Visitors pass up a broad flight of steps to the main entrance and through the main doors into a vestibule 12x12 feet, then through a pair of doors similar to those at the entrance, when they are in the main building. In the center of the building is an unadorned awl-wood covered area 157-50 feet, with a central height of 45 feet to the base of the lantern tower.

The second floor promenade is of the same general dimensions as that of the ground floor. The most striking feature of the interior are the arches supporting the roof, which spring from the inner edge of the promenade and are relieved by substantial wire cables and chandeliering of some timber with supporting struts, the whole effect, with its regular curvature, interestingly and ably giving assurance of strength and durability.

The materials used in the construction of the building are of good quality, and the workmanship is also good. The promenade are all laid with fine dried grooved and tongued and planed spruce flooring; the doors are paneled and moulded. The visitor is impressed on examining the structure with the thought that nothing has been done in its designing and construction, the aim has been to have the best building procurable for a reasonable, but sufficient expenditure.
