MINUTES OF MEETING

OF THE

HOME MISSION COMMITTEE

(WESTERN SECTION,)

OF THE

PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN CANADA,

TÓRONTO, 30th AND 31st MARCH, AND 1st APRIL, 1880.

AT TORONTO, and within the Deacons' Court Room of Knox Church there, on Tuesday, the 30th day of March, 1880, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, the Home Mission Committee (Western Section) of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, met and was constituted with prayer. Rev. W. Cochrane, D.D., Convener. The Committee continued in session till 3 a.m on Friday, 2nd April.

From which have to be deducted the contributions yet to be received before the closing of the Treasurer's books on the 30th of April.

GRANTS FROM BRITISH CHURCHES.

The Convener reported that there had been received and suitably acknowledged the following grants:—£250 from the Free Church of Scotland for the general work of the Committee; £150 from the same Church, and £100 from the Presbyterian Church of Ireland towards the maintenance of the Manitoba College.

In view of these grants to Manitoba College, and in view of the great desirability of cancelling the large indebtedness of the Home Mission Fund, the Committee resolved to apply to the General Assembly to reduce by the amount of these grants (£250) for the present year the obligations of this Committee to Manitoba College, provided that from these and other sources the \$3,400 required for Professors' salaries be raised.

SAULT STE. MARIE.

The Rev. J. R. McLeod having intimated his desire to withdraw from this field at the expiry of his term of engagement in May, it was agreed to appoint Mr. Wm. Gallagher as his successor for two years at a salary of \$700 per annum and travelling expenses to the field, on condition that the congregation contribute at least \$250 per annum, and in the hope that they may at once increase this amount to \$300 per annum.

MANITOBA.

SECTION B. CANADA PACIFIC RAILWAY.

The Sub-Committee reported that they had secured the services for two years, from 15th January, 1880, of Mr. W. D. Russell for Section B. Canada Pacific Railway, at a salary of \$1000 per annum and travelling expenses to the field,—the whole amount to be paid by the men on the line. The Sub-Committee further reported that, at their request, Mr. Russell had been ordained by the Presbytery of Montreal, before proceeding to his field of labour.

The report was received, and the action of the Sub-Committee approved.

CHURCH OF SCOTLAND AID.

There was laid on the table and read correspondence between the Colonial Committee of the Church of Scotland and the Convener anent assistance in carrying on the work in Manitoba.

The action of the Convener was sustained.

RECOMMENDATION TO THE ASSEMBLY.

It was agreed in the Annual Report of the Committee to direct the special attention of the General Assembly to the growing magnitude and need of the work in the North West, and the necessity of adopting such means as will tend most effectually to draw out the liberality of the Church in Canada and also in Great Britain on behalf of that work.

RE-ENGAGEMENT OF MISSIONARIES.

The Presbytery of Manitoba recommended the re-engagement of all the Missionaries whose term of service expires at this date.

The Committee agreed to re-appoint the following for one year from this date at the usual salary, viz., \$900 for married and \$700 for unmarried men:—

Rev. J. Scott, to Emerson, &c., the people paying at least \$600 per annum.

"J. S. Stewart, to Upper Little Saskatchewan, the people paying at least \$300 per annum.

S. Donaldson, to Poplar Heights, the people paying at least \$213 per annum.
S. Polson, to Pointe des Chenes, the people paying at least \$250 per annum.
J. Duncan, to Prince Albert, the people paying at least \$300 per annum—the salary of Mr. Duncan to be \$900 per annum.

APPOINTMENT OF ADDITIONAL MISSIONARIES.

At the request of the Presbytery the following appointments to Manitoba were made, each appointment to date from 1st April, 1880:

Rev. D. McRae for one year, at a salary of \$700 per annum. Mr. D. McGregor, for six months, at a salary of \$500 per annum.

Mr. C. M. Copeland, for six months, with a grant of \$4.00 per Sabbath, in addition to the contributions of the field.

Mr. J. Lawrence, for six months, with a grant of \$2.00 per Sabbath, in addition to the contributions of the field.

The Committee further agreed to appoint Rev. James Hastie, of Lindsay, Ont., to Manitoba for three years, at a salary of \$900 per annum, with an allowance of \$200 for travelling expenses to the field.
