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# ST. GEORGE'S SOCIETY.

## ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1858.

PRESENTED 5TH JANUARY, 1859.

The Committee of Management of the St. George's Society have the honor to submit the following report of their operations during the year closing this day.

St. George's Day was celebrated by the attendance of the Society at divine service in the Cathedral. The service was performed by the Lord Bishop of Quebec, Patron of the Society, assisted by the Rev. A. W. Mountain, one of the chaplains, and an excellent sermon was preached by the Rev. Septimus Jones, B. A. An admirable and appropriate Musical Service was performed by the ladies and gentlemen of the choir and other amateurs, under the able management of Henry Carter, Esq., the talented organist of the Cathedral. The collection in aid of the charitable fund, amounted to £18 12s. 6d.

The anniversary was also celebrated by a Ball, given under the auspices of the Society, at the Music Hall in the evening.

A reference to the Report of the Sub-Committee of Charity, will show the expenditure during the year of the sum of £143 5s. 6d. which was distributed among one hundred and seventeen deserving applicants. This amount exceeds last year's expenditure by the sum of £14, while the number of cases relieved exceeds that of the previous year by thirty one.

The Treasurer's Report, showing the financial condition of the Society, is now on the table. It will be observed that the Permanent fund amounts to £1412 8s. 9d. and that the balance re-

maintaining at the credit of the charitable fund at the close of the year, is £16 12s. 7d. Your Committee deem it desirable for the information of gentlemen, not members of the Society, to explain that the Permanent Fund is composed of the moneys received for commutation of Ordinary to Life membership, by the payment of Five Pounds in one sum. The Entrance Fees and Annual Subscriptions of ordinary members, with any donations for which no special object is defined, and the Interest on the invested Permanent Fund, go to form the Charitable Fund. Owing partly to the heavy claims on your committee for relief during a period of almost unparalleled distress, and partly to the fact of a considerable number of members being in arrears for subscription, the balance at the credit of this fund is smaller than could have been desired, with certain prospect of increased demands on the Society during the winter; your committee must urge on members the absolute necessity of making good the arrears due.

During the year, the Society has added to its roll six members, of whom five are Ordinary members, and one is for Life. The total number of Members now on the Books is 205, viz:—81 life members; 114 ordinary members; 10 honorary members.

The Committee regret to learn that it is not the intention of the Rev. Geo. Mackie, D.D., a life member, and, for many years, one of the Chaplains of the Society, to return to Canada. By his frank and amiable disposition, the warm sympathy he ever evinced for the distressed, and his attachment to his country, no less than by his satisfactory discharge of the duties of his high calling, Dr. Mackie endeared himself to all Englishmen in Quebec, and his loss will be severely felt by all classes, but by none more than the poor, who always considered him their friend and benefactor.

Your Committee have to deplore the loss by death, since the last annual meeting of the Society, of three of its most prominent members, Messrs. Robert Roberts, Zaccheus Williams, and Robert Symes. Mr. Roberts, one of the original members, and a life member, was on several occasions elected Vice-President of the

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Society, and invariably took the deepest interest in its prosperity. He was deservedly esteemed and deeply regretted. Mr. Williams also a life member, was an active and zealous member of your committee, and was always foremost in forwarding the best interests of the Society. Mr. Symes, J. P., who died lately at Meaford, Canada West, also an original member of the institution, was Treasurer from the formation of the Society for a period of sixteen years consecutively, and was subsequently elected for two years Vice-President; during all which time he took the most lively interest in its welfare. To him the Society is indebted for the establishment (acting on the suggestion of the late Lord Durham) of the system of life membership, and through that system for the prosperity it now enjoys. Notwithstanding that the removal of Mr. Symes from Quebec some years back, deprived the society of his active assistance, he continued to manifest the utmost anxiety for its welfare. At a meeting of the Society held on the 29th December last, a committee was appointed to collect subscriptions for the erection of a monument to his memory.

The Right Honorable John George, Earl of Durham, G. C. B., Patron. Died at Cowes, Isle of Wight, 28th July, 1840, at the age of 48 years.

The Right Honorable Lord Sydenham, G. C. B. Died at Kingston, C. W., September 1841, at the age of 42 years.

The Right Honorable Sir Charles Bagot, G. C. B. Died at Kingston, C. W., 18th May, 1843, at the age of 62 years.

William Kemble, past President. Died at Quebec, 5th March, 1843, at the age of 64 years.

Charles Gibbs Gortley. Died at Dartmouth, 24th March, 1846, at the age of 35 years.

Frostie Ralph Grey. Died at Quebec, 11th April, 1846, as the age of 38 years.

James John Lowndes. Died at St. Foy, near Quebec, 23d July, 1846, at the age of 45 years.

The Right Honorable Lord Metcalfe, G. C. B., Patron. Died at his sea near Basingstoke, Hants, 5th September, 1846, at the age of 62 years.

John Jeffrey. Died at Quebec, 13th December, 1846, at the age of 62 years.

Anthony Anderson. Died at Hedley Lodge, Quebec, 3rd of April, 1847, at the age of 80 years.

John Racey, M. D. E., one of the Physicians to the Society. Died at Quebec, 25th October, 1847, at the age of 39 years.

William Phillips. Died at Quebec, 4th April, 1849, at the age of 59 years.

John Charlton Fisher, past President. Died on board Steamer "Sarah Sands" on her passage from Liverpool to New York, on the 10th August, 1849, at the age of 55 years.

Abraham Lenfesty. Died at Quebec, 13th July, 1849, at the age of 40 years.

Thomas Yates. Died at Quebec, 13th July, 1849, at the age of 62 years.

William Benjamin Poston. Died at San Francisco, 13th October, 1850, at the age of 25 years.

William John Chapman Benson. Died at Whitehall, U. S., 3rd December, 1850, at the age of 33 years.

Peter Paterson. Died at his residence, Montmorency Falls, 12th June, 1851, at the age of 83 years.

Stephen Codman, native of the City of Norwich, England, came to Canada, in 1816, as organist to the Cathedral. Died at Quebec, 6th October, 1852, at the age of 56 years. The congregation have erected a tablet to his memory in the Cathedral Church.

William Patton, born at Low Leyton, Essex, London, 26th July, 1798; came to Canada, 16th June, 1819; seven years president of St. George's Society. Died at Quebec, 14th August, 1853, at the age of 55 years.

Charles Poston, born at Whitechurch, Shropshire, 3rd October, 1788; came to Canada, 23rd May, 1815; past President. Died in England, 5th April, 1853.

Admiral Boxer, born at Dover, Kent. Died at Balaklava, 4th June, 1855, at the age of years.

Peter Sheppard, native of Guernsey, came to Canada, in 1809. Died at Quebec, 23rd August, 1856, at the age of 63 years.

John Racey, Senior, native of Bath, came to Quebec, in 1802. Died in England, in 1856, at the age of 73 years.

The Earl of Ellesmere, K. G., visited the United States in 1854, as one



of the Queen's Commissioners to attend the opening of the New York Crystal Palace, which made him favorably known to the American people. He visited Quebec also at that time, and was the guest of Earl of Elgin. He expired at Bridgewater House, St. James, on Wednesday, the 18th March 1857. The deceased was born on the 1st of January, 1800.

George Germain Ardouin, native of Quebec. Born at Quebec, 16th January, 1824. Died in Quebec, 23rd February, 1857, at the age 37.

William Dupont, native of London, England. Died at Three Rivers 5th November, 1857, at the age of 58 years.

Robert Roberts, born in 1797, Halkin, North Wales, came to Canada, 1819. Died at Quebec, 2nd July, 1858, at the age of 61 years.

Zaccheus Williams, born at Bangor, North Wales, 12th July, 1797. Died at Quebec, 19th November, 1858, at the age of 61 years.

John Robert Nathaniel Symes, Justice of the Peace, (senior Life Member of the Society.) Born at Camberwell, Surrey, 6th Jan., 1794. Came to Quebec, 22nd May, 1816. Died at Mesford, C.W., 10th December, 1858, at the age of 64 years. Was Treasurer from the formation of the Society, for sixteen years consecutively.
