

to express their opinions freely. He haped for the sake of the teachers of Albert County that Mr. Jones' paper would not appear in print." Mr. Crocket's appeal for sympathy was not of much avail, for immediately after he had resumed his seat; Mr.

Jones arose and said he was quite willing his paper should be printed, claiming" that his language will perfectly courteous, and that instead of censuring Mr. Crocket, he had only spoken of him once; he had blamed the government alone for the changes, To this Mr. Mr. White Crocket did not reply. The report con-






