




The Empress Eugenie treasures a pen made from a quill of a golden eagle's wing, and richly prounted with diamonds and gold, which was used at her request by the fourteen planipotentiaries who signed the Treaty of Paris in 1856. A quill was used by the late Queen Victoria in siging the Commission giving assent to the Commonwealth Bill. At the signing of the Treaty on the conclusion of the war with Spain and America ordinary giulls were used, and among American collectors there was a keen competition to secure the pens in order to augument those they already possessed.
