been neglected.







QUEEN-STREET SUBWAY.

The Question of Widening 1t Discusse only important business transacted by the Committee on Works yesterday afternoon was the adoption of a clause in City Engineer's report providing for the widening of the Queen-street subway. widening of the Queen-street subway.

Ald. Gowanlook made a great fight for the West End. He held that the city was in honor bound to make the improvements. When Parkdale came into the city it was part of the agreement that this work should be done. He pointed out the danger that existed at present to those either walking or driving through the death-trap, as he called it.

Ald. Thompson reminded the committee Add. Inomposit relimited the vicinity had been paid \$5000 for land damages, and suggested if the work is gono on with it should be done as a local improvement.






