CONDENSED REPORT

OF THE

SEVENTH ANNUAL MEETING

OF THE

CANADA CONGREGATIONAL WOMAN'S BOARD OF MISSIONS.

BOND ST. CHURCH, TORONTO, May 31st, 1893.

The meeting was called to order at 10 a.m. by Mrs. Ashdown, of Toronto, who stated that the President, Mrs. Macallum, was prevented from being with them by a two-fold reason—the continued illness of her daughter and a painful accident to herself.

Mrs. Williams, of Montreal, Treasurer of the Board, was asked to act as President of the meeting, to which she kindly agreed.

The meeting was then opened by singing, "All hail the power of Jesus' name," followed by reading of the Scriptures and prayer, led by Mrs. Laird, of Toronto. After the devotional exercises the business of the meeting was commenced by appointing Miss Annie Foggin as Minute Secretary.

The following committees (formed on the plan of selecting, as nearly as possible, one lady from each Branch), were then appointed :

Nominating.—Miss Richardson, Montreal, Convener; Mrs. Scott, Toronto Branch; Mrs. Graham, Listowel Branch; Mrs. Macdougall, Ottawa Branch; Miss Bertha Skinner, Guelph Branch; Mrs. Dr. Gurd, Montreal.

Resolutions.—Mrs. Barker, Toronto Branch, Convener; Mrs. Garlick, Montreal; Mrs. Watson, Listowel Branch; Mrs. B. B. Williams, Guelph Branch.

Finance.—Mrs. E. F. M. Williams, Montreal, Convener; Miss Hattie Clark, Toronto Branch.

On motion of Mrs. Gurd, seconded by Mrs. Roberts, these reports were adopted.

An informal discussion then followed on the desirability of visits between sister Auxiliaries, reference being made to two or three visits in the past year which had been occasions of pleasure and profit to those interested.

On motion of Mrs. Ashdown, a message of sympathy was sent to Mrs. Macallum; also, on motion by Mrs. John Burton, the Secretary was instructed to write a letter of condolence to Mr. and Mrs. W. F. Clarke, of Guelph. The devotional hour followed, led by Mrs. B. B. Williams, of Guelph. Many of the members took part; and special petitions were offered for the absent President, and for the bereaved home in Guelph; also for Mr. Currie and the two new missionaries going out to Africa. The meeting then adjourned for luncheon.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON.

The meeting was opened at 2 o'clock by singing and prayer. The roll was then called by the Secretary, showing sixty-two delegates in attendance. The acting President then introduced to the meeting Miss Lyman, of Bombay, who was cordially welcomed by the delegates, Mrs. Williams promising an address from her at a later stage of the meeting.

Mrs. Ashdown, of Toronto, then gave the address of welcome, which was replied to by Mrs. S. L. Mitchell, of Sherbrooke, Que. Words of cordial greeting were spoken by Miss Carty, for the Methodist Woman's Missionary Society; also by Mrs. Gray, of Brampton, for the W. F. M. S. of the Presbyterian Church, which the meeting acknowledged by singing, "Blest be the tie that binds."

Mrs. Nasmith, Toronto, Corresponding Secretary, read her report, which showed a total of 59 Societies in connection with the Board, viz.: 41 Auxiliaries, 4 Young Women's Auxiliaries, and 14 Mission Bands. Miss Foggin, Superintendent of Missionary Correspondence, next read her report. Mrs. Powter presented the Auditor's report. All of these reports were, on motion, adopted. Mrs. Dr. Ball then took the chair, while Mrs. Williams read the Financial Statement. This statement showed the receipts of the past year to have been \$1,779.38, and was also adopted.

Miss May Flower, of Toronto, sang a solo with much acceptance. Miss Hattie Clark presented the report of the Literature Department, and Mrs. Moodie that of the Department of Organization for Quebec, referring particularly to the formation of the Quebec Provincial Branch.

These reports were adopted. At this point Mrs. Boult gave the following notice of motion: "I hereby give notice that at the proper time I will move that the word 'day's' before the word 'notice' in Article VII. of the Constitution be changed to 'year's.'"

Mrs. Freeland, of Bowmanville, then read an interesting and instructive paper on "Canadian Home Missions." A vote of thanks was accorded her for the paper, and the hope expressed that it might be published in the *Independent*. Miss Lyman then gave a sketch of "A Day's Work in the Mission Field." She exhibited views of India, also some curios, and articles made by the children in the Parel School. The meeting was closed by prayer.

THURSDAY MORNING, JUNE 1.

The meeting was opened by devotional exercises, Mrs. Garlick leading in prayer. The minutes of the preceding meeting were confirmed.

The Secretary read a telegram from Miss Melville, Boston, conveying her greetings. Reports were then given from the following, there not having been time on the previous day to hear them :

Paris Branch, by Miss Paton; Guelph Branch, by Miss Skinner; Bowmanville Auxiliary, by Mrs. Freeland; Rugby Auxiliary, read by the Secretary; Portage la Prairie, read by the Secretary. In the absence of Miss Rawlings, Organizer for Ontario, the Secretary read her report. All of these reports were, on motion, adopted.

Mrs. (Rev.) John Morton, of Hamilton, was asked to sit as an honorary member. Mrs. Powter then presented the report of the Business Committee; each item of which was considered separately, and adopted as follows:

I. That Miss Lyman, Miss Melville and Miss Johnston be supported by the Board for the coming year.

II. That 2,000 reports be printed and supplied, as heretofore, free of charge to the Auxiliaries, who are asked to pay the postage on said reports.

III. That a summary of the Annual Report be published in the Year Book for 1893-4.

IV. That the Literature Department receive the usual grant of \$20.

V. That the Auxiliaries be requested to send their Auxiliary fee of \$10 to the Treasurer before sending any designated money.

VI. That we recommend the Auxiliaries to take up the usual Thank-offering as near Thanksgiving Day as possible.

VII. That the question be considered of altering Article VII. of the Constitution so that the word "day's" before the word "notice" may read "year's." After some explanation from Mrs. Boult the motion was carried unanimously.

Miss Beresford sang very sweetly "Cast thy bread upon the waters." A telegram was ordered to be sent to Miss Melville in response to hers received in the morning, informing her that she and Miss Johnston were to be supported by the Board. An invitation was received by the Board from Quebec Provincial Branch for 1894, naming Emanuel Church, Montreal, as the place of meeting. The invitation was accepted with thanks. Mrs. Watson, of Wingham, then conducted a Memorial Service for Miss Clarke, of Guelph, news of whose death at her post in Cisamba, W. C. Africa, had been received in Montreal on May 26. During the service Mrs. Boult, of Guelph, gave a sketch of Miss Clarke's life, and also read letters from her fellow-missionaries, giving the sad particulars of her illness, death and burial. Several took part in this impressive service.

The Convention then adjourned for luncheon, which was provided, as on the previous day, in the basement of the church.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON.

The Convention re-assembled at 2 o'clock. After the opening exercises and reading of minutes, Miss Richardson, of Montreal, presented the Report of the Nominating Committee as follows:

President, Mrs. Macallum; Vice-President at Large, Mrs. Freeland; Vice-Presidents, the Presidents of Branches; Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. Nasmith; Treasurer, Mrs. Williams; Superintendents of Missionary Literature, Miss Edith Clark for Ontario, Mrs. Moodie for Quebec; Superintendents of Organization, Miss Rawlings for Ontario, Miss Dougall for Quebec; Superintendent of Missionary

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Correspondence, Miss Foggin; Auditors, Mrs. Powter, Mrs. Dr. Gurd. Each item of this report was considered separately, and unanimously adopted.

Mrs. Barker, on behalf of the Resolution Committee, reported as follows:

I. We beg to record, with thankfulness to God, all that our loved President, Mrs. Macallum, and her family have been enabled to do for the cause of missions; we rejoice that she is so far recovered from her accident, and trust that, with us, she may realize that whatever trials are yet to come they will be among the "all things" that "work together for good."

II. While we mourn over the removal from earth of our dear missionary, Miss Clarke, we rejoice that two more missionaries are now on their way accompanying Mr. Currie to the field.

III. Deeply sensible of the need of missionaries, your Committee feel that unless the necessary funds are forthcoming the work will be crippled. We therefore urge upon our Auxiliaries more strenuous efforts, that we may accomplish greater things for the love of Christ.

IV. While we feel strongly about the foreign field, we do not forget the claims at home; and knowing the demands on our Home Missionary Society to be great, we urge upon our Auxiliaries not to relax their efforts in this direction. We advise that all contributions be sent through the Woman's Board.

V. That the C. C. W. B. M. in Convention assembled have heard with surprise and regret that the Decennial Missionary Conference, which met in Bombay during the past winter, objected to resolutions condemning the legalized traffic in liquor and opium, and the licensing of impurity: therefore, *Resolved*, That we express our sorrow at the course of the Conference, and the earnest hope that this false step may be overruled for the glory of God. We request the Secretary to send a copy of this resolution to the presiding officer of the Conference. VI. That we heartily thank our worthy Treasurer for her valuable services in so ably filling the place of our President during this Convention.

VII. That we also tender our thanks to the officers of this church for so kindly granting us the use of their building for our meetings.

VIII. That we gratefully acknowledge the hospitality of those who have received us into their homes, also the kindness of those who have had charge of the refreshments, and the valuable services of the organist and choir.

Mrs. Nasmith, for the Credentials Committee, reported that there were sixty-two members present, several of whom, however, were not entitled to vote on account of their Societies not having paid the Auxiliary fee.

Brief papers, Entitled "Morning Calls at Mission Stations" were then read by the following ladies: Mrs. Dr. Gurd whose "call" was at Guadajara, Mexico, and Miss Hattie Clark, who sketched Cisamba The proposed "call" at Smyrna was unavoidably omitted.

Mrs. Currie exhibited a number of African curiosities brought from Cisamba by her son, Rev. Walter T. Currie.

Three-minute sketches of the following missionaries were then given :

1. Miss Emily Macallum, Smyrnå, given extempore by Mrs. Williams, Montreal. 2. Mrs. Fred. Macallum, of Erzroom, prepared by Mrs. Stewart, of Newmarket, and read in her absence by Miss Skinner. 3. Mrs. Edna M. Watkins, written by Miss Parker, read by Mrs. Powter. 4. Mrs. Agnes Carter Lee, written by Mrs. Main, read by Mrs. Mitchell. 5. Mrs. Annie Williams Read, given by Mrs. Moodie.

The "Question Box" was conducted by Mrs. Williams. The question of a leaflet having again been raised, it was decided to authorize the Executive to publish one if it could be done without entailing expense upon the Board.

The report of the Finance Committee, as far as completed, was given by Mrs. Williams.

After singing and prayer, the Convention adjourned.

PUBLIC MEETING: THURSDAY EVENING.

Rev. Dr. Wild occupied the chair, and Rev. Dr. Ball conducted the opening exercises. Miss Lyman gave an interesting talk on the dress, manners, customs, etc., of the women among whom she laboured.

Mrs. F. A. Steven, of the China Inland Mission, gave an earnest address on "Our Responsibilities in connection with Mission Work." The organist and choir of the church rendered several anthems very acceptably. After the usual votes of thanks the meeting was closed by prayer and the Doxology.

EXTRACTS FROM OFFICIAL REPORTS.

MRS. J. D. NASMITH, Corresponding Secretary :

"In the work at home there is not much change to report. We have had a slight increase in the number of Auxiliaries and Mission Bands, and a corresponding falling off in the number of Young Women's Auxiliaries. Our total number of Societies, as far as reported, is, at the present date, 59, viz.: 41 Auxiliaries, 4 Young Women's Societies, and 14 Mission Bands. We have been enabled to form one new Branch in Ontario—the Paris Branch—and are confidently looking forward to other churches organizing Auxiliaries and forming Branches in the near future. In Quebec, the different Auxiliaries have organized themselves into the Quebec Provincial Branch, feeling that by doing so they will increase mission interest among the Auxiliaries and band them more closely together for united work. Besides this, we welcome a Branch from Nova Scotia, to be called the Queen's Co. Branch. . . . As regards our work and workers in the foreign field, we had hoped that Miss Lyman would ere this have been granted the desire of her own heart to return and labour among those she had learned to love in Bombay. It has been otherwise ordered, and she is still in the home land. . . . The sad news that our own special African missionary . . . had been taken from her work to her reward came as a heavy blow to us, and yet we would not forget that He who was our Lord and hers makes no mistakes, and though we with our finite vision cannot see the end from the beginning, yet He knoweth and "doeth all things well." We rejoice in the return of our friend Mr. Currie to his field of labour, and have an additional joy that two accompany him from our midst—Miss Melville, of Olivet Church Toronto, and Miss Johnston, of Brandon, Manitoba.

MISS RAWLINGS, Organizer for Ontario:

Miss Rawlings reports visits as follows: In October, '92, visits to Toronto Branch, quarterly meeting; Hope Church, where an Auxiliary was organized soon afterwards; Guelph Branch, quarterly meeting, at Garafraxa, resulting in the re-organization of Garafraxa Auxiliary, and the organizing of Guelph Mission Band; Burford, Auxiliary organized; New Durham, and Brantford. In November, Miss Rawlings visited London and organized the London Auxiliary. The Paris Branch was organized in April, 1893. Miss Rawlings sums up her report in these words: "This year I have travelled more miles, visited more churches, spoken at a larger number of meetings, and had more correspondence with workers in the churches than ever before. My expenses also have been better met."

MISS FOGGIN, Department Missionary Letters :

Miss Foggin reports 195 copies of letters sent to about 60 Auxiliaries, and also to several churches that have no Auxiliaries; 2 letters were received from Miss Clarke, 1 from Mrs. Read, and (through the kindness of our President) 2 from Miss Macallum. The copies of the letters are welcomed by the Auxiliaries and used by them in the meetings.

CONSTITUTION

OF THE

Canada Congregational Woman's Board of Missions.

(Revised Jupe, 1890.)

I. NAME.

This Society shall be called, "The Canada Congregational Woman's Board of Missions," and shall co-operate with the Canada Congregational Missionary Society and the Canada Congregational Foreign Missionary Society.

II. OBJECT.

Its object shall be the cultivation of a missionary spirit, and the raising of funds for carrying on missionary work in the Home and Foreign Fields.

III. MEMBERSHIP.

Any lady may become a member of this Board by contributing to its funds one dollar a year; or a life member by payment of twenty-five dollars at one time.

It shall be understood that the object to which these fees are to be devoted shall not be determined by the donors, but shall be left to the Board.

IV. OFFICERS.

The Officers of this Society shall be a President, a Vice-President at Large, Vice-Presidents (who are Presidents of Branches), a Corresponding Secretary and a Treasurer.

The President, the Corresponding Secretary and the Treasurer shall form a subcommittee to decide questions of urgency, subject to the approval of the Board. The Officers and Superintendents of Departments shall form an executive committee to arrange for the Annual Meeting.

V. BRANCHES.

The Auxiliary Societies shall, as far as possible, be organized into Branches, each of which shall have its President and Vice-Presidents, a Secretary and a Treasurer, to be elected annually. Each Branch shall report, semi-annually, to the General Board, and its officers shall be *ex-officio* members of the General Board.

VI. AUXILIARIES.

Section A. Any number of ladies organized into a Missionary Society, may become auxiliary to the Board by the payment of ten dollars, undesignated, annually. Each Auxiliary Society shall be entitled to be represented at the Annual Meeting by one delegate for each ten dollars contributed to the Treasury. Section B. Any Association of Young People banded together to aid the Canada Congregational Woman's Board of Missions may be auxiliary to the General Society, by paying to the General Fund at least \$5 annually.

Each Mission Band shall be entitled to send one delegate to the Annual Meeting of the Board, and is desired to select an appropriate name and report the same to the Society to which its money is sent.

VII. AMENDMENT.

This Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the delegates present at any Annual Meeting, provided one year's notice has been given in writing.

VIII. ANNUAL MEETING.

The Annual Meeting shall be held at such time and place as shall, from year to year, be determined by the Society.

BY - LAWS.

I. The expenses of the President, Secretary, and Treasurer incurred in travelling to and from the Annual Meeting, shall be paid by the General Board.

II. The Treasurer shall pay no moneys except by order of the President and Secretary of the Board.

CONSTITUTION FOR BRANCHES.

I. This Association of Auxiliary Societies shall be called the ——— Branch of the Canada Congregational Woman's Board of Missions.

II. Its object shall be to band together neighbouring Societies, and to excite a greater interest in the work by the use of all suitable means, and especially by arranging for union meetings of the Missionary Societies as often as practicable.

III. The officers of the Branch shall be a President, Vice-Presidents (who shall be Presidents of the Auxiliaries), a Secretary and a Treasurer. These officers are *ex-officio* members of the General Board.

IV. The duty of the Secretary shall be to secure semi-annual reports from the Auxiliaries, and to forward such reports in condensed form to the Corresponding Secretary of the Board. The Treasurer shall, in like manner, receive semi-annually the contributions from the Auxiliaries and transmit them to the General Treasurer.

V. The Annual Meeting shall be held at such time and place as shall be agreed on by the officers.

CONSTITUTION FOR AUXILIARIES.

(OPTIONAL.)

I. This Society shall be called the ———— Auxiliary of the Canada Congregational Woman's Board of Missions.

II. The object of this Society shall be the cultivation of a missionary spirit and the collection of money for missionary purposes.

III. The officers of this Society shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer, who shall be elected annually.

IV. Any person may become a member of this Society by the payment of ——— cents weekly.

V. Money raised by this Auxiliary for the Board may be appropriated to the Home and Foreign Work in such proportions as may by deemed desirable by the said Auxiliary.

VI. This Auxiliary shall report quarterly to the Secretary and Treasurer of the Branch with which it is connected.

CONSTITUTION FOR MISSION BANDS.

(OPTIONAL.)

I. This Association of Young People banded together to aid the Canada Congregational Woman's Board of Missions shall be called ———— and is Auxiliary to the General Society, agreeing to pay not less than \$5 annually to the General Fund.

II. Anyone may become a member of the Band on payment of ——— cents a week.

III. The officers of the Band shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer, to be elected annually.

IV. The duty of the President shall be to preside at all stated meetings, and to have a general oversight of the work of the Band.

V. The duty of the Secretary shall be to keep a record of the proceedings of the Band, and to make an annual report to the Missionary Society to which it is Auxiliary.

VI. The Treasurer shall receive and hold all funds, paying the same quarterly to the Treasurer of the Society to which the Band is auxiliary, or to the Treasurer of the Branch.

VII. By the Constitution of the Canada Congregational Woman's Board of Missions the Band is entitled to send one delegate to the Annual Meeting.
