Council, held at Harriston, on the 25th
Dec, the By-law granting a bonus of \$15,
000 to the T. G. & B. R. was read a third
time and passed, and the agreements
mutually signed by the Company and
the Receiver.

A GOOD BUSINESS.—The Harriston

tion.

From 27th of November to the
30th December the quantity of freight
forwarded was 963,614 lbs, and the
quantity of freight received 821,241.
For the same period the number of pas-
sengers from Harriston was 621. This is
a very hopeful exhibit.

Guelph Township Mutual Fire In- surance Company.

The annual meeting of the above
Company was held at Blythe's Hotel,
Morden, on Saturday the 6th. Mr Blyth
was appointed chairman. The following
report was read by the Secretary:—

ANNUAL REPORT.

The Directors in presenting their An-
nual Report congratulate the members
upon the prosperous condition of the
Company. The only loss sustained by
the Company during the year was the
household furniture and clothing of Mr
Robert Harvey, insured for \$100, which
was duly paid at the time.

During the year there has been prop-
erty insured to the extent of \$80,900.
Of this amount about \$65,000 has been
renewals of policies expiring, and
\$15,900 by the admission of a number of
new members. The amount of Premium
Notes received on the above property in-
sured is \$3,851 50, and the cash pay-
ments on the same is \$149 36. The total
property insured by the Company at this
date is \$261,000, and the amount of Pre-
mium Notes held by the Company is
\$12,453 40. They also submit the fol-
lowing Financial Statement, which shows
the sum of \$441 35 to the credit of the
Company.

The Directors would particularly draw
the attention of the members to the fol-
lowing statement:

It is now about twelve years since the
first formation of the Company, and dur-
ing that period there have been only two
assessments made upon the Premium
Notes of 5 per cent each, in addition to
the 4 per cent upon the issue of each
Policy every three years, this latter
payment being required to meet the in-
cidental expenses of the Company. But to
show in a more particular way the cost
to members who had been insured in the
Company for the period of 12 duration.
The following Policy covering \$2,000
of insurance. There has been paid in all

Prussian Immigrants.

On Saturday night about 30 German
immigrants, mostly married men with
families, arrived in Guelph by the Great
Western Railway. The men were for
the most part soldiers in the Prussian
army, were through the late war, and
managed after their discharge to get out
of the country and come to America. We
are sorry to say that on their arrival they
came into town, tried to get in at some
of the German taverns, and though will-
ing to pay their way were refused ac-
commodation. Mr. John Hower, of the
Western Hotel, generously took six or
seven of them, a few were accommodated
in other places, and the rest had to
go back to the station and sleep all
night in a coal car, with the thermo-
meter at some degrees below zero and
nothing to eat. We cannot too strongly
condemn the conduct of those tavern
keepers, who under the circumstances
should have striven a point to give
these poor but industrious and respect-
able strangers accommodation. Mr.
Ernest Hornbostel, a generous coun-
tryman of theirs, living in town, on hear-
ing of their condition, interested him-
self in their behalf, and this morning
brought the matter under the notice of
Mr. Higginbotham, chairman of the
Benevolent Committee, who at once
took steps to provide those who could
not pay their way with food and lodg-
ing at the expense of the Town. These
emigrants are intelligent, respectable
people, who only require a start in the
country to make them valuable citi-
zens. Most of them intend to settle in
Guelph Township, where a large num-
ber of their countrymen are already liv-
ing about Paisley Block.

J. Fisk Assassinated

EDW. S. STOKES THE ASSASSIN

The Assassin a Prisoner!

GREAT EXCITEMENT!

NEW YORK, Jan. 6.—James Fisk, jr.,
was shot twice—once in the breast and
once in the abdomen—by Edward Stokes,
at the Grand Central Hotel, about twenty
minutes past four, this afternoon.

At 4:30 p. m. a carriage stopped oppo-
site the entrance to the Grand Central
Hotel; it containing Fisk and a compan-
ion. The former alighted and entered
the hotel for the purpose of proceeding
to his rooms, and as he ascended the
first step Stokes came out of an adjoining
passageway, and unperceived by Fisk,
unbuttoned his coat, drew a revolver, and
rapidly discharged three shots at Fisk,
The first lodged in Fisk's shoulder,
the second whistled close by his hand,
and the third, with more fatal direction,
took effect in his abdomen, inflicting a
mortal wound. Fisk at once staggered
and fell, while Stokes, casting a
look of hatred on the prostrate
form of his victim, said in a savage
tone—"I have done for the son
of a b— this time." Fisk evidently
recognized his assailant before falling,
but made no remark. Immediately after
the shots had been fired the hotel em-
ployees rushed to the scene, and while
some cared for the wounded man others
seized Stokes, who seeing that escape was
impossible made no resistance, and was
promptly handed over to the police.
Fisk was quickly conveyed to his room,
where the surgeon of the hotel, Dr.
Fisher, was in attendance upon him,
meanwhile telegraphic messages were
sent for further surgical aid, and for the
friends of Fisk. The scene at the hotel
after the shooting was one of extraordi-
nary excitement. Crowds coming from
the matines of the various theatres
hearing of the occurrence, thronged the
corridors of the hotel, eagerly discussing
the event and making inquiries about
the particulars of the outrage. The of-
ficers who arrested Stokes conveyed him
to the 15th precinct police station, where
he is now lodged in a cell.

When he had accomplished his ter-
rible act, Stokes leisurely descended the
main stairs to the hotel and went into
the bar-room. He had thrown the re-
volver on a sofa in the ladies' parlor as
he passed by. He spluttered to a news-
stand and bending over the counter, said
to Mr Davidson the man in charge, "I
have been insulted. There has been a
man shot above stairs, you had better
send for a doctor." He was very pale,
but did not show any agitation or fear.
He then left the news-stand, and walked
across to the bar as if to take a drink,
but apparently changed his mind for he
sat down in a chair.

The excitement amid the crowd all
night at the hotel exceeds description.
All were unanimous in condemnation of
the cowardly assassination.

New York, Jan 7, 1 p. m.—James Fisk,
jr., died this morning, at 10:45, at the
Grand Central Hotel.

New York, Jan 7.—The feeling through-
out the city regarding the Fisk tragedy
is more intensified than ever. Stokes
has frequently stated that he was afraid
of being assassinated by some of Fisk's
employees, and has shown a revolver
which he carried to defend himself if
attacked. The quarrel between the two
men has been very much embittered by
the woman Mansfield, who has served to
kindle the ember of the feud whenever it
was dying out. Fisk's will was made
by him last night. It was drawn by
David Dudley Field, and was dictated
under a painful state of mind. Mrs.
Hooker, his sister, receives one hundred
thousand dollars in Narragansett Steam-
ship Co's shares; his father and mother
receive three thousand dollars a year
each; to each of the Misses Morse he
bequeathed two thousand a year; to the
Ninth Regiment eleven thousand dollars;
to his wife he bequeathed the balance of
his property of all kinds; to Jay Gould,
for whom he entertained the warmest
and most disinterested friendship, he left
his personal effects, and left to him the
labor of love, as it is called in the will,
of carrying out all his (Fisk's) projects in
regard to public improvement.

WELLAND COUNTY.—We understand
that the leading Reformers of Welland
have concluded to recommend the with-
drawal of the petition against Mr. Mc-
Callum, and that gentlemen will there-
fore have an opportunity of displaying
his profound wisdom from Opposition
benches for some time to come. This
action (says the Globe) on the part of the
Reformers was taken mainly in conse-
quence of the tedious nature of the scru-
tiny of the voters' lists rendered neces-
sary by the somewhat remarkable deci-
sion of the Judges of the Queen's Bench.

They have had in Paris what we
call a "cold snap," and we trust that
one effect of it may be to cool the feverish
revolutionary blood of the unfortunate
city. There was a big snow-storm, con-
tinuing at intervals for two days; the
Rauumur thermometer went down to 21o
below the lowest point reached since
1772. The thoroughfares were so slip-
pery that the horses could not draw their
loads, and carts and carriages were
abandoned in great numbers in the
streets. Seventy arms and legs were
broken, there were eight hundred serious
falls and two men were killed.

THE PAST AND PRESENT.

At the nomination for this Riding last week, among the many youthful Reformers who are now vigorously fighting the battles of their party, we noticed not a few grey-haired men—veterans in the good cause—who through the growing infirmities of age have been obliged to resign the heavier share of the work to their younger associates, but who are yet as keenly alive, and as zealous for the success of the party as they were when they stood the brunt of the battle. It was extremely interesting to hear those aged Reformers recall the political reminiscences of the past, and hear them contrast the experiences of Reformers in the present day with those of twenty-five or thirty years ago. Now it is all plain sailing. We have been accustomed for years to look upon this Riding of South Wellington as the very stronghold of Reform. Our contests—when we have any—are comparatively easy—our triumphs are and decisive. But it was otherwise in days gone by. Those were the days that tried men's souls—at least Reformers. These were the times when the old hated Family Compact was tyrannous and strong—when intimidation, bribery and corruption were openly practiced with the most unblushing effrontery, when Toryism was fashionable and basked in the sunshine of official favour, when a Reformer was a synonym for all that was vile and low, when women were brought up in open daylight by high officials to vote for the Tory candidate, when it was counted a commendable feat to break up a Reform meeting with organized bands of rowdies, and when to rotten egg a poor Reformer was as sweet incense in the nostrils of those who upheld the powers that be. To be a Reformer in those days required no small amount of courage, steadfastness and faith in the future. The handful of them that thirty years ago—and less—fought and worked and even suffered for their principles have dwindled down to a few, but they have lived to see their fondest hopes realized. From a small minority they have seen the Reform party grow to an overwhelming majority. They have lived to see a strong and able Reform Government formed. They have lived to see a member of that Government returned by acclamation. They have lived to see the day when the Reform party has gained a complete ascendancy and when Reform principles are to be fully carried into effect.

We are too apt in this busy age—when men often manage their politics as well as their business at fever heat—to forget the veterans of bygone days, to ignore the men who have been the main-stay of the party in former years, and who have zealously worked and anxiously watched and waited for its ultimate success. We are satisfied it is not because we do not appreciate their labours, but because in the rapid rush of events these labours and the men who performed them have been pushed out of sight. It is well, however, to recall the past occasionally, and it is a duty the younger Reformers of this Riding owe to their aged associates to recognize their services, and in the hour of victory to hail them as brave soldiers, who bravely faced the enemy in their youth, and though oft repulsed, never threw down their arms, or turned their back on the foe. All honour say we to our grey-haired Reformers. Let them have the chief place at our meetings, the seat of honour at our festive gatherings, that their presence and example may incite their younger comrades to uphold the standard of Reform as valiantly as they did, and that their experience and wisdom may guide their counsels in the future.

Mr. McKellar Elected by Acclamation.
Over three hundred electors, from all parts of the County, were present at the nomination for the County of Bothwell, which took place on Saturday, and the greatest enthusiasm was manifested by the electors in greeting the Hon. A. McKellar, who has the entire confidence of his constituents. Mr. McKellar was the only one nominated, and after waiting the usual time, he was declared elected by acclamation.

Angus Nicholson, of Toronto, special emigrant agent to the Highlands of Scotland, for the Dominion, is about to leave for the old country.

McDougall's Speculation and what Became of It.

The St. Catharines Times is responsible for the following:—

Just a few days before the downfall of Sandfield & Co. Mr. McDougall in the name of his son-in-law, Captain Seymour, made application for a Crown Patent conveying to the said son-in-law a tract of land covering the Silver Islet mines—worth at least a million dollars. The price to be paid by McDougall & Co. was merely nominal. Sandfield affirmed the swindle and on the very day that he sent in his resignation the papers were being made out by the Department Clerks. Fortunately a gentleman who had an interest in the present Mining Company then got wind of it and informed Mr. Blake of the affair. The new Premier at once countermanded the order and saved the country from one of the hugest swindles ever perpetrated by a corrupt set of rulers. Poor McDougall for some days after the inauguration of the new order of things looked the sickest man in Toronto and tried in every possible way to lobby his "little matter" through, but it was no go. The job was buried and the C. B. is now no doubt bewailing the uncertainty of putting his trust in a corrupt Patent Combination Government.

CAN'T DO IT.—The friends of the late Patent Combination are attempting to raise a cry against the appointment of Mr. Scott to the Crown Lands, by saying that Mr. Galbraith, who has been a staunch Reformer, has been passed over in favor of Mr. Scott, who heretofore was associated with Sandfield's Government, but the attempt to raise bad feelings is a dead failure.

THE HOUSE OF LORDS.—Leading English journals, on both sides of politics, are preparing the public mind for the next great Reform, viz:—A reform of the House of Lords. It seems already conceded that the principal change to be introduced will be the creation of life peerages. But a few years ago this was violently opposed by the defenders of ancient privileges, and the "strong Government" of the day had to give way to the pressure, in the case of Lord Wensleydale. The times are somewhat changed now, however, and it is admitted that the constitutional objections formerly taken are not likely to be insisted on with much effect.


