




Tory Talk and Timber Scandals

THE FACTS OF THE CASE

A REPLY TO Mr. AMES, M.P.

A MEMBER of Parliament from Eastern Canada, Mr. Ames, was introduced for the first time to a Western audience by the Honourable Rob Roblin as the bearer of a "new gospel—a gospel of honest and efficient and patriotic government in so far as Federal affairs are concerned." A gospel is a message of hope, but what hope for "honest and efficient and patriotic government" Mr. Ames has to offer from again putting a Tory Government in power the public may be left to decide for itself on reviewing a full and complete statement of facts in connection with the subject dealt with by Mr. Ames. "The public are the jurors to decide," said Mr. Ames, "and they must have the facts of the case." But Mr. Ames was careful to ignore completely the history of timber transactions under the Conservative Government, and with the art of a practised special pleader he asked his audience to decide against the Liberal Administration on a one-sided, misleading and incomplete statement of the facts involved. But supporters of the Liberal party, unlike the Honourable Rob Roblin and the bearer of the "new gospel," have no reason to fear a full and complete statement of all facts in connection with timber transactions from the very beginning of Federal Government. Mr. Ames' whole arraignment of the Liberal administration on the timber limit question rests practically on the tenders in the Fraser-Nolan case. Hereunder are facsimiles of the original tenders in this case, together for purposes of comparison, with facsimiles of similar tenders made prior to 1896 under the Conservative administration.

Tenders Nos. 1, 2 and 3 are exact copies of the three tenders for timber berth No. 1,108 at Moose Lake, Saskatchewan.

Tenders Nos. 1 and 3 are both in the handwriting of Mr. A. W. Fraser, of Ottawa. The one signed by Mr. Fraser's name is for \$1,000.00 and the one signed with Mr. Nolan's name by Mr. Fraser is for \$7,000.00 in cash, the figures appearing in the tender being in different ink and apparently written with a different pen from the rest of the tender.

The impression is sought to be conveyed that Mr. Fraser had an understanding with Mr. Turriff, who was Commissioner of Dominion Lands at the time; that tender No. 1 was put in by Fraser in the expectation that no one else would tender, that afterwards tender No. 2, that of James Currie, was put in; that to provide against such a contingency Fraser had written out a tender, signed Nolan, leaving the figures blank so that if the Commissioner found a tender higher than that of Fraser's own he could fill in such a figure as would take the berth. The Tories made the insinuation that this was done, although not in a single instance have they dared to allege it directly. The fact that cash was used instead of a cheque is held to be evidence that it was intended

that the amount to be paid would only be enough to cover the next lowest tender. Yet the practice of tendering large amounts of cheques was begun and sanctioned under the Conservative Government. It seems to be part of Mr. Ames' "new gospel" that what is right under a conservative administration is very wrong under a Liberal one.

On the matter being brought before the Public Accounts Committee, Mr. Fraser swore that he put in tender No. 1 on behalf of himself and some associates; and that he after this received an order from a client to put in a tender for \$7,000. Having already put in the tender in his own name he made out his client's tender in the name of W. H. Nolan, who was a personal friend and from whom he had the necessary authority. He wrote out the tender and also filled in the figures before the tender left his office. He swore that it was customary for timber men to put in tenders in the names of others than themselves in order that their business rivals should not have knowledge of their business moves; and that it was customary to write out tender, and afterwards, at the last moment before sealing it up, write in the figures, so that no one else in the office would know what they were.

Mr. Turriff, Dominion Lands Commissioner, swore that he never was alone when he opened the tenders. This was corroborated by his secretary, Miss Munro.

Mr. Ames asks the public to condemn the Liberal Government and to disbelieve the oaths of Messrs. Fraser and Turriff and Miss Munro because

- 1.—Fraser wrote and signed the name of another man to a tender.
- 2.—Because the tender was in cash instead of a cheque.
- 3.—Because there was so little difference between two of the tenders.
- 4.—Because the figures of the tender were written with a pen different from that which wrote the body of the tender.

Now for purposes of comparison a return of original documents relating to timber transactions before 1896 was brought down from which exhibit Nos. 4 to 15 have been taken.

No. 4 shows the tender of Isaac Riley, in October of '95, for berth 703, for \$152.

No. 5 shows a letter from Isaac Riley, of December 8th, '95, in regard to the survey of the berth which he had acquired, in an entirely different handwriting and with a different signature.

No. 6 shows the tender of D. E. Sprague for the same berth for \$150, just two dollars less than the successful Riley tender.

No. 7 shows a third tender by H. B. Mitchell, per F.W.A., for \$53 in cash. Tender not rejected for informality.

No. 8 shows a tender for a berth without a number by J. A. McArthur, of Birtle, Man., for \$75 and enclosing cash to that amount. Tender accepted.

No. 9 is a single tender by McKenzie and Mann for five berths, enclosing the amount of the tender—\$500 in cash. Tender accepted.

No. 10 is a tender by Flavien Couture, of St. Boniface, for \$21 in cash for a berth which in his tender he states contains 675 square miles. The figures 21 are evidently not in the same handwriting as the rest of the tender.

No. 11 is a tender by McLeod and McPhee, of Edmonton, for berth 615 at \$310.

No. 12 is a tender for the same berth by A. J. Fraser, of Edmonton, at \$170, the amount not being mentioned at all in the tender. As it was the low tender it did not take the berth, but it was not rejected because it was not in proper form.

No. 13 is a tender by John Walter, of Edmonton, for berth 646 at \$125.

No. 14 is a tender of Fraser and Co. for the same berth at \$150, the amount of the tender not being mentioned in the tender.

No. 15 is a tender of A. J. Fraser for the same berth at \$160. His tender took the berth although the amount is not mentioned in the body of the tender.

SEALED TENDERS addressed to the Timber and Mines Branch, Department of the Interior, and marked on the envelope "Tender for Timber Berth No. 1108," will be received at this Department until noon on Wednesday, the 2nd day of December, 1903, for a license to cut timber on Berth No. 1108, situate in the District of Saskatchewan and containing an area of sixty square miles, to be selected in not more than six blocks, within a tract surrounding Moose Lake, three and one half miles in depth from the shores thereof, together with the islands in said lake, but excluding from said tract any of the Hudson Bay Company's land, or land reserved for Indians which may fall within the same.

The length of each block must not exceed three times the breadth thereof, and the distance between the blocks must not be less than one half mile.

The regulations under which a license will be issued, also printed form of tender and envelope, may be obtained at this Department or at the office of the Crown Timber Agent at Prince Albert and Winnipeg.

Each tender must be accompanied by an accepted cheque on a chartered bank in favour of the Deputy of the Minister of the Interior, for the amount of the bonus which the applicant is prepared to pay for a license.

No tender by telegraph will be entertained.

Every transaction in Federal timber limits since the Liberals came into power will stand the closest scrutiny; and the sole foundation for the innuendos of favouritism made by Mr. Ames and others of his ilk rests upon the foregoing Fraser-Nolan tenders. On making a comparison of the documents above given no fair-minded man can charge the Liberal Government with in any way deviating from the established rule and practice of the Interior Department; a rule and practice established under the Conservative regime, and one which is fair and above-board with all concerned. But on some other points attention may well be drawn to

Return No. 216 brought down to the House during last Session. It throws a side light on timber operations under the Conservative Government. A few sample letters regarding transactions taking place in the years '94 to '96 give a fair idea of:—

1st.—The part played by political influence in the awarding of timber berths.

2nd.—The amount which was paid for berths in those days, and

3.—The attention that was paid to advertising the berths.

To take the last point first the following letter is, to say the least, illuminating:—

DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR,
OTTAWA, 26th March, 1895.

Sir,—

I am directed to say that on the 10th January last a copy of an advertisement inviting competition for a permit to cut timber on berth 679, in the District of Alberta, was sent to you, and you were asked to be so good as to cause the same to be inserted once in "The Times," Edmonton. The Crown Timber Agent at Edmonton has now advised this Department that there is no such paper as "The Times" published at that place; that it died some twelve months ago and is now known as "The South Edmonton News"; and that the editor of this paper did not receive the advertisement above referred to.

The record shows that the berth was two square miles in area, was situated near Wetaskiwin, and that Mr. Hayes became its owner for the sum of \$15.

The following letter from W. H. Whimster to the then sitting Member, Mr. N. Boyd, and the reply of the Minister of the Interior to Mr. Boyd's personal representations show how far around the applicant for even a \$20 berth had to travel in those good old days when the Conservatives were in office. The berth in question comprised one square mile, and was taken by Saunders for \$20.

he has always been a strong supporter of the Conservative Party and can be relied on to stick to us still. He wished me to ask you to look into the matter for him, and give him any assistance you can in getting the permit through. I understand that Tully of Strathelair is also applying for the same piece of timber, and as he is an opponent I would rather see Saunders get it. Kindly help Saunders in any way you can and I will take it as a personal favour. I will have to write to you shortly with reference to some of my own Ottawa matter.

The following letter casts a lurid light on the market value of property in the West in '94. Prince Bros. of Battleford applied for Berth 657, 30 square miles, and in competition bid \$5 for it. As the letter shows the Department insisted on the bid being raised to \$10, presumably to cover the cost of advertising.

The enclosed explains itself. John Ellis is a good man worthy of encouragement and his father is a fine old fellow of the right colour.

I have sent him a letter applying for a permit to sign and have told him I would ask you to wire McTaggart instructions also to tell him to come in to the Office there.

As it is only about 50,000 ft. can't you let him have his permit without competition? It is a mere hagatelle and in this case, as in every other lumbering operation, time is money, because he can only haul his logs on snow—it takes too long a time to put a limit or permit up to competition, for the successful tenderer to make use of it the same season as he applies when the application is made as late as this. As you know I am interested in lumber myself and

might not be expected to invite competition—My view is that such a permit will do no harm to business and may do some good to poor settler.

If the documents reproduced by Mr. Ames are evidence of graft by the Liberals, the documents accompanying them are equally evidence of graft by Mr. Ames' friends. Or if certain conditions of documents disposing of timber by Conservatives is not evidence of graft on their part, neither is the same state of facts evidence of graft by the Liberals. It is true that graft—if there was graft—by the Conservatives does not excuse graft by the Liberals. But if there is evidence of graft in the one case there is equally evidence of graft in the other. And if the Conservatives are and were grafters, as Mr. Ames' evidence against the Liberals proves them to be, their claim to be placed in charge of public affairs because of the alleged dishonesty of the Liberals falls to the ground.

The fact is that whatever foundation in fact there may or may not be for charges of graft against either the present or the late Government in regard to its timber transactions, the evidence offered by Mr. Ames is merely the discovery of a mare's nest. The men who desire to acquire timber limits in the West are of all sorts and conditions as to general education and business knowledge. In dealing with them in order to be fair the Government had only to consider the main facts of the amount of the tender which settled the precedence of the rights of one man over another. Although printed forms were supplied they were seldom used, and tenders were not refused whether they were strictly in form or not. The points were as to the money and its amount and on whose behalf it was offered. This was the base of operations by the Conservatives and Liberals, and was the only basis. To have rejected tenders for lack of forms would have been a gross injustice to the men tendering and to the Government. And yet if Mr. Ames' campaign means anything, it means that a legitimate tender should have been refused if it lacked due form. Most people will agree that in this matter both Governments were better advised.

Mr. Ames asked for the "facts of the case." Mr. Ames said the public was "the jury to decide." Mr. Ames stands before the people as the bearer of a "new gospel."

Well, in this little pamphlet are contained the "facts of the case." Herein is a bit of the old testament of Conservative doings—an old testament from which Mr. Ames is careful not to quote in support of his "new gospel." Herein are shown the official records which expose in black and white the part played by political influence in the days of the Conservative rule, when the public lands of the Dominion were given away for next to nothing to "fine old fellows of the right color."

Let the public decide!
