NO INTEREST WILL BE PAID ON COMPANIES.

President Corbin's Letter of Explanation.—The Justice Refusal and Update the Present Policy of the Board.

BY TELEGRAPH TO THE GAZETTE. New York, Jan. 11.—Cable advice from London state that in response to inquiries from the Reading securities board to President Corbin asking for information about the failure to pay interest on the income bonds, he sent the following dispatch.

An income account will not warrant the payment of any interest on the Philadelphia and Reading income bonds. I cannot pay the bond of management money to any other.

The unusually warm weather for the year has reduced the income of the company most seriously in a good year will show, and the losses by floods and water in the mines will aggregate very nearly one million dollars. Dividends and repairs to properties absolutely required were heavy and there is no fund nor any provision for them.

Not a dollar has been expended except where it was badly needed and will be of great benefit to all classes of income in the future.

This policy is the only one under which this estate can prosper and, if pursued, the wisdom of it as against the usual policy is self-evident.

I regret, as much as any body can, that there is no interest, but we must be honest with security holders, and make a truthful statement.

There is no question whether about the value of the property or its ability to make large net money in a good year. I believe, if the present policy is pursued, but I tell you most decidedly, and all bondholders may as well understand it, that it cannot be done under any other.
