Mix thoroughly with spoon and set aside to rise in a warm place one and a half hours. When light, turn out on floured board and sprinkle with five tablespoons sugar and three tablespoons chopped almonds, and work them into the mass by drawing the tips of fingers lightly and quickly through the dough. Do not knead. Then drop by spoonfulls, half inch apart, into greased pans, Let rise ten minutes. Bake in hot oven. This makes two dozen. Process takes about two hours and fifteen minutes.

Verdict in Ross Case.

A verdict was reached in the inquest into the death of Ernest Ross, the deckhand who was drowned off a scow owned by the Norton Griffiths Dredging Company on July 14, in Courtenay Bay, last night, the jury being out thirty minutes. 



London, Aug. 19—If two or three members of even a moderately well-to-do colonial family habitually apent between \$400 and \$8000 on a week's holiday; their acquaintances would be likely think them extravagant. Yet, according to an official of a friendly society in the north with whom the writer talked yesterday, it is quite a common thing for two or three mill-hands in Lancashire belonging to the same family to draw that sum at the beginning of a week's holiday and come back at the end of it with scarcely a copper among them.

Among the mill-hands of Lancashire which is the great cotton-manufacturing district—holiday-making and particularly holiday spending amount to a craze. The mills there closed for a week in August—it is this period that is known as the "wakes," a phrase made famous by Stanley Houghton's much-discussed play—and during this time it seems to be the ambition of the workers to spend as much of their hardly earned savings as possible in "seeing sights" and engaging in other amusements. During the last year, the mills have been working overtime and, consequently the workers have laid up even more money than usual for their annual "bust."







## LEAK DETECTOR SAVES LOSS OF

\$1,000 EVERY DAY Spokane, Wash., Aug. 30—An instrument that is expected to save the city of Spokane \$1,000 every day in the year by preventing a daily loss of 15,000,000 gallons of water from the system of mains, is being set up under direction of Water Superintendent Alexander Lindsay.

It is a new leak detector purchased by the department after a thorough investigation by Lindsay showed that 15,000,000 gallons of water was being lost each day by defects hard to locate in the complex system of underground mains.

"We have just received the instructions for setting up the rather complicated piece of apparatus," Mr. Lindsay said. "The meter is attached to a single lead running into a given district, and all other inlets are cut off. It records every gallon of water sent into the pipes, at the hour pumped.

"Then we trace the flow, and if it is found that much water is going into the district between the hours of 1 a. m. and 1 a. m., when the use of water is at the minimum stage, we can tell that there is a leakage. Then the district is made maller, parts of it being cut off, until by a process of elimination we find just where the section is that is causing the waste.

## SALMON PACK IS THE SMALLEST

Vancouver, B. C., Aug. 30—The main run of sockeye saimon on the Fraser River is over. A large number of the canneries did not operate yesterday and today. Very few fish were delivered.

The final official figures are not yet available, but an approximate official estimate placed the pack on the Fraser at four hundred and eighty thousand cases. Another twenty thousand may be packed in September, which would bring the pack up to half a million cases. This is the smallest of any "big year" for sixteen seasons, when accurate figures commenced to be available. In 1909 the pack was 567,000 on the Fraser, and in the fourth year before that, which makes the "big year" cycle, he pack was 870,000. This season a pack of seven or eight hundred thousand cases was expected, for every year the canneries are better equipped to handle the rush of fish. A strike of fishermen at the opening of the run probably cut off nearly a hundred thousand cases.

Taking the pack throughout all British Columbia this year will go down as among the smallest on record. Northern British Columbia canneries located at Skeens, Naas Rivers, and Rivers International cases of the season and bad, "big years" and small, the average pack has been 180,000 cases, or rather more than a hundred thousand in excess of this year.

Edmonton, Alta., Aug. 30—Every boy and girl over fourteen years of age in the province of Alberta will have an opportunity to gain a general farm education, including stock-judging, dairying, black-smithing, carpentry, the care and operation of machinery and domestic science, in the agricultural schools at Vermilion, Claresholm, and Olds, to be opened on October 28, and similar institutions to be established in other parts of the province. The courses, occupying six months, are free and open to all.

The work of developing the basic industry of Alberta is under the directions of the provincial agricultural education commission, recently appointed by Hon.
