BELL MEMORIAL TO BE UNVEILED NEXT SUMMER

A Meeting of the Directors of Association Was Held on Saturday.

A meeting of the board of directors of the Bell Telephone Memorial Association, was held in the secretary's office, at the Court House, on Saturday evening, the president, Mr. W. F. Cocksbutt, M.P., in the chair. Others in attendance were Messrs. John Muir, (treasurer), W. N. Andrews, E. L. Goold, T. H. Preston, C. H. Waterous, F. D. Reville and Geo. Hatley, (secretary) and Mr. Frank Cocksbutt, representing the Parks Board, was also present.

After the presentation of a report dealing with the situation as at present existing, together with a financial statement covering the transactions of the board from the time of its organization to this date, and an estimate of revenue and expenditure to the date of the unveiling of the monument, it was decided:

- 1st. That the president and secretary prepare a resolution regarding the late Lord Strathcona and Mount Royal, Honorary President of the Association from the date of its inception until the time of his death, for transmission to his daughter, the present Lady Strathcona.
- 2nd. That the president, Mr. W. F. Cocksbutt, M.P. be requested to convey to His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught, an invitation to graciously accept the Honorary Presidency of the Association, rendered vacant by the death of Lord Strathcona.
- 3rd. That having heard the proposals of the Parks Board re: city improvement the final adoption of the plans for the lay-out of the site for the monument be postponed, and that an adjourned meeting of this board be held as soon as possible after the secretary has been notified by the Parks board that the report

of their landscape architect, Mr. Dunnington Grubb, has been received.

- 4th. That notwithstanding any resolution re: postponement of extensive work, the Memorial committee be instructed, and are hereby authorized, to proceed with the leveling of the grounds in order that they may present as nice and neat appearance as possible before the date of the approaching Royal visit.
- 5th. That His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught, be invited to unveil the monument on a date convenient to him in the summer of 1915.
- 6th. The financial statement, as adopted, showed the amount of subscriptions, grants, etc., received, including value of lands contributed through the Parks Board, to be \$51,673.95, which, with interests, rents, sale of buildings, etc., makes the total receipts \$61,913.81. Against this has been an expenditure of \$32,963.91, showing a balance on hand of \$28,949.90, of which \$27,227.97 is on call deposit at interest, and \$2,606 deposited on current account—\$1,200 of grants and subscriptions is still to be paid in.

The further estimated expenditure includes \$5,000 for the foundation and cost of laying out of the site, and \$26,000 balance on the contract for the monument.

The memorial committee is to meet to-morrow to give orders regarding the leveling of the ground.

Before adjourning, the president stated that Col. Wilkes and Messrs. F. D. Reville, G. Hatley and others had visited the studio of the sculptor and found that good progress was being made with the monument; that the artist appeared to be putting his whole heart into his work; and that the board could rest assured that the creation of the artist would, when completed, be a masterpiece.

Mr. Cocksbutt further stated that from a conversation he had had on the previous day with Sir Byron E. Walker, who was in touch with the work, he could confirm this impression.
