By Telegraph. British and Foreign.

London, June 14. In the Commons this afternoon in reply to the questions of Corcoran, Gladstone said that the postponement of the Board of Arbitration would not affect the Treaty, but that the defeat of one of its provisions might, as when one of the wheels of a carriage failed all failed.

GENEVA, June 14. Nearly all connected with the Board of Arbitration have arrived. It is believed the Board will adjourn immediately after meeting, but if an agreement is reached, the Session will undoubtedly be shorter.

There was attacked to-day by the Right in the Assembly, who demand that he dismiss certain Ministers and carry on the administration more in accordance with the views of the majority.

A new Spanish Cabinet has been formed. The entire militia of the Kingdom is to be reorganized.

The Cortes is dissolved, Zorrilla has refused to accept the premiership. Extensive fire in Lisbon, Portugal, yesterday.

New York 16th. Steamship "Rhein," with Strauss, German bands, and other foreign artists on their way to the Jubilee, arrived last night.

Believed in Washington that at the meeting of the Geneva arbitration to-day, the Agent of our Government will accede to the British request for postponement, with a protest against England's right to withdraw from the Treaty under any circumstances.

The Upper Provinces.

Quebec, June 14. Accidents and murderous assaults are of nightly occurrence, resulting greatly from the maddening effects of fire spirits sold to sailors.

This morning about five an unknown steamer, while walking in rather an uneasy manner on Murray's wharf, Diamond Harbor, fell over into the river. He struck against a log of timber, broke his back, and died about an hour afterwards.

Francis Garber, second mate of the Marseilles bark "Amelia," in a quarrel with Charles Laurence, apprentice seaman of the same vessel, struck the latter on the back of the head with a heavy pole, fracturing the case of the skull. Laurence is in a dying condition; Garber is under arrest.

Leopold Dymally, B. A., a clerk in the French Translation Department of the Provincial Secretary's office, was found fearfully mutilated and insensible at the foot of a rock under Durham Terrace; supposed to have fallen over.

Niagara, June 15. Seven thousand five hundred Volunteers are under canvas here, being two hundred in excess of the expectations of the authorities. Supplies are short and stores have been telegraphed for to headquarters.

Tonawanda, June 15. The corner stone of Union Masonic was laid yesterday with imposing Masonic ceremonies. The Station will be one of the finest in the Dominion.

Sir John, Hinks and Tupper are expected to visit here shortly for the purpose of discussing public questions before the people of the West.

Ottawa, June 15. Dominion Executive has decided the law must take its course in the case of F. H. Campbell, convicted at the last Middlesex Assizes for the murder of her husband. The unhappy woman will therefore be hanged on the 19th inst.

Lord Lisgar left for England this morning. The Field Artillery fired a salute, and a large crowd assembled at the station to see him off.
