The Boston Herald gives this account of the matter: "When the treaty of 1815 restored to France the territory of Guiana, which Portugal had seized in 1808, a mixed commission was appointed to study the question of the disputed borderland. But the commission never met, and when, in 1841, France acknowledged Brazil as the legitimate heir of all the rights of Portugal the greaty between the two powers was based on the principle of reciprocal nonaction as to the territory in dispute.
