

Investment liquidation was again observed in the bond list, some railway issues, also industrials and utilities, recording substantial concessions on small but steady offerings, with unusual gaps between bid and asked prices. The heaviness of bonds, which extended to governments, was ascribed to selling in anticipation of the administration's financial plans.

Less pressure was exerted against munition and equipment stocks, even though the suggestion to centralize purchases of supplies in this market for the Entente Allies under federal supervision seemed to be directed mainly against excess profits.

Unlike the markets of recent days' highest levels, with few exceptions, were attained in the last hour, United States Steel leading at an extreme advance of 2½ points to 111 3-8, with two to four points for other issues of like description.

Bethlehem Steel new stock rose 4 1-8 to 1274, with two to three points for Republic Iron and Crucible and Lackawanna Steels, the latter owing much of its strength to a very favorable quarterly report of earnings.

General Electric was foremost of the equipments, rising five points to 168, with one to three for shippings, moters, petroleums, sugars and related specialties, while Wilson Packing gained 3 34; National Biscuit 5 and Ohio Gas five points. Industrial Alcohol was among the few weak specialties, losing almost three points net. Pacifics led the rails at gains of one to three points, with pronounced improvement in Grangers and many of the low priced western and southwestern rails.


