EXPLANATIONS
AND
Principal Articles of the Calendar for 1877.

EXPLANATIONS.

All the calculations are reduced to local mean time for Charlottetown, with the exception of the Sun's right ascension and declination, and the equation of time, which are given for the instant of apparent noon.

The various phenomena of the Moon's motions and the Tides, are given to the nearest minute. The bearings of the Moon, at the time of its changes, are given for the purpose of assisting or testing the truth of weather forecasts.

The days of expected atmospheric disturbance are those on which the Moon, in its orbit, crosses the equinoctial line, or attains its greatest north or south declination. When these days fall close upon—within two days—the time of the Moon's change, or perigee, the disturbing influence on the atmospheric tides is proportionally increased. These cases are marked ** or *** according as two or three of these influences are combined, and the more closely these times agree, the stronger and more certain is the disturbance to be expected.

In addition to the general local disturbance on these days, it sometimes happens that the effects of a storm generated within the tropics, may be propagated so as to arrive within two or three days, it having been ascertained that the average rate at which the centre of such storms travel, is about sixteen miles an hour.

ECLIPSES.

There will be five Eclipses during the year, viz: three of the Sun and two of the Moon.

I. A total Eclipse of the Moon, February 27, Greenwich mean time of opposition, 7h 9m 9.5sec.

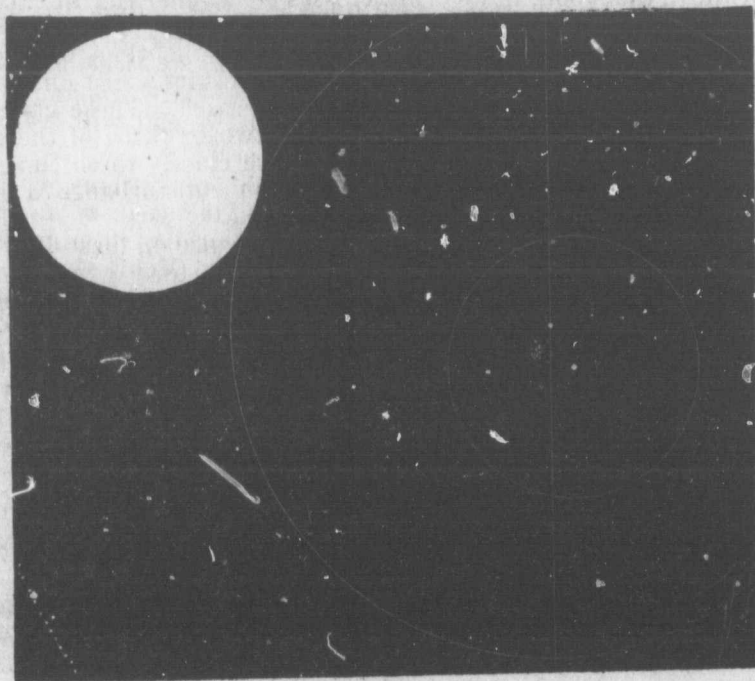
II. A partial Eclipse of the Sun, March 14th, Greenwich mean time of conjunction, 16h 7m 17.3sec.

III. A partial Eclipse of the Sun, August 8. Greenwich mean time of conjunction, 16h 32m 22.4sec.

IV. A total Eclipse of the Moon, August 23. Greenwich mean time of opposition 11h 7m 0.1sec.

V. A partial Eclipse of the Sun, September 7. Greenwich mean time of conjunction, 1h 54m. 52.2s.

Of these the only one visible in Charlottetown is that of the Moon on the 23rd August.

Eclipse of Moon as seen at Charlottetown giving the position of the Moon in the earth's shadow and the penumbra at the time of rising and at 56 minutes past 8 respectively. The star shows the position of the Moon's center at the middle of the Eclipse, and the dotted curve the limit of the penumbra.

PLANETS.

MERCURY.—Apparent motion alternately direct and retrograde between the following dates, when he is stationary, to the east or west of the Sun—January 13, E.; February 7, W.; May 15, E.; June 7, W.; September 13, E.; October 4, W.; he will be in inferior conjunction with the Sun on January 26, May 26, and September 26; in superior conjunction April 6, July 19, and November 13.

VENUS.—Apparent motion direct throughout the year. She will be a morning star till her superior conjunction with the Sun on May 6, after which an evening star till the end of the year; occulted by the Moon on the 8th December; in conjunction with Mercury February 7, March 25, and May 23; with Jupiter January 9, and Nov. 9, and with Saturn on March 15.

MARS.—Apparent motion retrograde from August 6, till October 7, and direct during the rest of the year in opposition to the Sun and coming to the meridian at midnight, September 5; he will be occulted by the Moon May 6; in conjunction with Jupiter March 1: and he will three times pass and repass Saturn July 27, August 25, and November 3.

JUPITER.—Apparent motion retrograde from April 17, till August 20; in opposition to the Sun June 19; beside the conjunction above noted he will be in conjunction with Mercury December 14; his range of motion during the year is about $27\frac{1}{2}$ degrees in

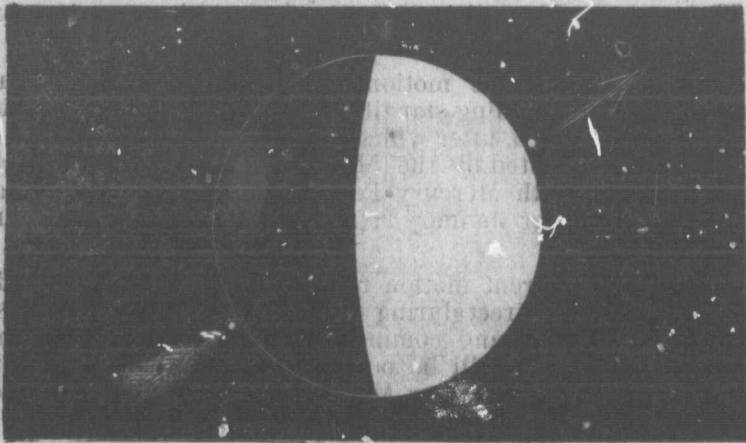
SATURN.—Apparent motion retrograde from July 1 till November 17; in opposition to the Sun September 9; range of motion about $10\frac{1}{2}$ in.

URANUS.—Apparent motion retrograde till April 27; afterward direct till December 4; in opposition to the Sun Feb. 10; in conjunction August 6; range of motion about $8\frac{1}{2}$

degrees in Aries; constellation Leo—Uranus will be occulted by the Moon eleven times during the year, January 2nd and 29, March 25, April 21, June 15, July 12, October 5 and 30, and November 26.

NEPTUNE.—Apparent motion direct between the dates January 12 and August 9; retrograde during the remaining part of the year; he will be in conjunction with the Sun April 24; in opposition October 28; his range of motion during the year about $4\frac{1}{2}$ degrees in the early part of Aries.

Of the thirteen occultations above enumerated, but one will be observable at Charlottetown, namely that of Uranus, on the morning of April 22, the planet disappearing at the dark side of the Moon, about 52° from the south limb at 1h 12m a.m.; reappearing 2h 8m a. m. at the bright side about 69° from the north limb.



Occultation of Uranus by the Moon April 21-22, as observable at Charlottetown (Note in this cut as in all the others the N refers to the direction of the Polar Star or earth's axis, and not the Zenith.

Uranus is not discernable, especially under the rays of the Moon, without the aid of a telescope.

The other occultations occur either in the day time or when the Moon is below horizon; some appear only as near approaches from our point of view the calculations being made with reference to the earth's centre.

Thus, on January 29-30, Uranus will appear almost to touch the Moon's disc without immersion about 25° from the south limb towards the west; and on December 8 at the time of Moon setting Venus will be seen distant about a third of the Moon's diameter on the darkest side 75° from the south limb.

POTATO PIE.—A savory potato pie is made thus: A layer of mashed potatoes placed in a pie dish, and then slices of any cold meat (if chicken or veal, slices of ham or tongue may be added), and herbs, pepper, and salt sprinkled over to taste. Continue those layers alternately till the dish is full; the potatoes must well cover the top, which should have some butter added, and be brushed over with the yolk of an egg, and put into the oven till done through. A little butter on each layer is needed if the meat is not fat, and it should not be too fat.

MINCE PIES.—One pound of beef suet chopped very fine, one pound of raisins, stoned and chopped, one pound of currants, well washed and dried in a cloth, one pound of apples, chopped, one pound of white sugar powdered, one ounce of citron candied, one ounce lemon peel candied, the rinds of two lemons grated, the juice of one, a very little salt, mace, cinnamon, allspice, and cloves (ground) to taste (about one half ounce mixed in equal parts). Add a pint of raspberry vinegar, into which has been melted, by scalding, a small jar of currant jelly. Mix well, and keep covered in a cool, dry place. It will be ready for use in twenty-four hours.

RAISED NUT CAKES.—Make a sponge over night, with one quart of new milk, and half a cake of dry yeast, dissolved in a gill of water. In the morning, if it is light, add half a pint of butter, a pound of sugar, three eggs, half a nutmeg, half a teaspoonful of soda, a little salt, and flour enough to make a dough somewhat stiff. Knead well and set to rise. Let it get *very light* and then mould, and put it into a pan, thoroughly buttered. When very light, again turn the pan.

SUPERLATIVE MINGE PIES, No. 1.—Rub with salt and mixed spices a fat bullock's tongue, let it lie for three days, and parboil, mince and scrape it. Mince separately three pounds of Zante currants, picked, plumped, and dried; a dozen of lemon pippin apples, pared and cored; and one pound of blanched almonds, with a few bitter ones. Mix the mince, and add half a pound of candied citron and orange peel minced, and an ounce of best cinamon and cloves, with the juice and grated rind of three or four lemons, one half ounce of salt, the same quantity of allspice, and one-quarter of a pound of fine sugar pounded. Moisten with one quart of fresh sweet cider, boiled with a pint of golden syrup, and a pint of orange flower water.

STATISTICS, &c., RELATING TO P. E. ISLAND.

Prince Edward Island contains an area of about 1,250,000 acres, nearly all of which is fit for cultivation. It is divided into three Counties, 67 Townships, and 15 Electoral Districts. The population, by the census of 1871, is 94,021, of whom about 42,651, are in Queen's County. The population of Prince County is 28,022; and of King's County, 23,068. Charlottetown, the Capital of the Island, is in Queen's County, and contains about 8807 inhabitants; Georgetown and Royalty, 1056; and Summerside and Township No. 17, 3,562. The House of Assembly is composed of 30 members, and the Legislative Council of 13, all of whom are elected by the people. The Executive Council is limited to nine members. Responsible Government was granted in 1851. The number of Public Schools now in operation is nearly 400, attended by about 19,000 children. In 1852, when the present Free Education Act was passed, the number was 160. There are besides the Prince of Wales College (public,) St. Dunstan's College, Christian Brothers and other schools, (Roman Catholic,) the Protestant Academy, St. Peters School, a County Grammar School in Georgetown and Summerside, and sixteen similar Schools throughout other parts of the Island. The whole cost of public instruction, which is under the control of a Board of Education, consisting of nine Members and two Examiners, is defrayed out of the Provincial Treasury. There is a School Visitor for each County, who reports to the Board, and the latter to the

Government. In 1871 an Act passed the Legislature, authorizing the Government to construct a line of Railway from Alberton to Georgetown, with branch lines to Souris and Tignish. This Road—measuring about 200 miles—was completed and handed over to the General Government of Canada, in December 1874. On the first day of July, 1873, the Island entered the Union, and became part of the Dominion of Canada. In the Session of 1875 was passed “The Compulsory Land Purchase Act,” by which a Court was created for assessing a just value for each Proprietor's estate, which value being found, the estate became the property of the Government.
