Quarken, opposite, Umeno, a new light house has been creeted near the old one, which is lighted with coals in covered lanterns. The height of the tower is 50 feet above the ground, and the light is about \$35 feet above the level of the sea, consequently, this light ought to be visible from the deck of a merchant vessel at about three Cerman miles distance at sea.

A light house of the same height has been erected on the Great Jungirant, which island is situate three miles south east of Soderhamu, and in this the lighting is of the same description as at Holma Gadder. The tower is crected due east of the Fisherman's Chapel on the high ridge, which is to the eastward of the Island, in north lat. 61 deg. 9 sec 20m. and lon east of Ferro 35 deg 20 sec.
