At a point some 20 miles north-west of the junction of the Assiniboine and Souris rivers, upon the banks of the former, and where its winding course is beautifully fringed with timber, and the valley of its winding is hemmed in on the north and south by gentle prairie slopes near the spot, now identified for all time by the crossing of the Assiniboine by the great Canadian Pacific Railway, stands one of the marvels of the progress of emigration in what so lately was termed the "great lone land," the City of Brandon.

"No legend hoary nor ancient story" can be recited concerning this, now famous city; her history, so far as dates are concerned is extremely limited, the figures 1881 and 1882 confine the records of the past of Brandon. The name of Brandon will however bear a retrospective view of some extent. The geographical situation of the locality being so near to the Souris and Assiniboine Rivers, two of the principal watery highways of the North-west, warrants the supposition that the district has been passed and re-passed time out of mind, and from a few records it has been possible to glean the knowledge that for nearly a hundred years Brandon has had a habitation and a name.

After the treaty of Utrecht in 1713 which closed the great Duke of Marlborough's campaign, a French officer of distinction named La Verandrye with his family left France for the French colony in Canada. Some twenty years after this the same individual with his sons and an intelligent Indian guide might have been seen on the north-western shores of Lake Superior studying a route which the Indian had traced on a sheet of birch bark, of a projected exploration expedition into the great north-west. It is recorded that they put their design into execution and by the year 1735 they had passed Rainy Lake, Lake of the Woods, down the Winnipeg River to Lake Winnipeg and up the Red River so far as the junction of the Red with the Assiniboine River, and had erected in that neighborhood a position of defence called Fort Rouge. From this point they proceeded westward up the River Assiniboine and by the year 1738 they were occupying another erection of their making, Fort la Reine, near the present site of Portage la Prairie. By the year 1742 these explorers had passed westwards up the Assiniboine as far as Souris mouth, and then had ascended Souris River as far as the grand Coteau de Missouri. From which we can gather without the least presumption that our immediate locality, its hills, its woods and its waters had doubtless afforded subsistence to the indefatigable hunters of the now justly celebrated exploring party of La Verandrye. From this time onward the route which La Verandrye had opened up was more or less frequented by French fur-traders until it became a regular channel for the fur trade, and so important had the fur trade become in this particular locality that the employees of the North-west Fur Company deemed it necessary to erect a trading post near Souris mouth. The North-west Fur Company was formed by a party of Montreal merchants in 1783, such men as the Brothers Frobisher, Simon McTavish and Alexander McKenzie being leading spirits in it. The operations of the company were very extensive and it is said that at one time as many as 5,000 of their servants were threading the various paths of this great country in the pursuit of the fur trade. In the year 1794 the Hudson's Bay Company, being stimulated to greater activity by the success of the North-

west Fur Company, also recognized the importance of this particular district by establishing a trading post near that of the North-west Company, and which they called Brandon. This is no doubt the earliest association of the name that can be referred to, and it is interesting to note that when in 1812 the number of trading posts throughout the length and breadth of the great North-west were computed to be one hundred and thirty-three, one of them was a Brandon. These few facts are significant and assuring for history has but repeated itself, for the creation of the Brandon of to-day is but an endorsement of the fact that the traders of a hundred years ago and the pioneer founders of our city have held the same ideas that the locality was a desirable distributing and collecting centre for a large interesting and valuable district. The trading centre has but shifted its location so as to be accommodated now as then by the principal highway of the period. It is said that the debris of the Brandon House trading post still marks the site, and it is to be hoped that so interesting a memento will be protected that future generations may see and venerate the spot from which our fair city derives its name.

The scenery about Brandon is particularly picturesque and attractive, the river Assiniboine winds from side to side of a valley a mile in width; its banks are embowered in groves of oak, ash, elm, willow, poplar, and a rich variety of undergrowth; these again are fringed with meadows of luxuriant grasses, here and there the presence of ranker vegetation indicates a swampy situation, termed a slough. In by-gone days the trapper and hunter must have regarded this fair valley as a grand scene for their operations. These woods, swamps, river-scenes, meadows and prairie slopes were then the haunt of the buffalo, bear, elk, wolf, fox, skunk, beaver, badger, otter, rabbit, gopher and chipmunk, and the resort in their season of the wild goose, wild duck, teal, prairie chicken, partridge, bustard, owl, bluejay, woodpecker and chickadee. What a tumult of living nature ! The picture has yet other favored proportions : the scene is sheltered from north winds by a range of hills, and on its south side by a more gentler slope, backed in the distance by the beautiful Brandon Hills, while to the east, the valley widens into a beautiful agricultural valley deservedly called the Grand Valley. Near this point the Canadian Pacific Railway now crosses the Assiniboine River, and at a spot about half a mile to the westward of the crossing on the south bank of the river the company ultimately decided to erect their depot, the nucleus of the future city, Brandon. Up to April, 1881, the future town site had only been recognized as the location of several rather undesirable agricultural sections, three of them more or less affected by spring floods, and two others as being of a light and gravelly nature. In this light had the locality been often viewed and discussed by steamboat passengers on their way to and from Fort Ellice and Winnipeg. Attention had also been withdrawn from the locality in question and directed to the favored spot in the immediate vicinity of McVicar's Landing, the ferry boat crossing of the Assiniboine, a spot highly favored by nature and richly meriting the name it has gained, the Grand Valley, and which public opinion had concluded would be the location of the depot of the Canadian Pacific Railway; consequently a settlement of some importance had so far anticipated the Railway Company's decision as to pitch their tents and rear some more substantial dwellings near McVicar's Landing. Early in the spring of 1881, however, the presence of Mr. Vaughan, D.L.S., and a surveying party engaged in marking out a town site where Brandon now stands, was sufficient to guarantee the policy of a general move towards the new town site, and from that moment our present city can date her existence. The despised gravelly section now became the centre of attraction as soon as the survey was complete, which was about the latter end of May, town lots were put up at auction, and in some instances they realized as many dollars as they contained yards. The river boats now were freighted with hundreds of people and tons of merchandize, for which Brandon was the destination. Accommodation for such crowds was out of the question, and the majority had to spend their first

The as complete, ne instances eighted with destination nd their first night in Brandon upon six feet of good prairie sod, wrapped in a blanket. An interval of twentyfour hours wrought many changes in those early days. Brandon grew with each hour of the clock, and tents and shanties burst into full blown stores and offices with a wonderful rapidity, The creation of a real estate office was simply marvellous. At 9 a.m., a man had hardly paid the deposit on his newly acquired possession, but the next hour of the clock would behold him the presiding genius at desk, table, box or caskhead (the man was not particular), vending real estate to eager purchasers, and fabulous amounts were often realized. By September, 1881, that is within four months of the time when the surveyors' tent was the solitary habitation, Brandon possessed all the elements of a growing city, and could boast of possessing a railway depot, a river boat landing, a post office, an express office, three temporary places of worship for the several denominations, a branch banking house, a planing mill, a saw mill, an engineer's office, a lawyer's office, about two dozen general stores, two hardware stores, about a score of real estate offices, several temporary hotels and boarding houses, and several livery and feed stables, all in full swing. Before winter set in many substantial buildings had replaced the original tents and shanties, and three good and commodious hotels, the "Royal," the "Brandon," and the "Queen's," were affording the accommodation at all times so sorely needed. As the cold of winter deepened the growth of Brandon strengthened, no greater evidence of which can be adduced than this, the publication of the first Brandon newspaper, the Sun on the 19th of January, 1882. And on other and higher grounds can Brandon look back, and with credit and pleasure review, the early months of her existence, for amongst her earliest citizens she included men who felt the vacancy, if there was not one hallowed day amongst the seven, and who in the convenient tent or shanty, provided the place of meeting where the God of their past, their present and their future, was thankfully remembered. And who shall say that Brandon owes not her glory of to-day to these worthy circumstances? As early as June, 1881, services in connection with the Presbyterian church at Brandon were conducted by the Rev. Mr. Ferries, and soon after their establishment the Methodist Church of Canada organized their body under the pastorate of the Rev. Mr. Lawson. The last named denomination was soon in a flourishing condition, and before winter had erected a large temporary church, which the Presbyterians were allowed to share. The Church of England also made satisfactory progress under the care of Mr. L. M. Fortier, so that by December the Rev. Mr. Boydell, the first clergyman of that denomination. found a complete organization awaiting his ministrations. When the first issue of the Sun appeared the permanent population of the city was estimated at 800, the buildings were about 200, and their value approximated at \$200,000. Over and above these figures there was also a very large transient population, and often it occurred that if a census had been then taken the population of the city would have totalled some 5,000 individuals. Before the spring had far advanced the resident population had increased to 1,600, the number of places of business of every description to one hundred and twenty, a flouring mill added to the manufacturing industries, and a branch of the Merchants' Bank established. Within twelve months of the time when the site of the city was a grassy prairie slope, Parliament had passed a bill incorporating and granting a charter to the city of Brandon. The first municipal election took place on June 30th, 1882, when T. Mayne Daly, Jun., Esq., was elected Mayor, and Messrs. J. W. Horne, W. Winter, A. L. Sifton, J. A. Brock, E. Evans, G. Winters, J. A. Smart, S. H. Bower, C. Pilling, L. Lockhart, L. Buchan and L. M. Fortier were elected aldermen, the city being divided into four wards and each ward returning three aldermen. The City Council then made the following appointments :-- Mr. E. Martindale, city clerk; Mr. F. G. A. Henderson, city solicitor; Mr. T. Winter, city chamberlain ; Mr. A. L. McMillan, chief of police ; Messrs. Poudrier & Brownlee, city engineers; Mr. A. Waddell, assessor and collector of taxes; and Mr. J. J. Parker, city fire

inspector. The summer of 1882 showed extraordinary progress in the growth of Brandon, the population had increased to 3,000, the business institutions numbered two hundred, and a general summary of other institutions included four banks, a flouring mill, a saw mill, two planing mills, three new churches, the English church of St. Matthew, the Presbyterian church and the Methodist church of Canada, a place of worship, part residence, part chapel, for the Catholic church, a Dominion land office, a registry office, a club house in course of completion, a large number of commodious hotels and boarding houses, and some very extensive and handsomely erected livery, and feed and sale stables, and a rapidly increasing number of private residences. In addition to all these a splendid bridge had been thrown over the Assiniboine at the bottom of First street, the private enterprise of our present Provincial member, Joseph E. Woodworth, Esq., and the approaches to another bridge connecting the country north of Brandon with Eighteenth street were rapidly nearing completion. In connection with the Canadian Pacific Railway and their system of dividing their great line into railway divisions, extensive round houses and engine shops for the repair of their locomotives, and very extensive coal sheds had been constructed. The emigration to this district also had received due regard at the hands of the Government, very large and handsome emigration sheds had been crected, immediately adjacent to the railway depot, capable of accommodating nearly 500 emigrants at a time.

Before the close of the year 1882 the additions and improvements of the City included the finished Club House before mentioned, and a corporation building which embraced a Fire Hall fitted with a Fountain—Hose and Steamer, and Hook and Ladder appliances, suites of offices for the City Clerk, the Chief of Police and the assessors and collectors of taxes and a Council Chamber; a new passenger depot for the Canadian Pacific Railway placed near the crossing of Tenth street and Pacific avenue, a new elevator and the completion and occupation of many villa residences in the suburbs of the City. Three of the principal avenues of the City, Pacific, Rosser and Princess and the cross streets from First street to Fourteenth street were now extensively built upon and were constantly the scene of busy thoroughfares. The Hotel and boarding accommodation for the winter 1882–1883 may be gathered from the fact that nincteen liquor licences had been granted to Brandon applicants. The year 1882 closed with the usual municipal changes. Mayor Daly was succeeded in the civic chair by Mr. Alderman Winter, and Messrs. W. Rose, J. B. Angus, Fraser and A. Cameron replacing Messrs. Horne, L. Buchan, Brock and Lockhart as Aldermen. The review of the past eighteen months of Brandon's existence guarantees the assertion that nowhere in the annals of the growth of cities has such progress been recorded as we have feebly attempted to describe.

GEOGRAPHICAL AND POLITICAL SITUATION.

Brandon is situated on the River Assiniboine, in Longitude 99° 50' west and Latitude 49° 50' north. It is 130 miles due west from Winnipeg, about 700 miles east of the Rocky mountains, 57 miles north of the international boundary and 84 miles due south of Dauphin Lake. It is interesting to note that our city and district is in the same latitude as the Land's End, Cornwall, the Channel Islands, Cherbourg, Rouen and the valley of the Lower Seine, South Belgium and the valley of the upper Meuse and upper Moselle, Luxemburg, Rhenish Prussia, Rhenish Bavaria, the great resort of European tourists, the district of the Upper Elbe, the surroundings of Prague and Cracow and the lower valleys of the River Don, Dnieper and Volga in European Russia. The temperature of a Brandon winter has been registered at 60° below zero but at rare intervals. The continuous low temperature at or below zero during the months of January and February is more than ameliorated by the dryness of the atmosphere, so that very little inconvenience is suffered.

The winter is a prolonged one lasting from November to April, during the whole of this time snow covers the ground, although the average snow depth does not exceed eighteen inches. The long winter is succeeded by a glorious Spring, Summer and "Fall."

Politically, Brandon is the centre of the county of the same name. Originally this embraced thirty-six townships of the Province of Manitoba, being bounded by ranges 17 and 22 inclusive on the east and west and by the Second Correction Line and south Base Line on the north and south. This district includes the important settlements of Carberry, Chater, Cypress, Petrel, Auburn, Elton, Oak River, Lothair, Griswold, Oak Lake, Virden, Brandon Hills, Plumb Creek, Roundthwaite and Millford. The County of Brandon returns one member to the Provincial Parliament assembling at Winnipeg. J. E. Woodworth, Esq., is the present member.

SOIL, AGRICULTURE, CROPS, &c.

Brandon is situated in a purely agricultural district. The valleys of the Assiniboine, Souris, Little Saskatchewan and Oak Rivers are included amongst the richest alluvial deposits of the North-west. Here the prairie rose and silver willow, the indices of good corn land, abundantly grow, while the lower levels of the rolling prairie or the margins of river, creek or slough are the habitat of a wealth of luxuriant grasses which cannot be dispensed with. The soil immediately near to Brandon is somewhat light in character, but the more desirable soils, the black loam, the clay loam, and the sandy loam are to be found in large proportion throughout the district. The despised gravel bed upon which part of Brandon is built has been found to be of the greatest service in the grading of the avenues and streets of the city. Winnipeg has felt the want of such a gravel bed, and so will Regina. The country round Brandon is devoted to corn and stock raising, principally the former. At present a large proportion of the country is but newly settled. The Brandon Hills settlement is one of the oldest, the pioneer settler, Mr. Roddick, taking up land there in 1879. An idea of the grain producing capabilities of the district culled from widely divergent points can be gathered from the following figures:—

These rates have been extracted from the returns of last harvest. Root crops have been generally exceedingly good, while some extraordinary specimens of both roots and grains have been produced in a few instances. It may not be out of place here to extract from a report of the Kingston exhibit an eulogium in which the Brandon district has a right to share. "There are **321** exhibits contributed by all parts of the Province. There is a large display of grain in the straw, among the samples being some oats 5 feet 9 inches in height. The wheat shown is very fine, the grain being solid and plump. There are samples of White Fife, Russian, Scotch, Red Fife, Champion, Norway, Lost Nation and Red Odessa. The country is celebrated for Red Fife wheat. The oats are really beautiful samples. Among them might be mentioned Odessa gold oats and white potato oats. In roots and vegetables there is a large and miscellaneous collection. Notwithstanding that the crop was prematurely gathered, there are some mammoth early rose and white Lapland potatoes, and some large squashes, pumpkins, beets and turnips."

THE BRIDGES.

These channels of communication are amongst the greatest evidences of the enterprise of Brandon men in their endeavor to make Brandon great. The trails to Oak River on the northwest, to Rapid City on the north, and to Minnedosa on the north-west, are amongst the numerous paths which by means of these bridges lead into Brandon, so that the bridges will ever be an important factor of the commercial welfare of the city. The First street bridge, so called from its situation where First street cuts the river and now leading that street across the same, was constructed by J. E. Woodworth, Esq., M.P.P., the owner of the north-west quarter of section 19, township 10, range 19, whereon part of the city is built. The bridge is on this estate. It is of the "Howe truss swing " model, and crosses the stream where it is 240 feet wide. The span of the swing is 80 feet, the length of the two approaches together 220 feet, total length of the bridge 300 feet, width of roadway 18 feet. The bridge is supported by piles, 14 inches square, driven into the bed of the river, which is here from 12 to 15 feet deep. The level of the bridge is 14 feet above high water mark. The centre pier is built of piles 14 inches square, and covers an area 400 feet square, the space between the piles is filled with heavy stone work to render the structure solid and better calculated to resist the great pressure of the ice in spring. It is also protected by a breakwater, constructed so as to cause the ice pressing against it to lift and break itself. The expense attending the construction of this bridge exceeds \$28,000. Tolls are levied on all traffic crossing the structure. The Eighteenth street bridge, so called as it is the continuation of the street of that name, is similar in construction to the First street bridge, and also built according to the "Howe truss swing." The expense of this structure has been greatly increased by the number and the length of the numerous approaches by which the bridge proper is reached. One of these approaches, which crosses a secondary course of the river running parallel to the main stream, is 358 feet long, whereas the bridge proper itself is but 376 feet in length. The span of the swing of this bridge is 142 feet; the river at this point being 300 feet wide and from 12 to 15 feet deep. The cost of the erection is estimated at \$30,000, and it has been calculated that another \$6,000 will have to be expended upon it to make it a stable structure. The building of this bridge is due to the enterprise of A. W. Ross, Esq., a large land owner in the locality. The City Council of Brandon have it under their consideration as to the desirability of purchasing these bridges and throwing them open to traffic free of tolls.

THE CANADIAN PACIFIC RAILWAY.

A reference to this gigantic undertaking will find a place in every page of Brandon's history for many a year to come and there is no reason that it should be otherwise. The depot they have established here will drain the produce of an immense tract of country north and south of the railway and in return will distribute over the same great space the cargoes of her cars laden with eastern imports. Then again after a comparatively short interval richly laden cars will come to Brandon from a westerly direction so that her merchant princes will have but to stretch their hands east and west to receive and to distribute. Upon the assumption that not one settlement only but many settlements, will make Brandon their port of ingress and egress, Brandon has grown prodigiously in a few months, so that now, the City is, in itself an important source of supply and demand. To keep pace with this visibly increasing magnitude and to increase the facilities for the receipt and shipment of Brandon's exports and imports has been the effort of the Canadian Pacific Railway under their skilful and obliging agent Mr. F. Mr. Peters has furnished us with a few facts and figures which speak for themselves and which are of general interest. During the six months ended 31st Dec., 1882, the freight received for distribution in Barndon and its environs and the produce shipped from Brandon to foreign parts, excluding altogether freight passing through the depot to points east and west, is represented by the following figures :---

TONS OF FREIGHT.

Readers of the above statistics will understand the fluctuations better than we do, so that comment upon them is unnecessary. Over and above all this, for the convenience of the railway traffic, the Company have constituted Brandon one of their divisional points. This being the case a large number of officials and men make the city their home or their headquarters. Thus the Company's agent, Mr. Peters, besides his immediate staff of clerks, has warehousemen and coal men and yardmen. The roadmaster has also a staff of men, and the mechanical foreman has a third staff of men in his department. These are material aids to Brandon as well as evidences of the importance of the C. P. R. depot. Looking forward it would be difficult to gauge the influence upon this City of the future programme of the Canadian Pacific Railway. Ideas have been published from time to time of their intentions to locate lines, one to tap the district which would skirt a line leading from the Touchwood Hills by the Riding Mountains, Fort Ellice, across the Little Saskatchewan to a point twenty miles east of Brandon, and another from Brandon south-westward to the Souris and Turtle Mountain districts. The necessity for these branches is apparent enough but it might be premature to endeavor to sketch the programme of the C. P. R. The service of trains running at present is one passenger train from the east arriving at Brandon at 2:50 p. m. and one passenger train from the end of the track arriving 11:40 a. m. daily. Freight trains laden with either produce or emigrants effects or outfits, or railway construction material, or exports and imports of various descriptions are running continuously.

EMIGRATION ACCOMMODATION.

This has been and still is an important consideration at points on the Canadian Pacific Railway, destined for a long time to come to be ports of disembarkation for hundreds of families who will strike northwards and southwards to the lands yet open for settlement. At such places the incomers need considerable time to mature their plans and decide where they will direct their steps. To afford this convenience to those whose means are limited, handsome and commodious buildings have been erected by the Government at Brandon. They are situated so conveniently to the railway that the stranger is put to the least trouble and to no expense to reach the provided shelter. The

group of buildings comprise an emigrant shed, quarters for the emigration agent and his assistants, an hospital and the necessary outbuildings. The emigration shed consists of four large rooms 48x27 feet and a cook house fitted to suit the wants of a large number. Over four hundred individuals can be thus accommodated at one time. Since July, 1882, two hundred and thirty-nine persons have availed themselves of these quarters. Of these nineteen were from Scotland, one hundred and nineteen from England, forty from Ireland, thirty-four from the Eastern Provinces of Canada, twenty-two from Germany, four from Austria, and one from the United States. Mr. Thomas Bennett is the able and attentive Government emigration agent and M. Julius Aberhard his interpreter.

BRANDON CHURCHES.

THE ENGLISH CHURCH OF ST. MATTHEW.

An elegant structure of early gothic design, is situated near the south-east corner of Eleventh street and Princess avenue. The position is a very central and commanding one, and the high gables and bell turret of the pretty little church can be seen rearing itself conspicuously above its more rectangular surroundings from every part of the City. The cost of the site and building amounts to about \$7,000, E. McCoskrie & Co. being the architects. The interior of the building is made attractive by the roof, choir stalls and ceiling being of stained pine, the east window of ornamental glass representing a scene in the "Crucifixion," and the reredos composed of five lancet recesses of carved wood work filled in with tapestry. The reredos is the gift of the first organizer of the congregation, L. M. Fortier, Esq. The church was consecrated on the first of October, 1882, by the Lord Bishop of Rupert's Land, and since that time the congregation has steadily increased. A large proportion of the sittings are free and unappropriated. The Rev. T. Boydell is the respected rector. He is assisted in the services by a mixed choir of ladies and gentlemen, and Mr. Drake is the organist. Mr. Boydell is also the Rural Dean of the district. In the lay work of the parish the rector is assisted by an association of ladies and gentlemen called the St. Matthew's Guild. A Sunday School and Bible Class is conducted by the rector and a staff of teachers, every Sunday afternoon. T. Mayne Daly, junr., Eso., and L. M. Fortier, Esq., are the churchwardens.

THE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH.

The dawn of this denomination dates from the advent of Brandon's first settlers. It needs but a glance at the roll of names contained in this humble publication to assure the reader that the Presbyterian body in Brandon is both strong and numerous, and such is the case. It is one of the largest congregations in the city, and includes in the roll of its members many of the most influential men of Brandon. The Presbyterian place of worship is a handsome edifice situated on Eighth street. Its interior is lofty and spacious, and the acoustic properties of the room nearly perfect, and the hearty congregational singing in this crowded place of assembly on a Sabbath evening is a scene most delightful to join in and not easily forgotten. The Sabbath School and Bible Class of this body are ably conducted an well attended. The Rev. John Ferries has been the pastor of this flock since Brandon began "to be." Mr. William Barr is the able secretary of the Church and its Associations.

THE METHODIST CHURCH OF CANADA.

The prosperity of this Church is one of the telling features in the growth of the City. The organization began with Brandon, and was the first to rear a place of worship to supply the spiritual wants of the pioneers. A large and convenient church, measuring 70x35, with a wing 40x35, situated near the centre of the City on Seventh street, is the present place of worship. This body of Christians began their Brandon labors under the pastorate of the Rev. T. Lawson, when the City had but began "to be," and the success of the denomination can be inferred from the fact that it now numbers some 500 members and adherents, and that Mr. Lawson's efforts are supplemented by those of the Rev. W. Bridgeman and the Rev. C. Williams. The organization of the body is very complete considering the short time it has existed. The classes are numerous and well attended, and the class leaders men of mark and ability. The future of the Church is assured when its roll of supporters includes such names as the Hon. J. W. Sifton, H. L. Sifton, R. Phippen, H. W. Hillard, J. A. Brock, J. A. Johnston, L. Starr and E. Evans.

THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH.

In connection with this denomination a fine building, which for temporary purposes is part chapel and part pastor's residence, has been reared during the past summer at a cost of \$4,000. The pastor is the Rev. J. S. Robillard, who celebrates Sabbath services at 11 a.m. and 7 p.m., and holds a Sunday School at three o'clock in the afternoon. The congregation is fast outgrowing the accommodation provided for them.

BRANDON PUBLIC SCHOOL.

The Board of Trustees and the public are to be congratulated on the flourishing condition of this essential institution. A central situation, handsome and commodious buildings, well arranged, airy, well-lighted and spacious class rooms, and an efficient staff of teachers, are unfortunately not the characteristics of every public school that has come under our observation, but it is truly stated of Brandon. Accommodation is provided for the tuition of nearly 500 children. There are six large class rooms lighted and fitted up in the most suitable manner for collective teaching. The curriculum embraces all the elementary subjects, and Euclid, Algebra, singing and drawing. A collegiate department is now being organized to prepare students for the university. The number of children on the register is two hundred and fifty, but as it has been shown, there is room for nearly double that number. The principal of the school is Mr. T. J. Lamont. He is a highly qualified teacher and an energetic and conscientions worker, thoroughly anxious to do his duty to every individual child, and to make his school an efficient institution. The staff of teachers consists of the principal, Mr. Lamont, 1st assistant, Mr. C. N. Jeffrey, 2nd assistant, Miss Crooks, 3rd assistant, Miss Weightman. The institution is supervised by the Government Inspector twice a year, and Mr. Lamont conducts half-yearly examinations for prizes as a wholesome stimulant to exertion and improvement.

BRANDON POST OFFICE.

In gauging the business of a locality and its importance as a collecting and distributing centre, a very correct estimate can be arrived at by perusing the Post Office statistics. A place of business which finds active employment for five officials must at all times be a pretty busy hive. A few figures kindly furnished by our worthy postmaster will enlighten us as to how the money is made. There are no less than seventeen distinct mails despatched from this

office every week, being nearly an average of three per day. The revenue of the office for the year 1882 was \$7,114, the month of December amounting to \$912. The remittances for postage stamps sold totalled \$901. The number of registrations, consisting of registered letters, parcels and books, and including everything handled for remuneration, were 24,654. The number of registered letters mailed in Brandon for the year 1882 were 6,204, and the number of registered letters delivered at the Post Office for the same period totalled 4,961. Mr. J. C. Kavanagh is the postmaster.

BRANDON GENERAL HOSPITAL.

The walls of this institution do not as yet cast their shadows on the prairie sod, but the organization of this useful establishment is so far completed as to have its president, treasurer, secretary and directorate, also its rules of government and admission, and lastly, though not least its promised subscriptions. The building is to be erected early in the spring, and its estimated cost is \$5,000.

POSTAL INFORMATION.

LETTER RATES, ETC.

Canada,—Letters posted in Canada, addressed to any place within the Dominion (including Manitoba, British Columbia and Prince Edward Island). 3 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.; if unpaid, such letters cannot be forwarded, but will be sent to the Dead Letter Office. If liable to more than one rate of postage, and insufficiently prepaid, the letter will be forwarded to its destination, and double the deficiency charged on delivery. Letters mailed at any office for delivery at or from the same office, are charged one cent each, and must be pre-paid; otherwise they are sent to the Dead Letter Office.

Post Cards.—From any place in Canada to any other place in Canada or to the United States, I cent each; British and Foreign, 2 cents each.

United States.—Postage on Letters, 5 cents per ½ oz., whether by Canadian or New York steamers. If sent unpaid double postage will be charged.

Nevofoundland.—Postage on Letters, 5 cents per 1/2 oz. Newspapers (see "Transient Newspapers.") Post cards, 2 cents each. Pre-payment necessary.

Bermuda (via Halifax or New York).—Letters 5 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. Newspapers 2 cents each. Printed matter 1 cent per two oz.

United States.—The rate on Letters to the United States is the same as in Canada, and must be pre-paid.

REGISTRATION OF LETTERS.

Persons posting Letters containing value should be careful to require them to be Registered, and to obtain from the Postmaster a certificate of receipt for Registration.

The charge for Registration (use Registration Stamp), in addition to the Postage, is as follows, viz :

On Letters to any other place in Canada

or British North America . . . 2 cents. On Letters for the United States 5 cents. On Letters for the United Kingdom . . . 5 cents. On Parcels, Patterns or Samples in Can-

ada On Book Packets and Newspapers to

the United Kingdom 5 cents. in weight the limit of 2 lbs. 3 oz.

Both the Postage charge and Registration fee must in all cases be pre-paid by stamp.

Registered Letter Stamps have been issued of the denominations of 2, 5 and 8 cents, which may be obtained at any Stamp Agency.

Registration Stamps cannot be used in payment of postage, nor can Postage Stamps be used in payment of Registration fees.

Registration is not an absolute guarantee against the miscarriage or loss of a Letter; but a Registered Letter can be traced where an Unregistered one can not, and the posting and delivery or non-delivery can be proved.

BOOK POST.

A Book Packet may contain any number of separate books, publications, works of literature or art, maps or prints, photographs, daguerrotypes, when not on glass or in frames containing glass; any quantity of paper, vellum or parchment [to the exclusion of Letters]; and the books, maps, papers, &c., may be either written, printed or plain, or any mixture of the three; and may be either British, Colonial or Foreign. No package must exceed 4 lbs. 6 oz. in weight, nor must the size exceed two feet in length, or one foot in width or depth.

Book Packets must be opened at *both ends or both sides*, and must not contain any Letter or sealed inclosure.

The rate on Book Packets between any two places in Canada, and to Newfoundland and the United States, is I cent per 4 oz., which must be pre-paid by Stamps.

The rate to Great Britain is I cent per 2 oz.

PARCEL POST.

The charge on Parcels by the Parcel Post, which is limited to places within the Dominion, is 6 cents for every 402., or fraction thereof (with 5 cents additional if Registered). No letter must be inclosed; if any discovered, the amount paid will be forfeited, and the Parcel charged at unpaid Letter rates. No Parcel must exceed 5 thes in weight, and must be uncervaid by Stamp-

Ibs. in weight, and must be pr-epaid by Stamps. Parcels cannot be transmitted by Post to any place beyond the limits of the Dominion of Canada, nor can any Parcel be forwarded to British Columbia or Manitoba (except to the City of Winnipeg), via the United States, which exceeds in weight the limit of 2 lbs. 3 oz.

Eye glasses and spectacles may be sent by mail when properly put up and pre-paid by Parcel Post.

MISCELLANEOUS MATTER.

Miscellaneous matter, described as under, may pass between places in the Dominion of Canada, upon pre-payment of a rate of 1 cent per 4 oz. The limit of weight is 4 lbs.

Under this head is comprised pamphlets, occarsional publications, printed circulars, hand bills, book and newspaper manuscripts, printers' proof sheets, maps, drawings, engravings, photographs when not on glass, sheet music, printed or written, deeds, insurance policies (but not insurance applications and other papers), &c.

This matter must be done up in covers, open at both ends or sides, or in such manner as to be easily inspected by the Post Office authorities, and must contain no Letter or other communication to serve the purpose of a Letter.

NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.

Newspapers and periodicals printed and published in Canada, and issued not less frequently than once a month from a known office of publication or news agency, and addressed and posted by and from the same for transmission by mail to regular subscribers or news agents in Canada, are sent free; if addressed to Great Britain or the United States, they may be posted by the same on pre-payment of a rate of one cent for each pound weight in bulk, or fraction of a pound ; and such newspapers and periodicals are to be put up into packages and delivered into the Post Office, and the postage rate thereon prepaid by the publisher or news agent, being the sender thereof, under such regulations as the Postmaster-General may from time to time make.

On all newspapers and periodicals posted in Canada, other than those addressed to regular subscribers or news agents, from office of publication or news agency, including all newspapers and periodicals published less frequently than once a month, the rate will be *one cent per four* $e_{z,t}$ to be invariably pre-paid by Postage Stamp.

Newspapers and periodicals weighing less than 1 oz. each may be posted singly, if pre-paid by Postage Stamp 1/2 cent each.

TRANSIENT NEWSPAPERS.

Transient newspapers and periodicals include all newspapers and periodicals posted in Canada, other than Canada newspapers sent from the office of publication, and British newspapers posted by news agents for regular subscribers in Canada. When addressed to any place within the Dominion, Newfoundland or the United States, they must be pre-paid the following rates by Postage Stamp : ---

If weighing less than 1 oz., half a cent each.

If weighing over I oz., one cent per four oz. or fraction of four oz.

Specimen copies of newspapers and periodicals from the office of publication are to be treated as *transient* newspapers or periodicals, the rate upon which is one cent per four oz.

On transient newspapers addressed to the United Kingdom the rate will be one cent per 2 oz.-to be pre-paid by Postage Stamp. Canada Newspapers *posted from the Office of Publication* to subscribers in the United Kingdom—if to be sent in the Mails forwarded via New York or Boston, must be pre-paid by Postage Stamp at the transient paper rate of one cent per 2 oz.; but if sent by Canada Packet such papers may pass, as now, on pre-payment by the publisher, at the time of posting, of the ordinary domestic rate of one cent per pound. Canadian Periodicals when sent by Mail to the United Kingdom or to British Colonies and Foreign Countries (except the United States) are liable to ordinary book packet rates. All packages of newspapers and periodicals pre-paid at the bulk rate of 2 cents per 1b., must be stamped " Pre-paid by Publisher," at the Post office where the package is mailed.

PATTERNS OR SAMPLES WITHIN THE DOMINION.

Patterns and Samples of Merchandise and Goods for sale, not exceeding 24 oz. in weight, may be posted in Canada, to be forwarded to any place within the Dominion, on pre-payment by Postage Stamp of a rate of 1 cent per 4 oz., under the following regulations:

If such a rate be not fully pre-paid by the stamps affixed, the packet to be rated with the deficient postage and a fine of 5 cents in addition.

Packages of Samples and Patterns, addressed to any place in Canada, may be registered on affixing thereto a registration stamp of the value of 5 cents in addition to the postage rate, and provided such packet be handed into the Post Office for registration.

Patterns or Samples must be sent in covers open at the ends so as to be easy of examination. Samples, however, or seeds, drugs, &c., which cannot be sent in open covers, may be enclosed in bags of linen or such like material, fastened in such a manner that they may be readily opened; or in bags entirely closed, provided that they be transparent, so that the officers of the Post Office may be able to satisfy themselves as to the nature of the contents. The particulars, however, of the trade marks, numbers and prices, may be marked on the articles themselves instead of on the outside at the option of the sender.

Goods sent for sale or in execution of an order, however small the quantity may be, or any article sent by one private individual to another, which are not actually trade patterns or samples, are not admissable.

UNITED STATES.

Patterns and Samples of Merchandise, posted for places in the United States, will continue to be subject to the special rate of 10 cents each, prepaid by postage stamps, and must not exceed 8 oz. in weight.

UNITED KINGDOM.

Patterns and Samples of Merchandise, when addressed to places in the United Kingdom, must not exceed 8 oz. in weight, and must be pre-paid by postage stamp at the following rates :—I cent per oz. or fraction of 2 oz.

WEST INDIES-VIA NEW YORK AND HALIFAX.

Via New York for Costa Rica, Curaeoa, Letters to cents per ½ oz.; Nicuaragua, Panama, 5 cents; *via* New York for Hayti and San Domingo, Letters 5 cents per ½ oz.; *via* New York for Bernuda, Cuba, Jamaica, Danish West Indies and Bahamas, Letters 5 cents per ½ oz.; Newspapers, I cent per two oz. West Indies, except where otherwise stated, postage on Letters *via* Halifax, 10 cents per ½ oz., Newspapers, 3 cents per two oz.

USEFUL HINTS.

Register all valuable letters. Transmit money by Money orders. Make complaints and inquiries in writing, and address the Postmaster-General at Ottawa. Preserve, and request correspondents to preserve, envelopes of mis-sent or delayed letters. Send to the Postmaster-General envelopes of letters about which you seek information or make complaint. In addressing letters add the name of the *County* and *Province* in which the office addressed is located. Place stamp on the right hand upper corner of the address side. Put your own name and full address in or on letter, to insure return if it cannot be delivered.

COPYRIGHTS IN CANADA.

Copyrights may be secured by any person domiciled in Canada, or any part of the British possessions, or being a citizen of any country having an International Copyright Treaty with the United Kingdom, who is the author of any book, map, chart, musical composition, or of any original painting, drawing, design, &c., upon the following conditions:—The books, maps, &c., must be published in Canada; and in case of a work of art, it must be produced in Canada, either prior to or simultaneously with its production elsewhere. Two copies of books, maps, &c., must be sent to the Minister of Agriculture ; and in case of paintings, statuary, &c., a written description of the same must be furnished.

The fee for registering a Copyright is one dollar, and it runs for twenty-eight years. It may also be renewed for a further term of fourteen years upon the same conditions.

An Interim Copyright may be obtained, pending the publication of any literary, scientific or artistic work, by depositing in the Office of the Minister of Agriculture a copy of the title, or a description of such work. The Interim Copyright runs for one month, and the fee is htfy cents. The work, however, must be published inside the time specified, or the author incurs a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars.

The penalty for infringing a Copyright is the forfeiture of every copy of the work to the owner of the Copyright and the payment of a fine of not less than ten cents, nor more than one dollar, for every copy found in possession.
