NINETEENTH ANNUAL REPORT  
OF  
THE MANAGERS OF  
THE PROTESTANT ORPHANS' HOME  
AND FEMALE AID SOCIETY.

---

In presenting their Nineteenth Annual Report, the Ladies managing the Orphans' Home and Female Aid Society, Toronto, desire to express their deep sense of gratitude to Almighty God for the many mercies vouchsafed to the inmates of the Institution during the past year; and especially for the general health enjoyed by them during that period.

Within the year ending this day there have been admitted twenty-nine children; twelve have been removed by friends; three have been apprenticed; three have been adopted and two have run away: leaving at the present time 95 children in the Institution, 60 boys and 35 girls.

The Managers again avail themselves of this opportunity to thank Dr. Ogden for his continued attention and unremitting kindness to the inmates of the Home.

They also gladly avail themselves of this opportunity to express their obligations to M. R. Vankoughnet, Esq., who for many years past has kindly acted as their solicitor, and who, the Managers thankfully learn, has recovered from his late very serious illness.

It is an annual privilege, of which the Managers gladly avail themselves, to express to Miss Wheelright, the Matron, to Miss Scott, the Governess and to the others, to whom the care of the children has been entrusted, their deep sense of the satisfactory manner in which they have discharged their arduous duties.

The members of the Loyal Orange Association to whom 'the Home' has been so greatly indebted in past years, have agreed, with their usual liberality, to give their donations towards the payment (\$1,000) of the land purchased in 1860 from W. W. Baldwin, Esq., and on which the sum of \$201 still remains due. This diversion from the ordinary means at the disposal of the ladies to meet the constantly occurring expenses of "the Home," of the liberal contributions of their kind friends, the Orangemen,

calls upon the other friends of the Institution to redouble their exertions to make up for the time, that which has been thus diverted from feeding, clothing and educating the orphan children entrusted to them.

Thanks are due and hereby tendered to Capt. Milloy, of the steamer City of Toronto, for a free trip to Niagara, of which a large number of the inmates of the Home thankfully availed themselves. To Capt. Sautler for free trips on his steamer to the Island, which the children greatly enjoyed.

Alderman Hallam and his kind friends, again invited the children to a "Christmas dinner" last winter, when the children of "the Home" in common with those of the other charities in the city, were regaled with roast beef and plum pudding and were presented with gifts from a splendid Christmas tree.

The Directors of the Northern Railway have again placed the Managers of the Home under deep obligation by not only bringing down wood for the Institution at a reduced rate, but also by allowing their agent at Lefroy to purchase the wood on favorable terms for the Home: and the ladies desire to express their obligations to Messrs. Hendrie, Shedden & Burns for having kindly carted the same to "the Home" free of charge.

The Lady Managers again desire to express their indebtedness to the butchers, market-gardeners, bakers and confectioners of the city for their continued and continual remembrance of the orphans under their care.

The Managers desire to return thanks to those ladies and gentlemen who exerted themselves so successfully in various ways during the past year to replenish their greatly reduced finances, and to the public for the generous manner in which they responded to the appeals made to them.

Compelled by the large numbers in the institution, (sometimes one hundred) who occupy every available space in the building, to consider what their excellent medical adviser could do in case infectious diseases should break out in the Home, and having had their attention seriously drawn to this important subject by Dr. Ogden, the Managers have resolved upon building an infirmary into which children attacked by infectious diseases could be removed, thus preventing the disease spreading, and for this purpose have \$626 48 in hand. As the building will cost at least \$1,400, they confidently appeal to a generous public for the balance required for the erection of so necessary an appendage to an institution, where one hundred children are sometimes crowded together.

They also have much pleasure in stating, that through the kindness of the Clergy and Laity of the Church Synod and their friends, they have been enabled to purchase a Harmonium for the benefit of the children, at an expense of \$100; \$53 of which was contributed, as above mentioned, by the Clergy, &c., and the balance collected by the Matron.

## PRINCE ARTHUR AND THE HOME.

The children of the Home presented H. R. H. Prince Arthur with a paid of socks, knitted in scarlet wool, with coronet and initials embroidered upon them, a book marker representing the rose of England, and an embroidered presentation card, all the work of inmates of the institution, for which an acknowledgment was received from Col. Elphinstone.

The Very Rev. ARCHDEACON read the following letter :

“ROSE MOUNT, Montreal, February 28, 1870.

“Colonel Elphinstone is desired by H. R. H. Prince Arthur to acknowledge the receipt of the pretty worked stockings, book-marker and address in needlework presented to His Royal Highness by the children of the Protestant Orphans' Home at Toronto.

“His Royal Highness is much pleased with this mark of attention, and would be glad if a whole holiday could be granted to the children.”

The Treasurer's statement of monies received ; the various sources from whence they were received ; the objects for which monies have been paid out, and the amount in hand is annexed, all of which is respectfully submitted.
