by Philip Bender, the late Samuel Zimmerman, and Harmonius Crysler. The post office was established in 1854, with Gilbert McMicken as postmaster; but William Patrick is the present official. In 1856 it was incorporated as a town, and now contains twenty stores; several good hotels; one common school, with an average attendance of 200 pupils; one separate school, average attendance, 50 pupils; two churches, viz: Presbyterian Church, building erected in 1857 of brick, at a cost of \$7000 with a capacity for seating 500 persons; and Roman Catholic Church, built in 1860, of brick, at a cost of \$2000, and a capacity for seating about 300 persons. Two miles above the town of Clifton, and a few hundred yards below the great Horse-shoe Fall and Table Rock is situated the Clifton House, a hotel well and favorably known throughout



Canada and the United States as a first class house, having ample accommodations for a large number of guests. During the summer months omnibusses and hacks run from Clifton to the falls at all hours, a drive, which for the picturesque beauty and grandeur of its scenery is unsurpassed. Near the Table Rock, the Niagara Falls Museum, owned by Thomas Barnett, is situated. It is a large and substantial stone building, elegantly fitted up and containing upwards of ten thousand specimens of birds, animals, minerals, fish, Egyptian relics, mummies, &c. A most beautiful view of the cataract and surrounding scenery is to be obtained from the top of the museum. Mr. Barnett also supplies visitors with dresses and guides for going under the falls. The water works which furnish water to the town of Clifton and the Great Western Railway are situated within a few rods of the Table Rock, and were built by the late Samuel Zimmerman. The water is conducted through iron pipes a distance of two miles. The works are now owned by George Bender and Zenas B. Lewis. The town of Clifton is distant from Welland, the county town, 16 miles; St. Catharines, 12 miles; and from the Town of Niagara, 12 miles. Daily mail. Population about 1500.

**DRUMMONDVILLE.**—A post village in the township of Stamford, county of Welland, situated on the summit of the hill, about a mile back from Niagara Falls. The site it occupies was the scene of the battle of Lundy's Lane, fought by the British and American armies on the 25th of July, 1814. Some fine views of the surrounding country may be had from several points in the village, and its close proximity to the Falls makes it a pleasant place of residence. It contains several stores, three hotels, a steam brewery, owned by Mr. Russell, built of stone and brick, and employing an engine of eight horse power, four men, and turning out 100 barrels of ale and porter per week; Muddy Run Tannery, owned by Robert Garner, established in 1847 by George Bender and carried on by Robert Bender, since 1860, employing a steam engine of ten horse power, and four hands, and turning out about 3000 pieces of leather per annum; cabinet makers, carpenters, shoemakers, saddle and harness, &c.; four churches, viz.; Episcopal, Presbyterian, Meth-

odist, and Baptist. St. Mark's Lodge, A.F. and A.M., hold their regular meetings here, first Tuesday before full moon, John Bartle, Chippawa, Secretary. Table Rock Division Sons of Temperance, organized 1862, meets in their hall every Monday evening, John Russell, R.S. The Drummondville Harmonic Musical Association, organized 1865, meets once a week for rehearsal, J. Wills, Secretary. Drummondville is distant from Clifton about 3 miles. Daily mails. Population about 800.

Charles Walker, minister; and Wesleyan Methodist, Church built of frame, at a cost of \$1200, seated for 200 persons, Revds. J. Wakefield and E. R. Young, ministers. Fonthill is distant from Welland, the county town, 5 miles; St. Catharines, 9 miles. Daily mails and money order office. Population about 400.

**HUMBERSTONE.**—A post village, known also as Petersburg, and Stone Bridge, situated in the township of Humberstone, county of Welland, on the Welland Canal and Welland Railway, first settled in 1831, and laid out by Abraham Neff and Abraham Augustine. The post office was established in 1851, and John Thompson was appointed first postmaster, and still holds the position. The village contains two stores; one flouring and saw mill—the Petersburg Mills—established in 1857, and owned by J. Crowder, employing an engine of forty horse power, three run of stone with merchants' bolt, packers, &c., complete, for the flouring mill, turning out 100 bbls. every twenty-four hours, and an engine of thirty horse power, one circular and a gang of saws for the saw mill, manufacturing three and a half millions feet of sawn lumber per annum; one common school with an average attendance of 50 pupils; two private schools connected with the Lutheran Church; two churches, viz.: Episcopal Methodist, Church built in 1856, of frame, at a cost of \$1100, Rev. Mr. Gold, minister; Evangelical Lutheran, Church built in 1862, of frame, at a cost of \$1000, Rev. Mr. Kuss, minister, a Lodge of I.O.G.T., No. 376, which hold their meetings every Saturday evening, Charles Thompson, W.C.; Alphonse White, Secretary.

**THOROLD.**—An incorporated village in the township of Thorold, county of Welland, situated on the Welland Canal, and possessing unlimited water power. The Great Western Railway and the Welland Railway, each have stations here. The village lies on the summit of a hill commanding a fine view of Lake Ontario, and the surrounding country for at least 20 miles. Near by are some extensive lime and building stone quarries. Some considerable flour and grain trade is carried on at this point, there being three flouring mills in operation, driven by water taken from the canal, viz. : the Fife Mills, owned by John Band and established in 1852, building of frame, three run of stone, capable of turning out about 200 bbls. of flour per diem ; Welland Mills, Band & McArthur proprietors, established in 1850, building of stone, four run of stone and capable of turning out 200 bbls. of flour daily ; Keefer's Mills, built in 1827 of stone, with four run of stone, capable of turning out 150 barrels of flour per diem. Brown's Cement and Plaster Mills were established in 1853, employing about 150 hands in plaster beds

manufacturing plaster. Mr. Brown received a medal at the London World's Exhibition in 1862, and one at the Paris Exhibition in 1855. Distant from St. Catharines, 4 miles. Daily mails and money order office. Population, about 1800.

No. 1 Division Court is held here, Alfred Willet, clerk; Wilson Brooks, bailiff. Welland is distant from St. Catharines 12 miles, and 45 miles from Hamilton. Mails daily, with money order office. Population about 900.

## COUNTY OF WELLAND.

THE county of Welland is bounded on the north by the county of Lincoln, on the east by the Niagara River, on the south by Lake Erie, and on the west by the counties of Haldimand and Lincoln, and contains the following townships:—Bertie, Crowland, Humberstone, Pelham, Stamford, Thorold, Wainfleet, and Willoughby. This county is well settled, and the land under a high state of cultivation. It is watered by the Chippawa or Welland River, which empties into the Niagara River, on the east, besides numerous other small streams. The Welland Canal intersects the county from from south to north; and the Welland Railway and the Erie and Niagara Railway run through it in the same direction, while the Buffalo and Goderich Division of the Grand Trunk intersects it from east to west. TOWNSHIP OF BERTIE.

The township of Bertie is bounded on the north by the township of Willoughby, on the east by the Niagara River, on the south by Lake Ontario, and on the west by the township of Humberstone. The face of the country is level, and the timber a mixture of hardwood and pine, and the township contains 38,390 acres. It commenced settling in 1784, and in 1861 contained 2,673 inhabitants and 13,170 bushels of fall wheat, 2,193 bushels of spring wheat, 35,335 bushels of barley, 4,443 bushels of rye, 10,195 bushels of peas, 89,188 bushels of oats, 24,886 bushels of potatoes, 13,276 lbs. of wool, 79,281 lbs. of butter, and 4,455 lbs. of cheese were produced from the crops of that year.

TOWNSHIP OF CROWLAND.

The township of Crowland is bounded on the north by the townships of Thorold and Stamford, on the east by the township of Wiloughby, on the south by the township of Humberstone, and on the west by the township of Thorold. This township contains 21,107 acres, and was first settled in the year 1788. The land is generally rolling, and the soil varies in quality, being composed of every grade, from clay to sand, and the timber is a mixture of hardwood and pine. It is intersected by the Welland Canal and Welland Railway, and is also watered by the Welland river. The village of Welland, the county town, lies in the south-western portion of the township. By the last census, it contained 1,457 inhabitants, and from the crops of 1861, 4,933 bushels of fall wheat, 10,243 bushels of spring wheat, 10,398 bushels of barley, 2,906 bushels of rye, 1,327 bushels of oats, 17,034 bushels of potatoes, 16,307 gallons of cider, 7,074 lbs. of wool, and 44,372 lbs. of butter, were produced.

TOWNSHIP OF HUMBERSTONE.

The township of Humberstone is bounded on the north by the township of Crowland, on the east by the township of Bertie, on the south by Lake Erie, and on the west by the township of Wainfleet. This township contains 29,132 acres, and the first settlement was made in the year 1785. The face of the country is undulating, the soil for the most part is loam, and the timber a mixture of hardwood and pine. The Welland canal is cut through the eastern section of the township and the villages of Humberstone and Port Colborne are situated in it. A singular conical-shaped hill, called "sugar loaf hill" is situated in the south western corner of the township near the lake shore. By the last census it contained 3,039 inhabitants, and 5,183 bushels of fall wheat, 19,276 bushels of spring wheat, 23,038 bushels of barley, 3,924 bushels of rye, 8,332 bushels of peas, 64,843 bushels of oats, 14,252 bushels of potatoes, 6,120 lbs. of maple sugar, 36,932 gallons of cider, 6,292 lbs. of wool, 49,950 lbs. of butter, and 2,482 of cheese were produced from the crops of 1861.

TOWNSHIP OF PELHAM.

The township of Pelham is bounded on the north by the township of Louth, (county of Lincoln) on the east by the township of Thorold, on the south by the township of Wainfleet, and on the west by the township of Gainsboro, (county of Lincoln.) This township contains 29,087 acres, and it commenced settling in the year 1790. In 1792 a tornado passed over this section of the country which felled to the ground nearly every tree that stood in its course. The land is generally rolling and in some parts hilly, and the neighborhood of Fonthill contains the highest land between the lakes. By the last census the township contained 2,646 inhabitants, and from the crops of 1861 were produced 15,806 bushels of fall wheat, 15,179 bushels of spring wheat, 10,313 bushels of barley, 3,795 bushels of rye, 46,170 bushels of oats, 34,070 bushels of potatoes, 5,408 lbs. of maple sugar, 38,776 gallons of cider, 10,751 lbs. of wool, 83,798 lbs. of butter, and 8,731 lbs. of cheese.

TOWNSHIP OF STAMFORD.

THE township of Stamford is bounded on the north by the township of Niagara (county of Lincoln), on the east by the Niagara River, on the south by the townships of Crowland and Willoughby, and on the west by the township of Thorold. This township contains 23,132 acres, and commenced settling in the year 1784, and was then called Mount Dorchester, or township number two. The face of the country is generally rolling, the soil loamy, and the timber principally hardwood, with a small quantity of pine. By the last census it contained 3041 inhabitants, and 11,032 bushels of fall wheat, 13,850 bushels of spring wheat, 14,023 bushels of barley, 1380 bushels of rye, 63,055 bushels of oats, 39,824 bushels of potatoes, 21,933 gallons of cider, 7715 lbs. of wool, 63,383 lbs. of butter, and 2966 lbs. of cheese were produced from the crops of 1861.

THE township of Thorold is bounded on the north by the township of Grantham (County of Lincoln), on the east by the township of Stamford, on the south-east by the township of Crowland, and on the west by the township of Pelham. This township contains 25,765 acres, and commenced settling in the year 1788. The Welland Canal

and Welland Railway intersects it from north to south, a little east of its centre, and on them are situated the town of Thorold and the villages of Port Robinson and Allanburg—Thorold in the north, Allanburg in the centre and Port Robinson in the south of the township. By the last census it contained 4,453 inhabitants, and from the crops of 1861 were produced 12,802 bushels of fall wheat, 13,928 bushels of spring wheat, 13,351 bushels of barley, 2,514 bushels of rye, 11,104 bushels of peas, 64,033 bushels of oats, 28,592 bushels of potatoes, 1,071 lbs. of maple sugar, 23,000 gallons of cider, 9,781 lbs. of wool, 77,984 lbs. of butter, and 2,390 lbs. of cheese.

TOWNSHIP OF WAINFLEET.

THE township of Wainfleet is bounded on the north by the townships of Gainsborough (county of Lincoln) and Pelham, on the east by the township of Humberstone, on the south by Lake Erie, and on the south-west by the township of Moulton (county of Haldimand). It contains 51,879 acres; and the first settlement was made in the year 1800. The soil varies in quality, much of it being clay, and the timber a mixture of hardwood and pine. In the south and centre of the township is a large tamarac and cranberry swamp, which extends into Moulton, county of Haldimand, on the west, and into Humberstone on the east. The Grand River feeder of the Welland Canal runs through the centre of the township. In 1861 it contained 2316 inhabitants; and from the crops of that year were produced 5309 bushels of fall wheat, 17,903 bushels of spring wheat, 9850 bushels of barley, 3754 bushels of rye, 16,586 bushels of peas, 42,497 bushels of oats, 14,529 bushels of potatoes, 8920 lbs. of maple sugar, 22,905 gallons of cider, 7999 lbs. of wool, and 69,905 lbs. of butter.

TOWNSHIP OF WILLOUGHBY.

The township of Willoughby is bounded on the north by the township of Stamford, on the east by the Niagara river, on the south by the township of Bertie, and on the west by the township of Crowland. It contains 18,666 acres, and as early as 1784 there were a few settlers in the township, although it was not surveyed and laid out till the year 1787. The face of the country is rather flat, and portions of it are rather low; and the timber is principally hardwood with a mixture of pine. By the last census it contained 1,539 inhabitants, and 5,652 bushels of fall wheat, 15,044 bushels of spring wheat, 21,597 bushels of barley, 1,277 bushels of rye, 68,252 bushels of oats, 15,782 bushels of potatoes, 1,247 lbs. of maple sugar, 15,441 gallons of cider, 5,734 lbs. of wool, 49,110 lbs. of butter, and 1,155 lbs. of cheese were produced from the crops of 1861.
