WAS IT ALCOHOL OR OPIUM

THAT CAUSED THE DEATH OF JOHN LANE SMITHSON 9

ctors Cannot Tell, and An Analysis of the Stomach of Deceased May Be Made To Determine Whether He Was Given "Knock-Out" Drops, as His Relatives Firmly Believe.

John Lane Smithson came to his death from narcotic poisoning, but whether opium or alcohol the coroner's jury were last night unable to determine upon the evidence submitted to them. The medical men who conducted the post-mortem examination were satisfied that poison caused his death, but just the nature of that poison could not be established without making an analysis

of the contents of the stomach.

The first witness called was Alfred Russell, bartender at the Schiller House. At 10.30 Monday evening deceased was brought to their hotel by a young man, who said he was a nephew of deceased. Smithson was put to bed, and arosa Tuesday morning about 6.30, and appeared to be all right. Deceased and Pearson came in again about 5 o'clock Thesday evening and had a drink together. Deceased appeared to be partially asteep or in a dazed condition. Later he saw the nephew of deceased and Pearson trying to awaken deceased, whose head was resting on a table in the sitting-room. Their efforts proved futile, and deceased was sent home in a cab in company with his nephew. He only had two drinks in the Schiller House.

Some words passed between the two when Pearson went into the charroom and got deceased a drink of something, Smithson walked across the room while Pearson was taking the glasses back to the barroom. He walked very steadily. Smithson wrote something on a paper and handed it to Pearson, who walked out. Almost immediately after Pearson's departure Smithson laid his head on the table and began to snore very heavily and soon afterwards fell into a heavy, sleep, from which he could not be roused. James Pearson, 99 Trinity-street, the companion of Smithson during Tuesday, was put through a long course of questioning by Crown Attorney Dewart. Their movements during the day were traced and corroborated the evidence of Gimblet given the previous evening. When the two went to the Schiller House between 4 and 5 o'clock, Tuesday, afternoon, deceased appeared to be almost sober. They had two drinks together at the bar of the Schiller House, Smithson taking ginger beer. They went into the sitting-room, and witness, at the request of deceased, went back to the bar-room and got deceased another drink. When witness brought this drink into the sitting-room deceased was in the lavatory. Witness placed the glass on the table

drinks at the bar, and showed no signs of stuper when witness left for Bolton-avelue. He did not hear that Smithson was dead until Tuesday morning.

Result of the Post-Mortem.

Dr. John Caven, who in conjunction with Drs. Burgess and Rowan conducted the post mortem, read the report of their investigation. They could not arrive at any accurate decision as to the cause of death, but it was caused by either opium or alcoholic poisoning. The general con-



THE TRADE:

To protest against the new regulation compelling drovers and dealers to separate the hogs, milch cows and calves from the cattle and have them placed in the annex to the cattle market, a deputation of drovers and cattle dealers waited upon the Mayor yesterday morning. With the deputation were: Cornelius Flannigan, Joseph Wflson, William Lunness, John Hobson, J. B. Shields, Thomas Maclean, John Hamilton, T. O. Robson, president of the Dominion Live Scotch Association; John Halliday, W. J. Maclennan and others. Ald. Dunn, Sheppard, Frankland and Thompson were also present.

Mr. Flannigan, in speaking for the delegates, said it would be a penalty on shippers to divide their mixed consignments, having bullocks and sheep placed on the main market and milch cows, calves and hogs removed to the annex. It would cause annoyance and inconvenience, and might eventually lead to mixed shipments being carried past Toronto. The Grand Trunk Railway, he said, were charging \$2 a car extra for taking the hogs over to the annex.

The Application of Electricity to Commercial Chemistry.

Electrical processes are coming to be applied more and more in chemical operations, particularly in Germany and France, where electro-chemistry is growing rapidly in favor, both as a branch of theoretical study, and as a factor in chemical manufacture. Besides the electrolytic disinfecting process already mentioned several times in this column, processes have recently been perfected for the production, by electrical decomposition, of soda, chlorate of potash, sulfuric acid, and bleaching materials, and for the electrolytic purification of dyes. There are evidences, too, that American chemists do not intend to allow foreigners to reap all the honors and rewards in this new and promising field.
