London, May 25.—There have already been handed to the Clerk of the House of Commons amendments to the Home Rule Bill that fill 28 closely printed pages of the parliamentary orders of the day. Most of them are in the names of Conservative members, and it would not take the passage of many of them to make the bill us useless as the paper it is printed on. The extreme radical members on the other hand aim at giving the Irish parliament more power, making it more democratic, while some of their non-conformist colleagues would have clauses inserted to guard their fellow religionists of Ulster.

With the exception of Laurence Ginnell, a Nationalist with independent leanings, the Irish members have not you tabled any amendments. Mr. Ginnell's amendment would enlarge the powers of the Irish parliament and like those of the radicals, make it more democratic. While months will be spent on the committee stage of the bill, few of the amendments will receive a hearing.
