SUBMARINES AND THIRT

GERMAN PIRATES SEND THREE SHIPS TO BOTTOM

Admiralty Announces Loss of the Tangistan, Blackwood and Princess Victoria — One of Crew of 38 on the Tangistan Escaped -Raiders Operating at Widely Separated Points — Three Steamers Sent to Bottom Within Nine Hours.

London, Mar. 10.—During the early hours of Tuesday morning German submarines made their presence known at three widely separated floints on the British coast, and, it is stated officially, without giving warning to their crews, sank three British merchantships.

In one case, that of the steamer Tangistan, which was torpedeed off Scarborough, in the North Sea, 37 men of her crew of 38 are missing. Only one man from the vessel was picked up, he by a passing ship. The stack which sent the Tangistan to the bottom was made half an hour after midnight.

At six o'clock in the morning another submarine sank the steamer Blackwood, off Hastings in the English Channel, while a third submerbible sank the steamer Princess Victoria off Liverpool at a quarter past nine o'clock.

The news of the latest exploits of the German submarines came as the British public was congratulating themselves that the threat-l German sea blockade had been a failure.



Russian Official Report Tells of Furious Fighting in Eastern Theatre - Austrians on Offensive in the Carpathians, Although They Have Met With Several Losses.

Petrograd, March 9.—The following official communication issued tonight says:

"On the whole front, between the Niemen and the Vistula, the lighting yesterday was of an extremly desperate character...Our cavalry captured part of a supply column which was falling back on the village of Seiny.

"In the region of Augustowo a battle has begun two versts (about a mile and a half) from the station of Augustowo.

"The artillery of Ossowetz is successfully engaging the enemy's siege batteries.

"An attack by the Germans on the Kolno and Lomza roads
