





HORRIBLE BUTCHERY.

A CAPTAIN, HIS WIFE, AND SECOND MATE HACKED TO PIECES.

The barque Herbert Fuller, which sailed from Boston for Rosario, on the 8th inst., put into Halifax on the morning of the 21st inst., flying the stars and stripes with black flag immediately under.

Capt. Nash was in his room and his wife was murdered in her sleeping apartment. The rooms were covered with blood and showed evidence of a awful fight. Mate Thomas Brane was suspected and placed in irons by the cook and the ship headed for Halifax.

There was one passenger on board, Frank Monck of Boston, who was a passenger going for a sea voyage for his health. His room was between that of the captain and his wife.

At the police station the first mate was stripped and blood was found on his clothing. The passenger, Frank Monck, states that he saw the first mate come from the captain's cabin after the murder.

Chas. Brown was first arrested. He was the man at the wheel on the night of the murder, the mate being in charge; two other sailors who were forward on the deck constituted the watch at the time.

The facts of the case are gradually filtering through the wall built around the Herbert Fuller tragedy by the police authorities and the United States Consulate, and they all go to show that the murder was first mate Brane, and that the motive was either robbery of the captain and Lester Monck, the passenger, or else it was a criminal assault upon Captain Nash's wife.
