FOR THE STANDARD.
"The affair of Hannah Rogers." Continued
Mr. Dutton.
Having shown the aforesaid offensive
passage to one of my friends, I wrote out the
whole paragraph which contained it, and then
called upon the members of the Committee
to inform them that the documents were at
our service. We afterwards proceeded to
examine them, and found that the Rev. Dr.
Miss Rogers, in her own hand-writing,
addressed to the House, related to the cir-
cumstances under which her licence had
been cancelled—the application of her en-
gagements to her Excellency—and the investi-
gation at St. Stephen; and prayed for the
guarantee of her, or such other relief as
might appear reasonable. Is prayer was
entirely recommended by two Trustees, the
Reverend and two Church Wardens; all of
whom had several times visited the school.
"They certified that the mistress that she had
been very successful in teaching the com-
mon branches of education, and had also
taken great pains with the moral and reli-
gious instruction of her pupils. This petition
was accompanied by the copy of a petition
dated the 27th of August last, and signed by
24 parents of families, complaining to his Ex-
cellency of the cancelling of the licence,
and also by the copy of a letter addressed by
the Rev. Dr. Thomson to Mr. Bauman, set-
tling forth the state and condition of the
school when he (Dr. T.) in company with
several other gentlemen, visited the same
in the spring.

We found by a letter dated Dec. 16th,
1855, that Miss Rogers had, in the usual
manner, engaged with the people of the dis-
trict, and was to be obedient to such orders
as the Trustees of the Parish might make.
This letter had enclosed a copy of the agree-
ment, and was respectfully addressed to the
Hon. Mr. McIntyre, the principal Trustee,
and an expression of the thanks of the Magistrate
to have the school inspected. With this re-
quest Mr. McIntyre in a letter dated the 24th
of the same month, refused to comply, and
declined all "jurisdiction over the school."
On the 13th of January 1856, it appeared
that 14 parents of families, all subscribers to
the school, petitioned the Trustees to visit
and investigate the same, and to appoint a
committee for that purpose in order that some of
them (the petitioners) might be present.
With the prayer of this petition Mr. McIntyre
in a letter dated Feb. 9th also refused to
comply. From a letter dated July 20th,
addressed to Mr. Secretary Odell, it ap-
peared that Mr. McIntyre had been in corres-
pondence with Mr. Odell upon the subject,
and that several letters had passed between
them; and that in consequence of the repre-
sentations made by Mr. McIntyre his Excel-
lency had been advised and induced to can-
cel the licence! These proceedings were
found not to be in accordance with the Law
of the Province, wherein it is expressly pro-
vided that where a Teacher shall be guilty of
"any misconduct, the Trustees may displace
such Teacher and make report of the cause
thereof to the Justices in their General Ses-
sions, and the said Justices, if they think it
necessary, are then to inform the Governor.
It therefore appeared, that Mr. McIntyre in
pursuing this course had not been guided by
that Law which as a Trustee he was bound
to observe in matters connected with schools;
in consequence of which, the severest pun-
ishment known in that Law had been in-
flicted on a Teacher, without notice, in-
spection, trial, or dismissal!

I am aware that "the highest provincial
authority" is in some degree implicated
in this part of the proceedings; but I
can make it appear, that neither his Excel-
lency, nor his advisers, are at all to blame,
and consider myself in duty bound to do so.
Let me tread as lightly as possible on the
ashes of the dead, but now that I am drag-
ged into this unpleasant discussion, let me
not have this dark passage unexplained, but
a slavish fear of giving offence in any quarter
whenever.

By Mr. McIntyre's letter to Mr. Odell,
dated the 20th of July last, it appears that
Mr. McIntyre had received a letter from
Mr. Odell, dated on the 14th day of June,

in answer to a letter previously sent to Mr.
Odell. It would seem that Mr. Odell in his
said letter of the 14th June, had required
Mr. McIntyre to take with him the two other
Trustees, and proceed with any investigation
is the law directed—at least such must be
inferred from Mr. McIntyre's reply; for he
says, in his answer dated July 20th, that
the other Trustees "too often the case"
in matters of this kind, do not seem dis-
posed to investigate the subject;—and at-
terwards he adds, that "some judicious" Mi-
nistries in the neighborhood consider it
highly proper that the licence should be
cancelled. His Excellency therefore acting
upon this information, and supposing that a
most abandoned witch was infusing in the
tender minds of the youth the most irre-
sponsible and horrible principles, and that Mr.
McIntyre's fellow Trustees would not do the
duty by Law required to prevent the same,
and supposing moreover, that the neighboring
Magistrates were aware of this, thought it
best to cancel the licence. His Excellency
and his advisers are therefore fully justified,
but a more gross misrepresentation than that
upon which they acted cannot easily be im-
agined. That the school from the time of its
commencement in the present day, has been
conducted in the most unexceptionable man-
ner, is evident from the unanimous testi-
mony of competent judges, who have visited the
same. That the Trustees who uniformly re-
fused to inspect, investigate, and hold "juris-
diction over the school," was Mr. McIntyre
himself, is also evident from his own letters
above cited; and his two colleagues, Messrs.
Fraser and Scott, whom he reported to Mr.
Odell as not doing their duty according
to law, were at all times eager to join
him in any investigation, or other proceeding
connected with the school, that either law
or duty might require.

On comparing the minutes of evidence,
the two sets were found in substance to
agree, but the two Reports differed very
widely. These documents were carefully
examined, and from a candid investigation of
the whole subject, it appeared clearly to the
Committee, that Miss Rogers was at a former
period a professed unbeliever in the Chris-
tian religion;—that at a subsequent period of
her life, she professed Christianity, and that
since that time, her conduct and deportment
had been in every respect unimpeachable.
That under the Governor's licence she was
teaching a school in the most satisfactory and
proper manner, and that her licence was
cancelled by a process unknown to the law
of this land. We therefore made our report
which will be seen in the Journals, page 53,
signed by all the members of the committee,
and referred to the committee of supply with-
out a division. The documents which had
been in our possession for ten days were then
returned to the Secretary's office.

My next paper will conclude the narra-
tive, and contain an account of that part of
the "strange drama" where I started it so
generously. In consequence of my total
inability to point out a "simple statement" in
the report signed Alex. MacLean, and exhib-
ited in a Committee of the whole House.—
