"On July 1 of this year," said Frank Greens, managing editor of Bradstreet's, "the amount of available reserve wheat in this country and Canada was within 2900 [885. The amount held east of the Rocky Mountains was the smallest since 1889, al-heavier than in any of the preceding 14 years.
