WAO ON THE IRISH LEAGUE

THE GOVERNMENT TO DRAW A NIGHT REIN IN IRELAND.

The New Coalition Measure the Strongest Ever Proposed in Parliament - The Provisions of the Law Set Forth in a Night Rein in Ireland.

LONDON, March 28. - W. H. Smith, the Government leader, insisted that the Government had decided to ask the House to pass the second reading of the Irish Criminal Law Amendment Bill before proposing the usual Easter holiday.

Mr. Balfour, the Secretary for Ireland, then moved the first reading of the Irish Criminal Law Amendment Bill. In doing so he referred to the terms of Mr. Parrell's amendment.

Mr. Parrell's amendment would give the Irish League the right to obtain further information about the condition of Ireland. Mr. Balfour thought the Parrellites were sufficiently informed of the state of their country, and should recognize the fact that the Government did not rest the case on statistics of agrarian crime.

It takes ten days to perfect a design and produce it in silver after it has been decided. They first make the design in wax. Then it is placed in plaster of Paris and an impression is taken. This is sent to the foundry where it is, of course, in a very rough state, and it requires days to bring out its fine points by filing. This requires very skilled workmen. Then the die is ready to be used. The die is then placed under a large drop-hammer, like a trip-hammer, and the pressing continues until about half of the design is produced. The other half is made in the same way, and the two are soldered together. This also has to be done with great skill. Then it is taken to the chaser, and after that to the finisher and polisher.
