AMERICAN ALIEN LABOR LEGISLATION. The secret of the obnoxious alien labor laws which the United States is putting in force against foreign countries, and principally against Canada, lies in the fact that the former country is greatly overcrowded in population.

A bulletin just issued by the United States Department of Agriculture is devoted to the employment of convicts in connection with road building. It shows that this method has already been put to a practical test in a number of states. Speaking of the utilization of prison labor in North Carolina, Prof. Holmes, secretary of the Road Association of that state, says: "The result of the experiment in this state has been altogether favorable to the system, both in point of efficiency and economy, and in the health of the convicts."

CAPE COLONY AND PREFERENTIAL TRADE.

Canada's Jubilee presents to the people of the United Kingdom of a preference in our markets has stimulated splendid enthusiasm on the other side of the Atlantic, and may have had some influence in evoking from the Legislature of Cape Colony a proposition which is likely to have some far-reaching consequences. The exact terms of the resolution which it adopted on June 2 last are as follows: "That, in the opinion of this House, the time has arrived when steps should be taken to arrange some basis of commercial union with the Cape Colony."

THE LOCAL IMPROVEMENT SYSTEM.

The City Council will discuss the merits of the local improvement system this afternoon, and also pass upon a scheme which it is proposed to substitute in place of the present system. The local improvement system undoubtedly has its weak points, but it is possible to amend these. The system is right in principle and theory, and we believe it can be made right in practice. Even in its present shape, the system is preferable to the antiquated water system, which some of the aldermen are hounding. Let the local improvement system be given a fair trial before it is discarded. It is this system that has given us many of the fine streets that now beautify the city.

EARLY CLOSING.

The big retail merchants should make an effort to curtail shopping hours during July and August. The T. Eaton Company announce that they will close at 5 o'clock every day during these months and at 1 on Saturdays. The retail trade is now in the hands of a comparatively small number of firms.

It only requires two or three of these to adopt the early closing idea and the rest will either follow the example voluntarily or will be obliged to follow it through force of public opinion. No trade will be lost to anyone if early closing is generally adopted. On the other hand, early closing will be highly appreciated by the thousands of clerks who are engaged in the big stores, and the public generally are in favor of the movement. One hour can easily be spared from the shopping day, which extends at present from 8 till 6 o'clock. No public inconvenience whatever would accrue from locking up the stores at 5 instead of 6 o'clock. The public is anxiously waiting, no less than the clerks, to see which firm is next going to declare in favor of early closing and the Saturday half-holiday.

THE UNITED STATES TARIFF New Brunswick Lumber Goes in Free WHEN AMERICANS OWN IT

But it Must be Out by Citizens of the United States. Goods Cannot Come in Except Under Treaty Unless by American Vessels of the Country Producing Such Goods.

Washington, July 3.—When the Senate met to-day, there was little evidence that the close of the long and arduous tariff debate was near at hand. The attendance in the galleries was no greater than usual, and the opening of the day's session was considerably less than a quorum of Senators present.

House section 17 was restored, providing that no goods shall be imported unless in cases provided for by treaty, except in vessels of the United States, or in such foreign vessels as belong to citizens of the country producing such goods.

Mr. Allison presented the new amendment proposing stamp taxes on bonds, debentures, certificates of stock, etc. It was very voluminous and Mr. Allison explained by saying that while formal in appearance, it was in reality simply providing a stamp tax of 5 cents on every \$100 of debentures, etc., and 2 cents on every \$100 of transfer of stock, etc.
