REPORT OF THE KIRK SESSION.

The Kirk Session herewith submit their Annual Statement, from which it will be seen that though there have been no unusual movements in the Christian life and work of the Congregation during the past year, there is cause for gratitude to the Great Head of the Church for His continued mercy.

Numerically the condition of the Congregation has not greatly varied. Twenty-seven families have been removed, while twenty-six have been added, making the present number of families in the Congregation 285.

During the year 6 members have been removed from the Communion Roll by death and 22 by certificate. The Communion Roll has been recently purged, and the Session have removed the names of some on account of prolonged absence from the Communion or departure from the bounds of the Congregation without certificate; for these reasons 36 have been removed, thus giving a total of 64 names removed from the Communion Roll during the year. During the same period there have been received 17 on profession of faith and 19 from other Congregations, in all 36. The number now upon the Communion Roll is 386.

There have been entered on the Registers of the Church 30 baptisms and 28 burials in the course of the year.

The Sabbath Schools have been maintained in their usual efficiency. Upper Town School numbers 201 Scholars and 18 Teachers; Lower Town School numbers 78 Scholars and 9 Teacher. The Pastor's Bible Class, which meets at the same hour as the Sabbath School, 3 p.m., numbers 26. During the year a Sabbath School has been opened under the direction of the Kirk Session at Stewarton. Mrs. Stewart kindly placed at the disposal of the Session an appropriate building for this purpose, toward the furnishing of which the Session granted \$50. Mr. Elliott is Superintendent. The School has been very successful, the number in attendance having risen from 24,—at the opening last summer,—to 66, with a staff of

6 Teachers. There are thus under instructions in the three Sabbath Schools, including the Bible Class, 371, with 34 Teachers.

The funds contributed by the Sabbath Schools for the past year have been \$125.93. This amount is expended in supporting two orphans in India, in adding to the Sabbath School Libraries and in purchase of papers, etc., for the use of the Schools.

A Young Men's Meeting in connection with the Congregation has been held once a fortnight,—on alternate Thursday evenings,—during the winter, for consideration of such religious questions as might naturally interest those who desire to give a reason for the faith that is in them, or who may be enquiring into the doctrines of the Church. The authenticity of the Scriptures, the Divinity of Christ, the Atonement, the Witness of Prophecy to Christ, the Subjects and Mode of Christian Baptism have thus been considered; the Pastor opening with a statement of the grounds upon which the teaching of the Church regarding these subjects is based, and each one present being then at liberty to advance other considerations, whether favourable or adverse. The Session are of opinion that these meetings should be of interest and profit to the young men of the Congregation.

The Weekly Prayer Meeting is held every Wednesday evening in the Lecture Room, one evening each month being especially devoted to the consideration of some branch of Mission work. The average attendance at Prayer Meeting, though far short of what it might be, has been larger during the past year than formerly.

The Ladies' Aid Society have, as in former Seasons, held weekly meetings. During the past year they have realised \$237.53. A detailed statement of their receipts and expenditure is herewith submitted.

The 'Schedule System' introduced by the Session last year for raising funds for the general Mission work of the Church, and for the payment of interest on our own Church loan, has been successfully continued. The Congregation are now familiar with the working of this system. The Session purpose continuing it and hope that it may be attended by still better results. During

the past year \$2,635.96 have been raised by this method, of which \$1,000 have been given to the Schemes of the Church. This amount has been divided in accordance with the wishes of subscribers as expressed in their schedules; when no appropriation was specified on the schedules, the Session allocated the contributions.

The Session would direct the attention of the Congregation to the necessity of increased contributions for the interest fund, as this is a fixed amount for which we are annually liable. The amount contributed for this purpose during the past year would have been inadequate had it not been supplemented by the balance from the preceding year and by part of the ordinary Church revenue. They regret that a number have contributed nothing to any of the Schemes of the Church; and they appeal to all the members of the Congregation to realise their obligations in this matter, so that ample funds may be secured for the payment of our just debts and increasing contributions be given for Home and Foreign Missions and other general Schemes of the Church.

The Session desire to express their gratitude to the District Visitors for their most valuable services in this department of Congregational work. Had it not been for their faithfulness in collecting the contributions of the Congregation our receipts must have fallen far short of the amount realized.

The Session earnestly ask the prayers and co-operation of all members of the Congregation, that God may advance His work in bringing the undecided among us to trust in Christ, and in building up believers in their holy faith, and may lead us, as a people, to honour Him with our substance and to glorify Him by our lives.

The accounts of the Session Fund—derived from the ordinary Sabbath Collections, and of the Special Fund—derived from the Schedule system, are herewith presented.

REPORT OF THE TEMPORAL COMMITTEE.

To the Congregation of St. Andrew's Church.

The Temporal Committee have again to present to you their usual Annual Report which, considering the continued commercial distress in Ottawa, and the consequent difficulties under which they have labored, it is hoped will meet with your approval as shewing as good a financial position as could be expected under such circumstances.

It will be seen from the accounts that the amount collected for pew rents during the past year up to 15th February, is \$3,629.73, or \$158.75 less than last year's collections from that source, and that the rents collected from tenants on the Glebe lot amount to \$597.50, to which add refund from tenants for taxes paid last year, \$65.12, making \$662.62, or \$36.07 more than was received from that property last year.

By a supplementary Statement which accompanies this Report shewing the moneys received and disbursed since the closing of the accounts on the 15th February last it will appear that additional pew rents have been received amounting to \$197, making the total \$3,826.73, also that \$204 more have been received from a Glebe tenant, making the total from that source \$866.62 and that a further sum of \$1,050 has been received from the Kirk Session, which enabled your Committee to remit the interest due to Mr. Murray.

Your Committee in accordance with what was stated in last year's Report have completed the purchase of that part of the Ordinance reserve situate between sub-lot No. 15 on the Glebe lot and the road in front, being a little over three acres, for \$1,278.70, and have also obtained a lease for those parts between said road and the Canal and

on the other side between Elgin Street road and the Canal, for ten dollars a year payable in advance, thus increasing the frontage of the Glebe property and, as a necessary consequence, its value.

To cover the cost of this purchase and assist in paying for the new furnace and the improvements made on the Church grounds, your Committee as authorised by By-law No. 9, which was ratified at the special meeting of this Congregation, held on the 23rd day of July last for that purpose, borrowed on a morgage of the newly acquired property together with sub-lot No. 15, from the Executors of the Estate of the late Mrs. Ogilvie the sum of \$1,500 at eight per cent. interest, the principal payable in ten years.

As to the first and most important item the Temporal Committee should be in a position to remit £210 stg, or say \$1,025.00, on or about the 20th February and August respectively in order to fulfil their engagements.

The interest on the smaller loan requires \$60 to be on hand on the 28th June and 28th December of each year.

There seems but little else in the accounts requiring special mention. Your Committee might enlarge, as has not unfrequently been done before, on the great difficulty in collecting pew rents and the large sum remaining uncollected, but in view of the difficulties already hinted at, the hope is entertained that the Congregation will acquit them of any neglect of duty in regard to this matter, and that all the individual members of the Congregation, who have it in their power, will on their part endeavour in the future to assist the Managing Committee working under such unfavorable circumstances by a prompt compliance with the By-law relating to the payment of pew rents.

It is, after all, matter for congratulation, notwithstanding adverse circumstances, that your Committee have been able to meet all important obligations, if not exactly when due, yet within the year, and that there is more than sufficient to be collected to meet all accounts still standing against them.

In conclusion your Committee feel that the Congregation have much reason to be thankful to the Great Dispenser of temporal and spiritual gifts for his continued favor and blessing.
