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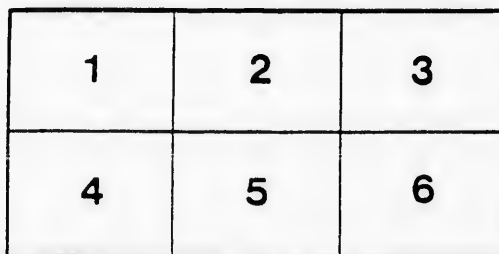
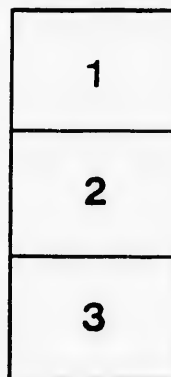
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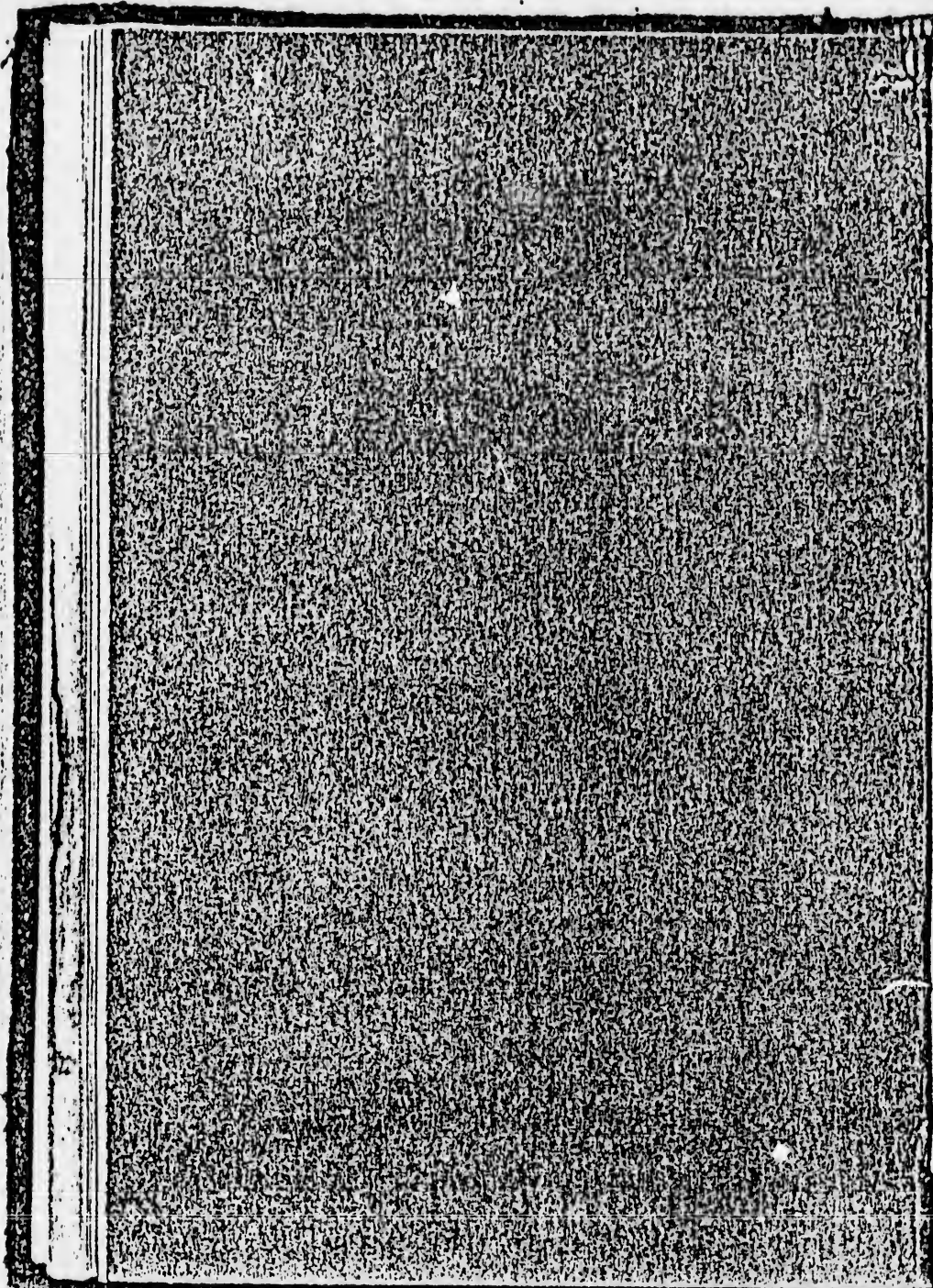

## Daily Programme

Please note that between the time of this programme going to press and opening of Exhibition several features and novelties will be added for which arrangements are now under way.

### Monday, August 27th

**Exhibitors' Day.**—Devoted exclusively to the final preparation of exhibits. All displays must be completed by 6 p.m. The public not admitted this day.

### Tuesday, August 28th

**Opening Day.**—Grounds and buildings open to the public at 8 a.m. The Exhibition will be formally opened at 2 o'clock p.m., in front of the Grand Stand, by the Hon. G. W. Ross, Premier of the Province of Ontario, with appropriate ceremonies, after which will be given the full programme of all the special features engaged for the entire period of the Exhibition, 2,500 Trotting Race, marvelous Marsh in his wonderful cycle diving, Gentry's Great Pony, Dog, Monkey and Elephant aggregation, etc., etc. All special shows about the grounds and all departments except live stock open till 6 p.m. Concerts by the famous Gypsy Hungarian Orchestra in the Main Building and the British-Canadian Band.

**Evening.**—Grand Military Tattoo, Reveille and Bivouac of Troops on the yacht in front of Mateking. Music by the best Military Bands in Canada, inspiring choruses, quartettes, etc., also patriotic solos by Mr. Harold Jarvis. To be given on this night only. Grounds open to the public free on this night after 6 o'clock, but an admission fee to the Grand Stand will be charged.

## Wednesday, August 29th

**School Children's Day.**—All children under 15 admitted this day for 5 cents. Every department open from 8 a.m. till 11 p.m. Judging of all classes of Industrial Exhibits in competition. Fine Arts, Women's and Children's Work, Horticultural Exhibit, etc. All the special features will be given in front of the Grand Stand during the afternoon, and numerous attractions about the grounds. Trained Animal Shows, Boys' and Girls' Bicycle Races, the famous cycling coniques, Three Powers Brothers in their triek bicycling and the big programme of specialities, 250 paces race, etc., etc. Music by the Governor-General's Body Guards and British-Canadian Bands, and the Imperial Hungarian Orchestra.

**Evening.**—Beautiful illumination of the Grounds and Buildings which will be open until 10 p.m. Great entertainment in front of Grand Stand and first presentation of Hand & Teale's great Patriotic Military Pyrotechnical Spectacle "The Siege and Relief of Mafeking," also an original innovation entitled "Soldiers of the Queen" with the most magnificent display of fireworks ever attempted in America. Running races, the Breeders' Stake, 1 1/2 miles; an open handicap race in 1-mile heats.
