A New Fashioned Legislature.

"Assuming a virtuous front but it

not" is a lesson that monarchs have

learned from the ambitious Lady Mac-

beth. Many rulers make great efforts

to keep up a legislature that will com-

mand respect from the people and not

thwart the will of the crown. The

problem is a most difficult one, and has

often become so entangled that it had to

be solved in the Alexandrian fashion.

Kaiser William has passed the greater

part of his reign struggling with this

difficulty, and has been many times on

the point of dispensing with his legisla-

ture. He is now endeavoring to organ-

ize such a representative body for Alsace

and Lorraine as will give the conper-

ment the semblance of local self-govern-

ment without opposing any serious

obstacles to the carrying out of im-

perial designs. A cable dispatch says

that an Imperial decree of October 29

establishes the Representative Assembly

of Alsace-Lorraine, and fixes its duties

and powers. It will express its views

on the budget, and upon bills req-

uired for Imperial legislation, and

so upon bills which are not subject to

censure by the District Diets. The

assembly will be composed of ten

delegates from each District Diet,

to be elected for three years. The

emperor reserves the right to fix the

name and place of the sittings of the

Assembly, which will be private. The

governor of the Provinces will be en-

abled to demand a hearing, and to assist

a person or by representatives at the sit-

tings of the body. The Assembly, in

expressing its views to the Imperial

government must also give the views of

its minority. This Assembly will

have the satisfaction of feeling that it

is the least powerful of any legislature in

the world. It may "express its views

on the budget," etc., but its expres-

sion on important matters will not be

scored more weight than those of the

St. John Common Council on the Res-

olutions. This Assembly must be

one of the objects of criticism to the

people whom it is supposed to represent,

and it will not be found of much service in

the government of the Provinces.

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Death of the Earl of Charleville.

Charles William Francis Barry, fourth

Earl of Charleville, died at his residence

at William Butler Dunca on Castleton

Heights, Staten Island, on Tuesday

morning. He was a member of the peerage

of Ireland, and bore a second title

Baron Tallamore, which had marked the

Earl's family until 1865, when the

great-grandfather of the late deceased

Earl was promoted to the earldom, and

at the same time being appointed

Master-General of Ireland. The

family seat is Charleville Forest,

Tallamore, King's County, Ire-

land, and there the fourth Earl, just

dead, was born in 1825. On the death of

his father in 1859 he succeeded to the

title, and became proprietor of the long-

landed estates in Ireland. In 1871 he

left Eton, where he was educated, and

passed an examination for a direct com-

mission in the "Household Brigade."

Young Barry's delicate health prevented

him from fulfilling his rank entailed

upon him, and for the last three years he

spent most of his time cruising in the

coast. Still unbenefited, he sailed in his

yacht "Marta" for this country in May last,

accompanied by his aunt and Dr. William

Day Lovell of London. The greater part

of three weeks previous to his death was

spent in the "Household Brigade."

His body will follow her, to be de-

posited in the cemetery at New York.
