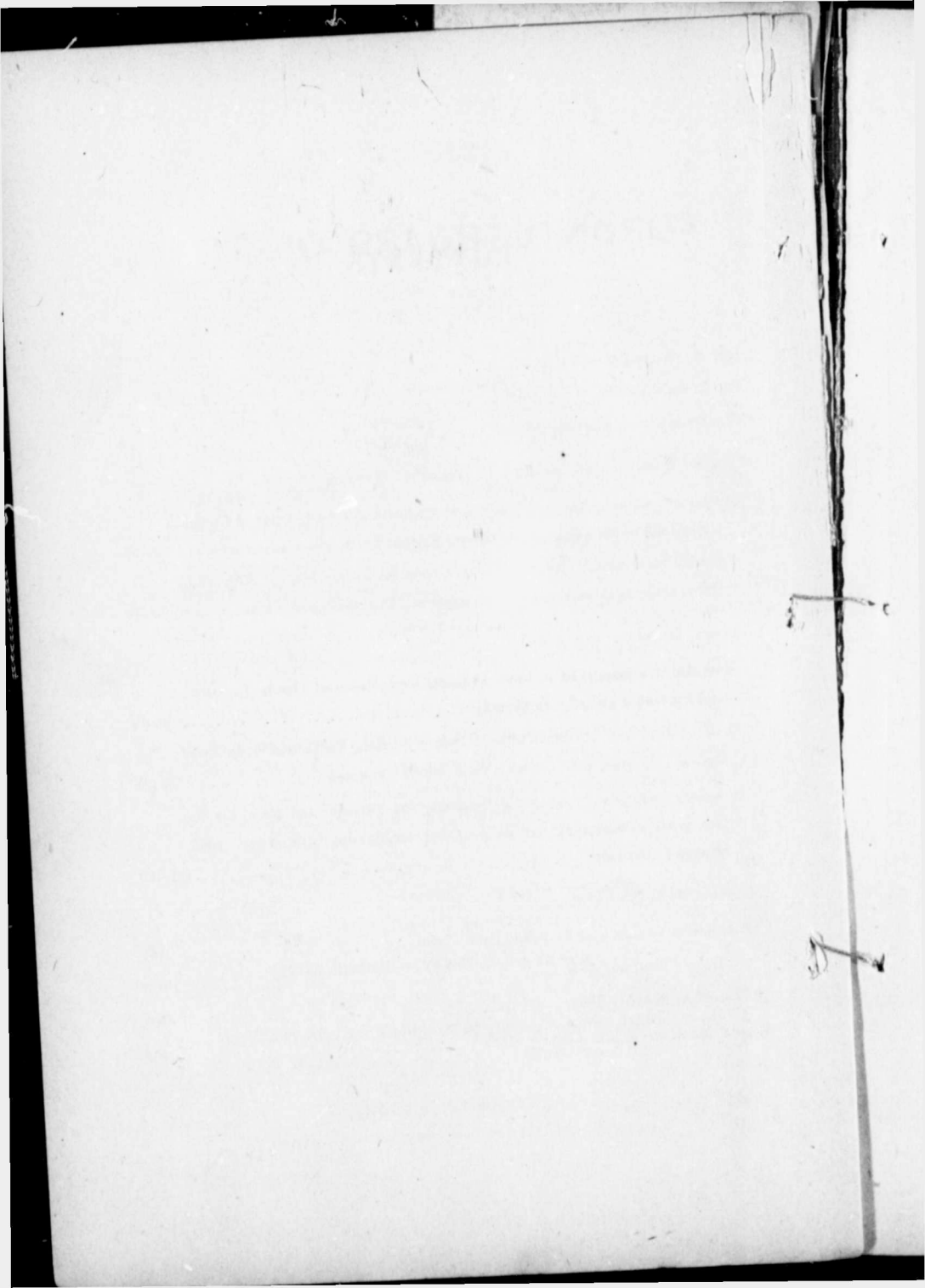

# TORONTO BOARD OF TRADE.

## PRESIDENT'S REPORT, 1886.

Any one almost of the important subjects which have engaged the attention of the Board during the year might form a proper text for the President's annual address, which has latterly been expected to contain something more than a simple review of the work done during the year. I propose to touch only upon two or three, which are either of an unfinished character, or are of such practical importance still as to merit the fullest publicity that can be given them.

### FIRE INSURANCE.

The subject of fire insurance by country merchants as an important factor in the dispensing of credit by wholesale merchants is one of these, and the discussion of it has led to this conclusion, which should be emphasized in the mind of every country merchant, that it is his primary duty to see his stock insured, at least to the full extent of his indebtedness on account thereof, and that in future it will be perfectly idle for any man who neglects this duty to ask for the clemency or consideration of his creditors when fire has destroyed his property and left him without the means to pay his debts.

The excuse that "he didn't think the fire would burn his stock" will be as little admissible as that of the fool "who didn't know it was loaded," the result in each case being almost invariably alike disastrous.

### COURT OF RAILWAY COMMISSIONERS.

Few of our members are sanguine that the voluminous evidence taken by the Commissioners of the Railway Commission, so much of which has been irrelevant to the subject of the Bill, will aid very much the deliberation of Parliament upon the subject. That the arbitrary powers now in the hands of these large corporations, and with which it is so difficult, if



not impossible, for aggrieved individuals, for municipalities, civic corporations or the public generally successfully to cope, are always exercised to the public advantage is far from actual truth.

That a power should exist more competent to deal with them than the Railway Committee of the Privy Council to compel recognition of public and individual rights, and the uniform treatment of similar classes of their customers, and removing from these corporations the power without redress, to build up the industry of one man or the prosperity of one point at the expense of others, will be admitted by all fair-minded men, and the more study that is given the subject the more clearly will this be established. The apparent difficulties should not deter Parliament from an earnest effort to secure adequate means of redress.

They have been secured in Britain, where the need was much less even than it is here, and the sooner it is attempted the easier it will be of accomplishment.

#### INSOLVENCY LEGISLATION.

The operation of the Ontario Act governing the distribution of insolvent debtors' estates has given much satisfaction, and a somewhat similar measure has been enacted in the Province of Quebec. The almost entire abolition of undue preferences and equitable distribution thereby secured have to some extent removed the reproach resting upon us as a trading community and given increased confidence to creditors both home and foreign. The Ontario Act would be more perfect were provision made for the speedy adjustment of claims on estates assigned under the Act, compelling proof of claim within a specified time before the County Court Judge, where the same is objected to for any reason, with the alternative of having the claim barred.

No restriction should be placed upon the creditors in the selection of their assignee appointed in succession to the sheriff, such as, that he must be a resident of the county where the debtor was in business.

The desirability of these amendments have only to be demonstrated to the Attorney-General to secure his assent thereto.

A much graver omission in the law exists, however, through which, although scarcely credible, fraudulent debtors, guilty of fraudulent concealment of their assets, fraudulent disposal of their goods, and fraudulent mutilation and destruction of their books of account, may go and have

gone unwhipt of justice, because at the time of their prosecution, or at the time of the alleged offence, the debt of the creditor prosecuting was not due.

Where it can be clearly established a creditor has been injured by the deliberate fraud of a debtor, it is in the interest of honest trading no trivial or technical obstruction should stand in the way of punishment.

But these and other similar disabilities under which merchants labour can only be remedied effectually by an insolvency measure enacted by the Federal Parliament, making the law uniform throughout all the Provinces of the Dominion, and it is to be hoped the new Parliament, shortly to be elected, will take a more rational view of the question than their predecessors.

In the case of Broddy v. Stuart, before Mr. Justice Armour, the constitutionality of this Act has recently been the subject of contestation, when it was held to be *intra vires* of the Ontario Legislature. The learned judge said: "I think the Act was within the competence of the Provincial Legislature, and I over-rule the demurrer with costs." Leave was given to appeal.

#### THE ASSESSMENT ACT.

During the past summer the operation of the Assessment Act, the inequality, the injustice and inquisitorial nature of which I adverted to in my address of 1884, was the subject of much discussion in our city press. So much so that nothing new practically can be said upon the subject. It is now for thoughtful men to suggest a more excellent measure, and the opinion of this corporation, formulated by a competent committee, should have great weight.

I do not assume to indicate what this should be, but you will suffer a remark or two. Capital is a sensitive, thing, easily frightened, and just as easy of transfer from one centre to another.

An absolute necessity for the commerce we engage in, its concentration in our midst should not be hindered by an undue levy upon it, because it happens to be tangible and accessible.

The principles that govern and are applicable to the imposition of the taxes of a nation cannot be applied with the same justice to the affairs of a municipality.

Where special benefit is conferred by the municipality, special taxation

should be imposed. What is common to all, equally enjoyed by all, and of equal benefit to all, should be paid for in equal measure by all.

The capitalist living in Windsor, Quebec, or Newfoundland, who sends his money here for investment in loan company, insurance company, or bank stock, is not a proper subject for taxation by the city, seeing the city confers no benefit upon him personally, but is the rather under obligation to him, and others like him, for his aid in making this a financial centre and providing the capital for our industries, and which will usually be found represented in a visible form somewhere.

I do not say that real estate should produce the whole of the civic revenue, trusting that through this channel all classes shall ultimately be compelled to bear their share in due proportion; but, if from an adult poll tax were derived revenue to cover what all enjoy in common, and a classified business tax, based upon the rental, imposed, I think that real estate might, with substantial justice, be relied upon to contribute the balance; as at present, the income and personal property taxes are highly objectionable.

#### RATE OF INTEREST ON GOVERNMENT DEPOSITS.

The Government is still indifferent to the representations, made to it by many competent to express an independent judgment upon the subject, as to the effect of their policy in attracting the savings of the people by paying a high rate of interest upon the deposits in their Post-office and Savings Banks, and denying to the commerce of the country the use of this money by locking it up, in a fixed unproductive form, in public works. When our merchants and manufacturers realize that this means a higher rate of interest upon all the money they borrow from banks, and that incidentally it stands in the way of a lower rate of interest to every borrower of money in Canada, stronger and more frequent solicitations will be made to the Government to review their policy in this matter.

#### EXCHANGE.

The rate of New York and sterling exchange are artificially enhanced at the moment to all purchasers thereof in Canada by the policy of the Government, in keeping its reserves not in American gold, which is current at par all over this continent, but in English sovereigns, which can

only be marketed in New York at a loss. That this is effective in preventing a drain of gold from Canada occasionally, as the current of exchange requires, is true; but it is a heavy penalty merchants have to pay for such an artificial obstruction, imposed to suit the exigencies of a false system.

Reference was made in the last annual report to the removal from our midst of the tobacco manufacturing industry.

Within the past few weeks premises had been leased, and machinery laid down, for the resumption of this industry, on a large scale, by a company of American gentlemen, and soon a portion of the million and a half pounds of this article annually distributed by our wholesale merchants may be expected to be produced in this city.

#### TRADE REVIEW.

Reviewing the trade of the year just closed, there is nothing in the statistics of failures to show an exceptional state of prosperity with those engaged in the distribution of commodities, whether wholesale or retail; nor has there been any marked immunity from failure of any particular branch of trade in the ardent struggle for existence and supremacy. Not a few in every branch of trade have fallen. The slight reduction in the numbers of those who have failed, when compared with those of 1885, represent larger liabilities in the aggregate.

There are no statistics to show what improvement was made, if any, in dividends to creditors; and while the reduction in numbers is for the better, great progress has still to be made before it can be said that undue competition has ceased, and that that branch of trade is in a sound condition, such as the figures seem to indicate it was in 1882.

If use is made, however, of the existing improvement, to fortify what is weak, to unflinchingly weed out what is bad, to make good what is doubtful, and to cultivate only what has been proved to be sound and remunerative, there will be a fitting preparation either for the continued improvement which we all hope for, or for a less favourable state of affairs if such unfortunately should result.

Only a few of the conditions which have started the United States into a new period of activity and prosperity of the most pronounced kind, exist in our midst. The enormous extent of railway building projected and

under construction, warranted by the great natural resources and rapid development of their industries, has no counterpart with us, as our great national highway, involving the expenditure of a vast sum of money, is practically finished, and our limited population is already burdened with as large a debt for public works, and is taxed for the maintenance thereof, and for other purposes, to as great an extent as is perhaps prudent or expedient.

We may assume, however, that the steady growth and development of our resources which have taken place during the year just closed will continue, and that we shall share at least to some extent in the prosperity of our neighbours south of the line.

#### MANUFACTURES.

Upon the manufacturing industries of the country, the recent advance in the values of raw material, such as cotton, wool, iron, etc., has had a beneficial effect. If the cotton mills are not yet making large dividends for their shareholders, or doing much to discharge their heavy obligations, incurred in the initial stages of their establishment, through the increased consumptive demand for their goods, and the diversity of production which is being aimed at, their machinery is now well employed, and the future is hopeful.

#### TRADE OF TORONTO.

Could the progress and prosperity of our own city, and the industries in our midst, be accepted as a correct index of the condition of trade generally in the Dominion, very pronounced things might be said of it, for with scarcely an exception, all our material interests are healthy and progressive—many of them exceptionally so.

The erection of new buildings, and the transactions in real estate throughout the year, have been of great magnitude. The laudable ambition of our citizens to be owners of their own homes, in so far as it encourages habits of thrift, and renders their residence here permanent, giving them a direct and vital interest in righteous municipal government, *is good*. But if this movement in real estate is to stimulate the speculative propensities of our merchants and professional men, so as to induce them to incur heavy debt, or to withdraw their capital, and still more their attention from their legitimate occupations, which should have their undivided

care, *it is bad*; and with the disastrous lessons so many have had to learn through real estate speculations in the North-West, so plainly staring us in the face, it would be unfortunate, and little sympathy would be felt for those who allow themselves to be led astray.

That a time will come (be its duration longer or shorter) when there will not be so many buyers of real estate as at present, few can doubt, and it will be well for speculative operators to consider where they will then be found, and to what extent they will then be loaded.

The extent to which our country has been favoured, with a healthful climate, freedom during the year from plague and pestilence, a bountiful harvest vouchsafed, peace in our borders, and employment for willing hands with reasonable remuneration, should call forth the deepest gratitude of our industrious, law-abiding, freedom-loving, self-governing people.

#### HARVEST.

Analyzing the harvest from a farmer's standpoint, it may be said that as to fruitfulness, Ontario, when compared with eight of the principal growing States of the American Union, has maintained her record of superiority for the past five years.

Of wheat there has been a short crop, of unusually excellent quality—in some sections the best that has ever been seen.

Barley has been a fairly successful crop.

Oats, at least a full average, both in yield and quality.

Rye, a fair average crop in most of the districts where it was grown.

Peas, very good, *no bugs*, crop large, and the sample unusually fine.

Corn, a fair crop, up to the average.

#### GRAIN TRADE.

From the grain-dealer's standpoint, the business in grain has been satisfactory. The inferior quality harvested in 1885, and the extremely low value to which all cereals, and particularly wheat, had receded, entailing a serious loss on dealers generally, induced greater caution for the present season, and there has been moved a crop of excellent quality at prices that would admit of exportation with a reasonable margin for profit.

Deliveries of barley, wheat, and peas, have been liberal, taxing the car capacity of our railways to the utmost to keep the granaries clear.

The exceptionally good quality of the crop of barley harvested in the United States, and particularly in the West, this year, has enabled the Americans to successfully compete with Canada in supplying her own markets with the better grades, and is the cause of the low prices which have ruled this season.

With a duty of 10 cents per bushel and freight charges against our Canadian farmers before our barley can be delivered to the American consumer, and the increased attention given in the Western States to the growth of this grain, it behooves our farmers to give more careful attention to the matter of proper rotation of crops and the selection of seed.

An attempt, during the past two years, has been made to introduce new seed, and of a variety that does not find favour with buyers. If this is continued, Canada will certainly lose the prestige she now enjoys of producing the best quality on the continent, which would have a most untoward effect upon the farming interest.

#### BUTTER.

From this chair one is disposed to be exceedingly guarded in giving expression to any remarks that would seem to depreciate, in the slightest, the value of our national sources of wealth; but the parties responsible for the unnecessarily inferior quality of enormous quantities of butter sent to market need to be aroused to the loss which their present method of manufacturing this article involves.

It seems no exaggeration to say that if only half the quantity of butter which is at present made were well made, according to the rules and principles, and under circumstances that would insure the superior article which can be produced, a larger return would be obtained from it than is at present got from double the quantity, which is so sadly deteriorated by careless manufacture.

I should be sorry to think that the statement of an informant is correct, to the effect that our loss from this cause might be counted in millions of dollars per annum; but such is the statement made to me by one who has made careful enquiry into the matter.

#### THE MILLING INTEREST.

The year has, unfortunately, not been a prosperous one in the milling business. It is to be regretted that such an important branch of our manu-

facturing industries should in the past few years have yielded a very inadequate return. Few millers latterly have made money by milling alone; many have lost, and this notwithstanding the measure of protection which the policy of the Government was expected to afford, and which many millers hoped would have been a great benefit and stimulus to the trade. The comparative absence for two years of an export demand for our flour, owing to the extremely low prices for breadstuffs, is also a reason for the long continued depression in this business.

Indications of improvement, however, are not wanting, and as our milling friends have not by any means lost heart, by another year a much more encouraging report of this most important industry may be given.

The business of those who handle flour, depending on the prosperity of our millers, those engaged in this department have not been any more successful than the manufacturers, but are looking forward with hope to the future.

#### LUMBER AND TIMBER.

The lumber trade for the past year has been, on the whole, satisfactory, more especially to the manufacturer.

The quantity of lumber manufactured was larger than in any previous year, finding ready market and at good prices.

The amount used in Toronto during the past twelve months was very much greater than in any similar period in the city's history, and the prospects for the present year are such as to warrant the assurance that the consumption of all kinds of lumber will be even more than in the past year.

Whilst the export of lumber from this port to the United States was larger in 1886 than that of 1885, it can hardly be anticipated that this will continue; home consumption is increasing, and the greater portion of the lumber that in former years found a market from Toronto to various points in the United States, is now required in Toronto and the Western parts of Ontario.

The opening of new timber territory by the Northern and Nor'-Western Railroad to North Bay, and the connections there formed with the Canadian Pacific Railway, must inevitably add to the increasing trade in lumber in this city; and the facilities offered by the various railroads to the trade in the movement of lumber from the north shores of the



Georgian Bay and Lake Huron have also added very materially to the development of the industry amongst us.

#### THE BOARD.

The Board is to be congratulated upon its continued usefulness, and upon the support and encouragement it has received from all classes of the business community, evidenced by the large accession to its membership during the year, the attendance at its meetings, and the interesting and intelligent discussions upon the subjects which have engaged its attention.

The Toronto Board of Trade may justly take credit for having exemplified to other communities what can be done for the furtherance of the interests with which it assumes to deal by united and organized effort, and the formation within the past year or two of Boards of Trade in so many cities and towns from one end of Canada to the other, as well as the activity into which some have been aroused which before had only an existence in name, may be largely attributed to our example and the success which has attended our efforts here, I say this in no boastful spirit but for your encouragement. Hereafter the measure of unity and the spirit of enterprise animating the business men of any community in Canada, will be gauged by the activity and success of its local Board of Trade.

There are many places yet with local wants to supply and local interests to promote, the advantages of which are apparent enough, and only fail of accomplishment through lack of such an organization.

I would ask the business men of Walkerton, for instance, if they were in the habit of meeting together, under the auspices of a local organization, to discuss matters affecting the prosperity and progress of their town, whether the subject of more frequent passenger communication to and better postal service with Toronto, would not be one of their first subjects of conference, and become matters of speedy attainment through proper representations to the authorities, and united and persistent effort to this end?

The question of water-works for domestic and fire purposes, and an effective system of sewerage and sanitation, while coming properly within the scope of the municipal authorities in each town and city, are yet of

such vital importance as to form proper subjects of attention at the hands of every association of business men, upon whose earnest work their attainment must primarily depend.

## GOVERNMENT BOARD OF TRADE.

I am not to be regarded as speaking chimerically when I say that the legitimate outcome of our continued efforts should be, and will be, the addition to the Dominion Cabinet of a Minister, whose undivided attention will be given to questions of trade and commerce of the Dominion, which have hitherto been administered by the heads of several Departments in a very imperfect manner, and treated as only of secondary consideration.

It was intimated by Sir John A. Macdonald, in his speech at Ottawa, on the 8th October, that the Royal Commission, which he proposed issuing to enquire into the questions arising out of the conflict of labour and capital, would also include this subject in the scope of its enquiry.

It appears to me, however, that the subject has got somewhat beyond the stage of an enquiry, even by such a Trades and Labour Commission as has been appointed, and it only requires the persistent agitation of such bodies as ours, who know something of its importance, to prepare the public mind for, and to secure its ultimate accomplishment.

In the subdivision of our Board into six sections, representing bankers, contractors, wholesale hardware, coal dealers, dry goods and lumber dealers, we have secured the machinery whereby these several factors may discuss and work for the advancement of the interests which they are specially engaged in; and already many important ends have been achieved by their friendly and united co-operation.

I am of opinion that the work of these sections is only in its initial stages, and that it is only beginning to be realized what can be accomplished by this friendly interchange of ideas and opinions on the subjects which engage their every day attention, and which it was the primary object of the establishment of this Board to govern and promote.

I would not conceal from the members the gravity and importance of the work which they have undertaken during the year, and the successful issue of which must tax the enterprise and devotion of its executive officers for some years to come.

The establishment of the Gratuity Fund during the past year, by which solidity, permanence and monetary value have been given to our memberships, is of the most creditable and far-reaching kind.

The object, namely, to unite the membership and insure its maintenance commended itself to everyone, and nothing could be more appropriate than that this should be done in connection with a scheme making provision for the representatives of deceased members as they passed from our midst; eminently beneficent in character while not at all onerous upon the members generally.

The report of the Trustees of the Gratuity Fund appended hereto is pleasing as showing the unanimity and heartiness with which this scheme has been received and entered into. The progress made is quite satisfactory, and there is every reason to believe that all our anticipations in connection with it will be realized.

The purchase of a site for the erection of a suitable Board of Trade building has partaken of a similar character, and the same prudence and foresight which has characterized the inception of this enterprise will unquestionably conduce to the further prosperity of the Board, its permanence and usefulness, and justify the unbounded confidence felt in the discretion of the Executive by those who have so promptly placed the means of purchasing the site at the disposal of the Board in the acquisition of our debentures.

#### ARBITRATION.

The Board by-laws requiring the submission of disputes between members to arbitration, in the speedy, inexpensive and generally satisfactory adjustment by experts in the various branches of trade of differences which constantly arise, are not only conceived in the right spirit, but are of immense advantage, and should be much more widely availed of. Such is the testimony of all our judges, and litigiousness must be attributed to those who, having facilities for the adjudication of business transactions in dispute, by a competent committee of their fellow-citizens, thoroughly versed in all the unwritten rules and practices of their trade, yet prefer the glorious uncertainty of the law, and the expense and delay of court, lawyers and juries.

During the past year fifteen cases have been dealt with by the Board of Arbitration, in a summary manner, involving transactions amounting to a large sum.

## ACCOUNTANTS.

I desire to direct your attention to the important work undertaken by the Ontario Institute of Chartered Accountants, which, although not of the Board of Trade, yet meets under our roof, and is deserving of all possible encouragement from us. The science of accounts, as fundamental to the proper recording and accurate demonstration of the results of mercantile transactions, is so indispensable to the man of business, that every possible facility for placing within the reach of our young men the means of acquiring a competent knowledge of it, and a high standard by which the depth and accuracy of their acquirements may be tested, is worthy of every encouragement.

Hereafter the joint stock companies who desire that implicit confidence should be placed in the sufficiency of their audits, will give preference to the employment of those who have established by experimental tests their competency, and accountants, bookkeepers, bank clerks and others will find it of advantage to associate themselves with this valued institution.

## IMPORTS AND EXPORTS.

The duty collected on imports at this port in 1886 is largely in excess of that in 1885. It is within a few dollars of being the same as in 1880, and in these years, it was the largest in the history of Toronto, with the exception of 1882.—The proportions of free and dutiable goods remain about the same. When discussing volume of trade, however, it is to be remembered that goods of home manufacture are continually displacing imported articles. The advance of civilization and increase in wealth of our population is, however, constantly widening the range of articles which may be imported and disposed of profitably.

A reference to the tabulated statements in the Appendix to this Report, prepared with great assiduity, by our zealous and energetic Secretary, and published for the first time, shows the value of our exports, for 1858, and yearly thenceforward, classified under the various heads, and also showing quarterly from 1st July, 1884, to 30th June, 1886, the name, quantity and value of articles exported, and the country receiving the same; also statement of imports dutiable and free, giving value only and the name of country whence imported, yearly from 1858 to 30th June, 1886, and a further statement giving *in detail* these imports from 1st

July, 1884, to 30th June, 1886, the name of country whence imported, quantity, value, etc., quarterly.

These will convey most valuable information never before given, to importers, manufacturers and others, and bear out largely my remark as to the widening nature of our imports, and the increasing importance of Toronto as a large merchandize distributing centre.

I am informed that every year our home manufacturers also find a larger outlet for their goods at this point, and those who are able from a personal knowledge to institute a comparison between Toronto as it was twenty years ago, and as it is to-day relatively to other commercial centres, are witnesses to the gigantic strides towards supremacy which her merchants have made during that period.

#### POSTAGE.

The reduction of the rate of postage from three cents to two cents, in harmony with the action of the United States Post-office authorities, would not only be a boon to the public, and especially the trading public, but would, as all statistics show, ultimately produce an increased revenue to the Government.

In conclusion I must sincerely thank the members of the Board, and especially the Vice-Presidents and members of the various Councils associated with me during the four years I have been honoured in presiding over your deliberations, for your unvarying courtesy, for the generous support accorded me, and for the kindly and appreciative spirit in which my humble efforts for the welfare, usefulness and advancement of this Board have been regarded.

I count myself happy, indeed, in the many sincere friendships here begun, and the educating intercourse enjoyed with so many of my fellow merchants, and the privilege I have had during these years, of contributing in some measure to the erection of the scaffolding at least, of what I am persuaded will be a lasting, a noble, and a useful edifice, to belong to which will be regarded at once as the duty and privilege of every public spirited business man of this great city.
