STILL INSINUATING THE DISTRICT.
We think there is very little doubt in the minds of most unprejudiced people that the "night owl" insinuating the district of the Victoria Diocese is the result of Mr. Mollister's recent publication by charging the abstract with whole-sale political disloyalty is not calculated to advance the cause of the party in Victoria Diocese at all. THE CHANNEL TUNNEL.
The annual discussion in the Imperial House of Commons on the bill providing for the construction of a tunnel between England and France took place on the 21st ultimo, on Sir Edward Watkin's motion for the second reading. In the course of his speech Sir Edward stated that France had already spent £20,000 on preliminary works. A vigorous discussion took place. The chief ground of opposition to the proposal was that in case of war between France and England the tunnel would prove dangerous and would weaken the defensive position of England. The supporters of the bill pointed out that the tunnel was intended as an invasion by means of the tunnel was an impossibility. The vote stood for the second reading 167 against, 309; majority, 142, exclusive of tellers.
