VERY FEW ARRIVALS FOR THE SESSION

Opening of Parliament Will be Witnessed by Large Crowds.

Different Opinions as to Length of the Meeting—Both Speakers Are on Deck and Are Getting the Messengers and Pages in Order—General News From Ottawa.

Ottawa, Feb. 1.—(Special).—Although only two days from the opening of Parliament no more than a dozen Senators and members have arrived.

The attendance of the public at the opening promises to be very large, applications for tickets being far in excess of the seating capacity of the Senate chamber.

As a result of the session of Parliament which the members will be away by May 24, while Mr. P. J. Davis, who ought to be a better judge, thinks the session should be a long and exciting one.

Everything around the House of Commons and Senate is in readiness for the opening. The speakers of both Houses have arrived, and are arranging the staff and Speaker Pelee's quarters have been thoroughly renovated and greatly improved in appearance by the Public Works Department during recess.

An empty speech. To be brief, the speech will contain nothing. The compliment has been paid to Senator Tupper, the recent appointee from British Columbia, of inviting him to move the speech from the Throne in the Senate, but he may not be in time to do so.

Mr. Massey, C.E., Mr. Adgate and Mr. Dunn spent most of the day to-day in Hall, examining the approaches to the proposed Nepesee Point bridge. It is expected work will begin on this bridge next week.

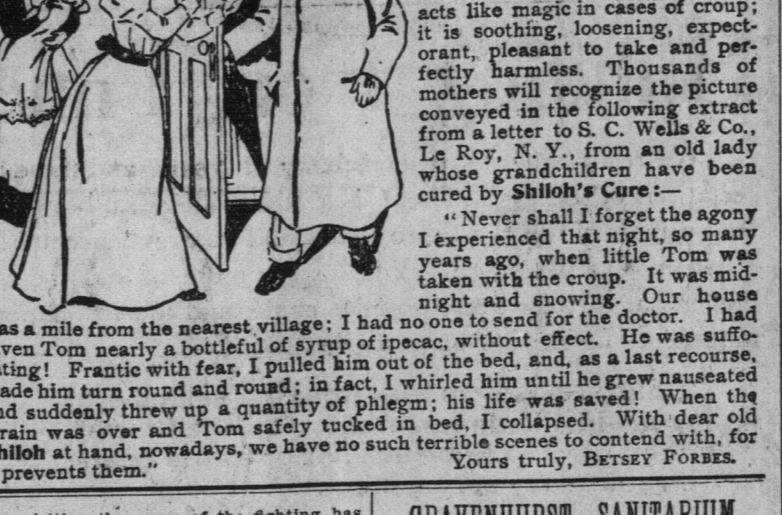

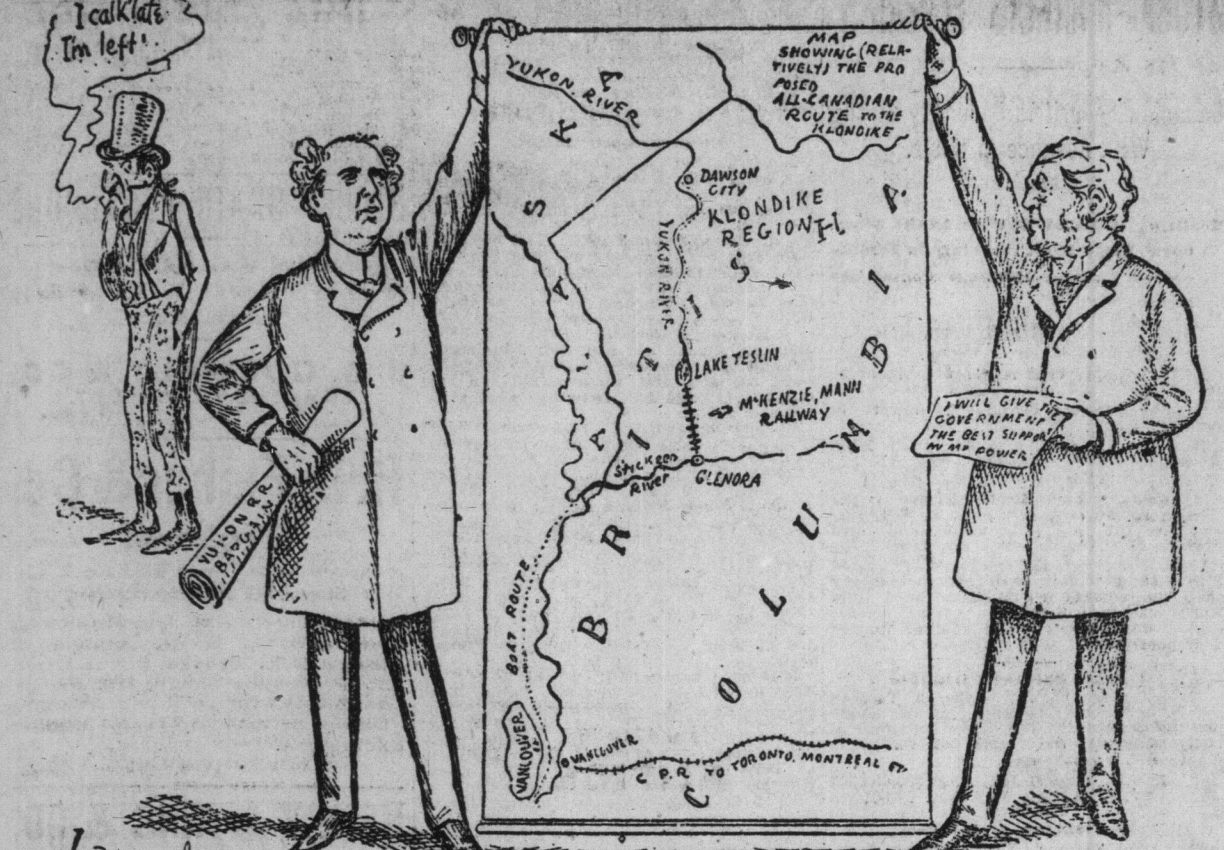
