The troops destined for this station, who arrived at Quebec in the Birchenhead, reached Montreal on Friday morning.—The 46th Regt. of the Royal Artillery, arrived in the steam Transport Birchenhead, landed to-day at two o'clock, and were marched up to their barracks, preceded by the band of the corps.—Quebec Mercury.
