COAL CARRYING RATE

U. S. Government May Compel a Reduction in Freight Tariff.

New York, June 16. - As a result of the recent investigation by the Interstate Commerce Commission there is reason to believe, says the Herald, that a demand will be made for a reduction of freight rates on anthracite coal.

Should this course be adopted, it is not believed that any recommendation will be made by the commission to the Federal Government for action against the coal roads on the ground that they had combined to restrain trade and came within the Sherman anti-trust law.

The commerce commission in making a demand for the reduction of existing rates, would act within its powers, but the railroads, if they chose, could refuse to make the reduction and carry the case into the courts.

A reduction of rates would be of great benefit to the individual operators in the Pennsylvania anthracite fields. It has been their contention for years that they were unable to mine coal at a profit on account of the high freight. The majority of the individual operators, who are still in the field, now sell their coal at the mines to the greater companies receiving a proportion of the selling price of the coal at tide-water.

THE \$10,000 MAIL ROBBERY

Sensational Evidence at Wilcox Trial, Regina.

HOW THE MONEY WAS STOLEN

Broke the Seal, Took Out the Package of Bank Notes and Re-sealed the Bag.

Regina, June 15.—The Wilcox trial opened yesterday morning before Justice Nolan. H. M. Howell, K.C., crown prosecutor, Winnipeg, and T. C. Johnston, crown prosecutor, Regina, appeared for the crown, and Norman Mackenzie, Regina, for the accused. An array of legal talent was present.

Wilcox was first put in the box to identify the package of money handed over by Lawyer Bangs to Detective Chamberlain in close of the preliminary hearing. This he did. The next witness called, who remained in the box two hours, was the witness of Calgary. He reaffirmed all he said at the preliminary trial, and added some important, even sensational, evidence.

Mr. Mackenzie objected to the evidence being admitted, as communications between lawyer and client, but the objection was overruled.

Asked whether Wilcox had told him how he opened the package, the witness said Wilcox stated he broke the seal, took out the parcel, and then sealed the bag, using the seal which the accused said he made, which was among the articles which were seized.

A CHILD MURDER CASE. Toronto, Ont. June 15. — Musson Brown, a young man, was arrested yesterday for complicity in the charge of child murder laid against Kate E. H. Sharpe. Both Brown and Miss Sharpe lived at 51 Simcoe street. The body of an infant was recently found in a room at that address. They state that the child died a natural death.

When the dance was announced, the pastor and older members of the church were invited to attend. BANDIT DICTATES TO THE POWERS

Raisuli Says Three Nations Must Guarantee Carrying Out Sultan's Promises.

Washington, June 16. — A serious hitch has occurred in the negotiations for the release of Perdicaris and Varley, the American and Englishman captured in Tangier by the bandit, Raisuli. The details, as communicated to the United States by the United States Consul-General Gummere, indicate that Raisuli has vastly enlarged his original demands. He now insists upon absolute control of the United States, guarantee the absolute performance of the Sultan's promises. The demands should be met absolutely, or else compliance here notwithstanding what effect their refusal may have on the fate of the captives.

LEGAL FIGHT FOR LIFE OF CANINE

Terrier was Condemned to Die, But Lawyer Gets Stay of Execution.

New York, June 15.—In the kennels of the S. P. C. A. in New Jersey lies Nellie, a pretty little black and tan dog, under sentence of death.

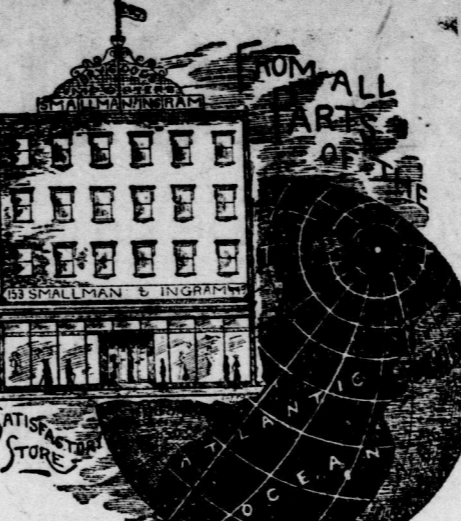

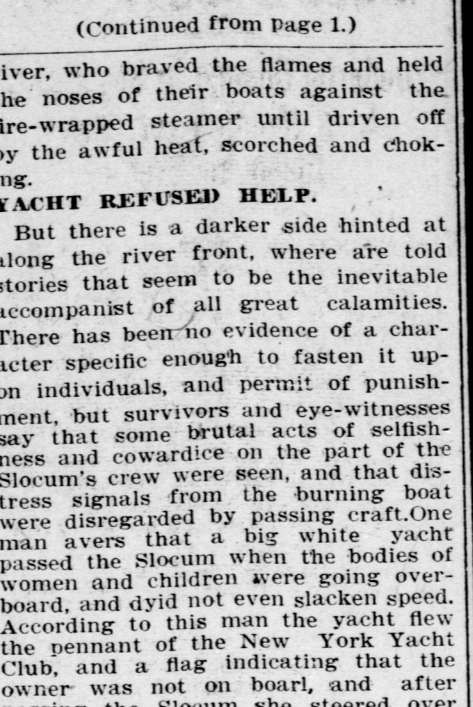

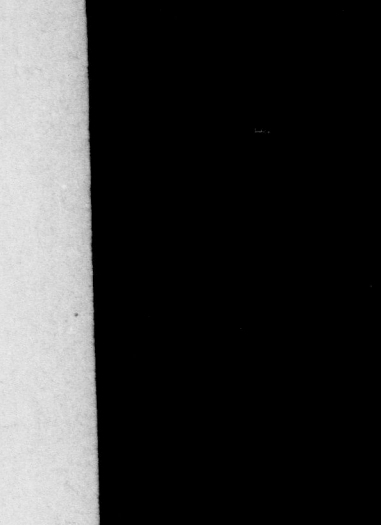
