SHAMROCK AFFAIR—Thos. Doherty, an elderly man, residing at Ross, near Charlottetown, was fatally stricken Tuesday by a young man named Keoghian. A deep gash was cut in his throat and he died at the back of his neck. It is reported he is dead. A row about a dog was the cause of the quarrel.

PROVINCIAL APPOINTMENTS—His Honor the Lieutenant Governor has been pleased to make the following appointments: The Honorable William Fungley to be a Commissioner of the Lunatic Asylum, in the room of Robert J. Legare, resigned. Gordon Livingston to be registrar of probates in the county of Kent.

He had walked from St. John to Moncton and announced his intention of returning to the States to see his daughter, who lived some miles around Boston. He was allowed to go.

A BOY DIES—Monday evening about 10 o'clock Mr. P. Jack found a pocket book in the station. It contained a large roll of what appeared to be the fifty here, but on investigation it was found that three one dollar bills were enclosed. A large sum of money was found. The pocket book had been dropped by a young lady who had been around Boston. He was allowed to go.

THE TUNNY CATCH—The house and barn of Richard Milton at Turle Creek, Albert county, was totally destroyed by fire on Tuesday last. The loss was about \$10,000. Mr. Milton was in the woods and did not see the fire until it was too late. Nothing was saved but the loss, about \$1,000, was covered by insurance. The fire is supposed to have been caused by a defective fire.

We understand that the work of improvement will be commenced immediately. A large amount of money will have to be expended in rebuilding what railway lines and in general repairs on the mill. It is said that it is the intention to purchase to cut 2 millions of lumber yearly. Mr. Prince's mill will have charge of the business—Maple Leaf.

Victoria Division, New Brunswick and Union Lodge, N. of P. formed in procession at their Castle Hall, at 2:20 p. m., and proceeded by a parade filled with floral decorations and flags. The funeral home, through George, Pittmore, Charlotte, Union and Waterloo streets to the C. E. burial ground and real cemetery, there to decorate the graves of their deceased brethren. The battalion marched in line, and the accuracy and precision of their movements won the admiration of the thousands of spectators who lined the streets and sidewalks along the route. The day has been set apart as Memorial Day by the Supreme Lodge of the world and will, therefore, be the occasion of an annual parade of the Knights of St. John.

CRIME IN BERTHOOD—Of the trial and acquittal of Edward and James Alexander, for a murderous, cowardly and brutal attack on Dr. Daly at Campbellton a few weeks since, the Clatham World says—

It was proved that the prisoners committed the assault, and also proved that they were in the company of their family at the time the assault was committed. The jury could not find them guilty and not guilty, and under the compelling influence of Mr. Barre's fine eloquence found them not guilty. It did not occur to them perhaps, that they might compromise this matter by finding one of the brothers guilty and the other not guilty. Dr. Daly, who was well acquainted with the prisoners, recognized them, called them by name, and heard them call each other by name. He could not have been mistaken. Not could the relatives who were to the presence of the brothers at another place at the time of the assault have been mistaken. There was no mistake probably in either case. So the jury, having to choose a side, took that of the natives against the new comers, though Judge Wikison, who was evidently convinced of the prisoners' guilt, charged strongly the other way.
