CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

The lumber market is unchanged. The
dealers report export trade good. The
demand for shingles is slack, and the
market is overstocked. Large quantities
of B. C. shingles were brought in at a very
low rate during December and January
which killed local production, the prices
then ruling being very low. Many dealers
state that hemlock cannot be brought in
at the prices quoted and a profit made
thereon.

Heavy shipments from the Georgian
Bay are being made to all United States
points. The second cargo of lumber ever
brought to the Menominee river from
Canada was unloaded at Marinette, Wis.,
last week. The sawmill of the Algoma
Commercial Co., at Sault Ste. Marie, Ont.,
has just cleaned up all of its cut of the past
six months or more, at an average price
of \$22 a thousand, mill run, buyer to pay
the duty. This lumber goes to Buffalo
and is being shipped.

The imports of lumber from Canada to
Great Britain are increasing. The export
for the past six months as given by the
British Board of Trade shows an increase
in hewn wood of \$50,000 and a decrease in
sawn wood of \$35,000.

In the Ottawa district the Chaudiere
slides are going full blast, immense rafts
of timber being floated down in cribs.
Several rafts have already past through
this year. There is no trouble this year in
putting the timber through the slides,
owing to the improvements made and the
high water. Practically all of the log
drives have been moved off the Dumoine,
Coulouge, Black and Gaineau rivers. It
is estimated there were fully 50 per cent.
more logs taken off the Coulouge this
season than last. This increase is ac-
counted for in part by the fact that all the
logs hung up last year were sent through

safely this season. On some of the
streams the rise of water was four feet,
owing to the heavy rains.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

Prices remain about stationary in
Quebec. The Canadian railroads autho-
rize the announcement that they are
again shipping Canadian rossed and
shaved pulp wood to the United States.
They say that, pressure having been
brought to bear upon the United States
Treasury Department, the special duty of
35 per cent. on Canadian pulp wood has
been withdrawn and they are now accept-
ing shipments of this product as hereto-
fore.

Some heavy sales of lumber as well as
timber limits have been made to Ameri-
cans. A New York syndicate has pur-
chased a tract of 54 miles in the Lake St.
John district where they intend to spend
considerable money in the development of
the property and the manufacture of
lumber for the European market.

In Nova Scotia the reports of the great
forest fires have been followed by re-
ports of rain and good crop. This has
had the effect of causing a better con-
dition in the lumber market. In Cumber-
land alone the lumbermen have lost nearly
half a million dollars. Among the areas
burned are: At River Hebert 15,000
acres of J. Newton Pugsley, and large
tracts of Christie Brothers, and S. B.
Kelly. At Newville, 6,000 acres of the
Newville Lumber Co. 2,000 acres of the
Fox River Lumber Co. At Sand River,
7,000 acres of E. I. White & Son; and at
Shulee a large area. Large gangs of
men were engaged for weeks in endeav-
oring to check the fires, and in many
cases they met with considerable success.

From New Brunswick it is reported
that the lumber market is about station-
ary. Ocean deal freights are still very
low, 35 shillings being the rate hence to
west coast of England. Several steamers
have left St. John and a number of others
about ready to proceed with full cargoes.
The Gibson Company have shipped ten
schooner loads to the American market
and large lots by rail, besides some im-
mense deal shipments to the old country.

It is said that about 35,000,000 feet of
logs are still "hung up" above Grand
Falls on the St. John river, as the rains
have not been heavy enough to bring
them out. In St. John county the loss to
standing timber by forest fires has been
heavy. At one place a thousand acres
were burned over, and while the timber
that is large enough can be cut and
manufactured, the young growth is ruined
for years to come.

MANITOBA AND BRITISH COLUMBIA.

The lumber industry in Manitoba is in a very flourishing condition. The total output of Winnipeg saw mills will be over 10,000,000 feet. Several new mills are going up in the Province. Building operations continue very brisk and the demand for lumber of all kinds is still large.

At the coast stocks are moving actively. The class of lumber most in demand at the present time is clear fir, flooring and siding, spruce and cedar siding, also fir timber. Shingles are slow, while all other lines are active. Dealers report mixed carload orders arriving daily. Stocks of lumber are low, but shingles are heavily stocked at all points on the B. C. coast. No heavy stocks of lumber are held. Prices are likely to remain steady. As previously announced the various saw mills in Vancouver, B. C., and vicinity have determined to make no sales of lumber to local contractors or builders until further notice, because of the carpenters' strike. As a result all work has been stopped on building requiring lumber. The mills will be run as usual, but no lumber is supplied locally. Rail and boat shipments still continue. That is the programme adopted by the mill men. Three months ago logs were scarce and were selling at \$7 and \$8 a thousand, now they are being offered for \$4 and there is no demand at that figure. It is estimated that there are 5,000 loggers working on the coast close to Vancouver. The daily output of the woods at the present time is 5,000,000 feet, with the result that there is an over-production, as the capacity of the mills is one-third less.

Some big deals in timber have been made. One million dollars in cash has been paid to the Dunsmuir estate for 50,000 acres of timber land and it is reported that another large milling plant on the island is under option to an American syndicate.

The request of the loggers of the coast, represented by the B. C. Lumbermen's Association, for permission from the Provincial Government to export logs to the American side was laid before Premier McBride. It was explained to him that on account of not being able to dispose of their logs to local mills, the loggers desired to export, and sought to have the law prohibiting export annulled for a period of six months.

Hon. Mr. McBride informed the deputation that if its desires were placed in a petition the matter would receive earnest consideration. In accordance a petition has been prepared and presented to the government, a reply to which is soon expected.

The loggers at the coast have decided to close down all the camps for forty-five days after August 1st, to provide for a recovery of the now over-crowded market.

UNITED STATES.

There has been some change in market conditions during the past week. Crop conditions having shown an improvement, and the strikes having about died out, the outlook for the lumber trade is brighter. Prices are steady at about former level, although a number of items are somewhat

stronger. Building statistics show a very heavy demand for building material. The second half of the year opened up with a better feeling all around. Shipments have been fully up to the average. Wholesalers of white pine state the demand will absorb practically all the available stock. There is a general feeling of security on the part of those who are handling white pine. At some points trouble is anticipated in keeping full crews of loggers at work. Improvement is noted in the shingle market, although all the coast mills have been shut down, and will continue closed for some time.

North Dakota and Manitoba are calling for large supplies of white pine. In upper Minnesota dimension is extremely scarce. Lumbermen have had to contend with severe strikes in the east, floods in the south and south-west, and drouth in more northern territory, in addition to combined efforts of line yard buyers to break the market. Despite this the market today is in excellent shape.

There is a lull in the hardwood market. Offerings of stock are more numerous than a month ago. Basswood supplies have grown larger and the same can be said of oak, but it is doubtful if the production of poplar, quartered oak and a few other items will be sufficient for the trade this season. Buffalo reports a scarcity of maple and they are trying to fill the deficiency with birch. Prices have seen little or no change. Eastern hemlock continues in great demand and has gone up a point.

Receipts of lumber during last month were large at lake ports. There was received at Bay City 15,599,855 feet and at Saginaw 6,221,305 feet, making a total of 21,821,160 feet for June. The May receipts were 14,148,657 feet.

The Wisconsin valley shipped out a larger amount of lumber than during any previous month with one exception, which shows that the demand for lumber in that section is strong.

The conditions in the wholesale market are good. The demand for lumber in the manufacturing trade such as vehicles, box, furniture, etc., is very active. The heavy forest fires in the north have curtailed operations somewhat at producing sources. The spruce market continues very firm.

GREAT BRITAIN.

In the Liverpool market Canadian wood—wancy board and square pine—have gone fairly well into consumption and prices remain very firm. Wancy pine has arrived freely, values high and stocks are moderate. Square timber—the demand is limited; and the deliveries have been disappointing and the stock chiefly of lower grade. Of red pine there has been a moderate import; the demand is limited and price is firm with a light stock. Oak has been in good request at full values. Elm is in good demand and the import consists chiefly of first-class rock elm. In ash the demand is dull. In New Brunswick and Nova Scotia spruce deals the import has been large, with a good demand. Pine deals are only in limited demand.

At Glasgow there have been no outstanding features of interest. The import

season from the St. Lawrence has opened and deals from Montreal have arrived to an average extent. The import of spruce has kept well up. Prices of pine and spruce are firm, with a rising tendency. The demand for red pine is not extensive. Rock elm is low in stock, but there is an abundance of soft elm.

There seems to be a feeling that prices have reached the highest point, with the result that buyers are naturally inclined to operate with caution. The building trades throughout the United Kingdom are displaying greater activity. The imports so far have been chiefly on contract. Rolling stock manufacturers are prosperous, but the cabinet trade remains in a depressed condition.

STOCKS AND PRICES.

The schooner Baden Powell is loading laths at Musquodoboit for New York.

Schooner Prosperare is loading lumber at Jacksonville, N. B., for Port of Spain.

Steamer Castleventry arrived in St. John, N. B., from Philadelphia to load deals for George McKean.

The steamer Manchester Importer will take on 300 tons of pulp and 600 standards of deals at St. John, N. B., for Manchester.

The steamer City of Belfast sailed from Montreal this week for Bathurst, where she will load a cargo of deals for the United Kingdom.

The ship Sardhana sailed from Baltimore, Md., last week for Montreal, where she will load a cargo of lumber for Adelaide, South Australia.

The Spanish brigantine Sansat, from Havana, arrived in St. John last week, and will load lumber at the Cushing mills for the Canary Islands.

The Norwegian barque Henriette, from Christiansand for Cape Tormentine, N. B., to load lumber, is ashore on Indian Rock, on the Prince Edward Island coast.

The Battle liner Pharsalia sailed from St. John, N. B., with a cargo of deals for Liverpool and Cork. The schooner Wanola is loading laths at Halifax for Philadelphia.

The steamer Cyril is loading deals at St. John, N. B., for the United Kingdom. The steamer Moeris sailed from Quebec, Que., for Liverpool, with a cargo of timber and deals.

Steamers Daventry and Mantinea sailed from St. John last week for Manchester and Brow Head with a cargo of lumber and deals. The schooner Viola which arrived in Halifax last week, will proceed to Miramichi to load laths for New York.

THE BOSTON MARKET.

The situation in spruce lumber shows very little change. The settlement of the labor troubles in Boston has relieved the situation somewhat, as far as new arrivals are concerned, but the demand is very quiet. Prices hold steady: Ten and 12 in. dimensions, \$21; 9 in. and under, \$19; 10 and 12 in. random lengths, 10 feet and up, \$20.50; 2x3, 2x4, 2x5, 2x6, 2x7 and 3x4, 10 feet and up, \$17 to \$17.50; all other randoms, 9 in. and under, 10 feet and up, \$18 to \$18.50; 5 in. and up, merchantable boards, \$17; matched boards, \$18.50 to \$20; out spruce boards, \$13 to \$14; bundle furring, \$17 to \$18.

The market for hemlock lumber is quiet but steady: Boards, 12, 14 and 16 feet stock, \$15 for good eastern; Pennsylvania, No. 1, \$18.50 to \$19.50; No. 2, \$15 to \$16.50.

Hard pine lumber is very quiet, though prices are very firmly held especially for large sizes. The southern mills will accept orders, but will not guarantee early delivery. The quotations are: Large building orders, to arrive, \$28 to \$32; for immediate delivery, from the yards, \$30 to

\$35, according to schedule; floorings, from the yard, heart face, \$26 to \$32; best rift from the yard, \$50 to \$60, according to quality; stepping, \$45 to \$48; sap and seconds, \$35 to \$38; kiln dried, all rail, best quality, \$40 to \$44; sap, \$29 to \$33.

The arrivals of lumber by sea, for the week were two cargoes from the south, with 1,409,703 feet, and two cargoes from the provinces with 237,083 feet lumber.

There is a firm market for western pine lumber, though the demand is

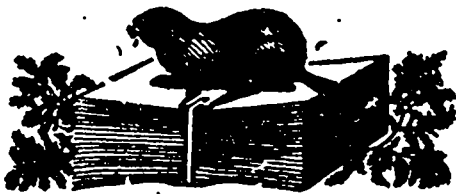
