ARTICLES OF THE CALENDAR

— AND —

ASTRONOMICAL NOTICES FOR THE YEAR 1894.

On the left hand page of each month are given the rising and setting of the sun with the length of the day to the nearest full minute; also, the data required for the working of solar observations for time, namely, the Equation of Time (that is in the difference between apparent Sun Time and uniform Clock Time, to be added or subtracted according as one is behind or ahead of the other), which is given for the instant of apparent Noon—next the Sun's Declination at Mean Noon, Greenwich Time, with these exceptions all the calculations are brought to the nearest minute of Local mean time at Charlottetown, Latitude $46^{\circ} 13' 55''$ N.; Longitude $63^{\circ} 7' 33''$ W.; giving 4 hrs. 12 mins. 29.5 secs. difference slow on Greenwich.

If required, the Sun's Declination at Greenwich apparent noon may be found from the data here given by multiplying the hourly variation of Declination by the Equation of time for the same day reduced to the decimal of an hour, and applying the result according to the conditions as under.

From the Sun's apparent semi-diameter which is given daily to the nearest tenth of a second, may be found the Sun's Horizontal Parallax (which equals what would be the apparent Semi-diameter of the earth as seen at the distance of the Sun) by dividing by 107.44, the proportion the Sun's actual diameter bears to that of the Earth. Thus we find for July 1 when the Sun is at its greatest distance, the Parallax is 8".803, and on December 31 when the Sun is nearest, the parallax is 9".105.

On the right hand pages of each month are given the phases of the Moon, its Rising, Southing and Setting, with the time of high water at Charlottetown, to the nearest minute of local mean time.

To aid in weather forecasts are added the bearing of the Moon at the times of Full and Change, the Perigee and Apogee, and the times of the Moon crossing the Equator, and reaching its greatest North and South Declination. It having been observed that these periods are generally found accompanied by atmospheric changes more or less marked, as they agree with the times of the Moon's changes and Perigee, ** or *** are appended when two or more of those influences concur within the space of 48 hours.

ECLIPSES.

During the year 1894 there will be four Eclipses, two of the Sun and two of the Moon, of these but one will be visible at Charlottetown:—

(I) A Partial Eclipse of the Moon, March 21st, 1894. Greenwich mean time of opposition 1 h. 27 mins. 18.7 secs. p. m.

(II) An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, April 5th, 1894. Greenwich mean time of conjunction 16 hrs. 27 mins. 39.2 secs. Central line of Moon's shadow passing across Asia from Bombay, Calcutta, China to Behring's Strait.


(III) A partial Eclipse of the Moon September 14th, 1894, Greenwich mean time of opposition 15 hrs. 35 mins. 45.5 secs.

The phases of the Eclipse will be for Charlottetown.—
First contact with Penumbra, Sept. 14th, 9h. 48m., p. m.
" " Shadow, " " 10h. 23m., p. m.
Middle of Eclipse, " " 12h. 19m., m'night
Last contact of Shadow, " " 1h. 14m., a. m.
" " Penumbra, " " 2h. 50m., a. m.
but a very small portion of the disc will be obscured.

(IV) A Total Eclipse of the Sun, September 28th, 1894,
Greenwich mean time of conjunction 18 hrs. 16 mins. 16.7 secs.
The central line of Moon's shadow passing across the Indian
Ocean from Zanzibar to New Zealand.

Transit of Mercury Across the Sun's Disc.

This, the most interesting as well as important astronomical event of the year will take place November 10th, and weather permitting may be observed at Charlottetown. The planet will be seen to enter upon the Sun's disc 93° from the north point toward the east and pass off at N. 55° W. occupying 5h. 17m. 29s. in the passage.



The phases for local mean time will be as follows:—

First External Contact	11h. 43m. 11s., a. m.
" Internal "	11h. 44m. 54s., a. m.
Middle of Transit	2h. 21m. 54s., p. m.
Last Internal Contact	4h. 58m. 57s., p. m.
" External "	5h. 0m. 50s., p. m.

As the sun will set 4h. 28m. the end of the transit will not be observed here.

THE PLANETS.

MERCURY commences the year as a morning star with direct motion (that is from west to east among the fixed stars), and alternately retrograde and direct between the dates Feb. 23rd, March 26th, July 2nd, August 6th, October 15th, and November 26th, and direct till the end of the year. The most favorable time for finding this planet will be as a morning star about the beginning of April, and just after sunset about the end of June.

VENUS will be an evening star till January 23rd, when she will retrograde passing the sun to reappear as a morning star till March 7th, and then direct till the end of the year.

MARS will begin the year as a morning star, with direct motion till November 15th, retrograde till November 22nd, and direct till the end of the year. After his opposition to the sun October 18th, he will be an evening star.

JUPITER will be an evening star with retrograde motion till January 15th; after coming in conjunction with the sun he will appear as a morning star till the end of the year. After Sept. 18th, his motion will be direct. In opposition to the sun Dec. 24th.

SATURN commences the year as a morning star with direct motion, becomes retrograde from February 3rd till June 21st, and direct to the end of the year. After his opposition to the sun, April 14th, he will be an evening star till his conjunction with the sun October 30th, after which he will appear as a morning star.

URANUS begins the year as a Morning Star with direct motion, becoming retrograde from Feb. 17 to July 19, and direct till the end of the year. He will be in conjunction with the Sun May 4.

NEPTUNE begins the year as an Evening Star with retrograde motion; direct from Feb. 20 till the end of the year; comes in conjunction with the Sun June 7th and in opposition Dec. 24.

OCCULTATIONS OF PLANETS BY THE MOON.

There will be but three during the year; of Mercury, April 3, 7h. 23.98s.; Venus, May 1, 7h. 5m. 9s. p. m. and Mars, March 28, 4h. 5m. 17s. a. m.. all in the day time.

TIDES.

The time of High Water at Charlottetown, is given to the nearest minute of local mean time once in 24 hours. To find an intervening tide, all that is needed is to take half the sum of the adjacent tides, before and after, changing morning to afternoon, or the reverse, as required.




2. The phases happening from 4 to 10 p. m., may be followed by fair weather, but this chiefly depends upon the direction of the wind.
