Britain Answers Germany

"If the combined fleets of Great Britain and France can prevent it, no commodities of any kind, except those now on the seas, shall henceforth, until the conclusion of the war, reach or leave the shores of Germany."

The establishment of a virtual blockade of hostile countries is the plan of the Allied Governments for the regulation of shipping to and from ports of hostile nations. This contemplates the prevention of commodities of every kind reaching or leaving these ports, without, however, involving risks to neutral vessels or their crews.
