

Board of Audit, 2nd February, 1872.

To the Honorable

SIR FRANCIS HINCKS, C. B., K. C. M. G., Minister of Finance.

The Board of Audit, in presenting to you the Public Accounts to the 30th June, 1871 desires to call your attention to a few points which may require some explanation.

There has always been a difficulty in the accounts of the Post Office Department. arising from the fact that the great bulk, both of the receipts and expenditures of the last quarter of our financial year, does not come into the cash until the first quarter of the next financial year is considerably advanced. As, therefore, we give the actual cash receipts and expenditure of the year, in order to bring this into comparison with the revenue and expenditure accrued during that period, we have always been obliged to bring forward a balance of revenues not collected, and of expenses not paid up to June 30th. This gave rise to many complications, in order to avoid which we have in the present accounts only included in the details that period of 1870-71, the transactions of which are represented in the cash of that year. The consequence is that, whilst the warrants issued, and deposits with the Receiver-General are, as they always have been, the real cash transactions of the financial year, the details only embrace nine months of the country post offices, and eleven months of the city post offices, and no balance is brought This change only affects last year, and next year's accounts will have the details of twelve months of the whole service, viz., the country post offices from March to March, and the city post offices from June to June. It will not in any way interfere with the comparison with other years, as the actual cash transactions are stated as they always have been; but it supersedes the necessity of bringing forward large balances unaccounted for, which are very difficult to verify, and have now been thoroughly revised.

It has always been the practice to charge annually against the Capital Account of the various Public Works all expenditure for permanent additions and improvements, and there has always been a great difficulty in deciding what class of work should be so treated, and what should be charged to Consolidated Fund. Formerly no definite test existed by which to distinguish the two kinds of expenditure; and though for the last eight or ten years much less has been charged against Capital than used to be the case, still there is no doubt that, as will always occur whilst a Capital account remains open, much expenditure has been so treated, which should more properly have been considered chargeable against income. To remedy this Parliament has during the last two years distinguished in its votes what is to be classed as Capital, and what as Consolidated Fund

Expenditure; but expenditure is often taking place on the same work on account of both votes, and it is not always easy to decide how a particular item is to be charged, or upon whom rests the responsibility of making the distinction. We look upon it, therefore, as the greatest improvement in the Public Accounts, which has been introduced for many years, that you should have authorized all the miscellaneous Public Works Expenditure, which had been included under Capital in the Accounts of 1870, to be transferred to Consolidated Fund. The same thing has been done in the Accounts which we now submit. even when there was authority given by Parliament to treat the service otherwise, and the only Public Work which has been included in Capital, is the Intercolonial Railway. It is to be hoped that this system will be continued, and that nothing hereafter, excepting absolutely new works of national importance, will be authorized by Parliament to be charged against Capital. In view of this probable change in our system we would recommend, what has already been frequently reported upon, that there should be a thorough revision of the balances of Public Works as they now stand in the Statement of Affairs, with a view of striking out items which are no longer real assets, and of bringing the existing balances into harmony with the new system.

We have introduced this year, in addition to the statements showing the balances of appropriations written off or carried on, a statement showing in detail for each service the expenditure as against the authorities. From this it will be seen that, excluding the expenditure authorized by General Statutes, the amount voted in the Estimates and brought forward from 1869-70, was \$15,713,454 95, against which was expended only \$9,753,436 95; or excluding three items amounting to \$415 04 in excess of the authority, \$9,753,021 91, leaving a balance of \$5,960,433 04 voted, but not expended. Of this sum balances amounting to \$936,716 39 were carried on by vote of Parliament and Order in Council to the next year, and \$5,023,716 65 nominally lapsed. But as in the Estimates of the current year there was

\$503,427 62, and some portion even of this may perhaps be considered only expenditure deferred. On the other hand the revenues have largely exceeded the Estimates. Even taking the revised Estimates as given in your budget speech in March, when the improving prospects of the year had already become apparent, they have exceeded the Estimate by \$1,975,560 81; and one of the most satisfactory features of this improvement is, that it has not only been experienced in a few special services, but almost every separate head of revenue shews a marked advance upon former years.

The general financial position of the Dominion is best shewn by the Statements which we append to this Report in the same form as those which the Auditor exhibited in a memorandum published with the Accounts of last year. We have added a fourth year since Confederation to these Statements, and the result of the whole period shews that since July, 1867, there has been an expenditure on Capital Account, out of income, of \$6,104,027 58, and that although \$3,640,248 19 of that amount was expended in the year 1870-71, the net debt had for the first time in the history of the Country decreased by \$503,224 80.


