## CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

OF THE

## PROVINCE OF QUEBEC RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

## CONSTITUTION.

As Revised 5th May, 1881.

- 1. That this Association be called the "Province of Quebec Rifle Association," and shall have for its object the encouragement of rifle shooting in the Province.
- 2. Any person subscribing two dollars to the funds of the Association shall be a member thereof for the year in which such subscription shall be made.
- 3. A donation of twenty dollars in cash, at any one time, for that express purpose, or of a prize of not less value than forty dollars, to be competed for at the annual prize meeting, shall make the donor eligible for election as a life member at next an nual meeting of Council.
- 4. Any regularly constituted Rifle Association or Corps subscribing ten dollars or upwards, per annum, to the funds of the Association shall be considered as being in connection with it and shall be entitled to a number of memberships, for competition only, in proportion of one for every dollar so subscribed. The Association thus affiliating is to select from its members the persons to hold such memberships.
- 5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons, named by the Council. (The Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Quebec for the time being, shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron.")

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- 6. There shall be a President, to be elected at the annual business meeting of the Association.
- 7. There shall be four Vice-Presidents—one for each Brigade Major's Division—to be elected in the same manner as the President.
  - 8. There shall be a Council composed as follows, viz:

1st. Two members from each Brigade Major's Division, to be elected annually at the business meeting.

2nd. One representative member from each affiliated Association or Corps in this Province.

- 9. The President, Vice-Presidents, the District Deputy Adjutants-General of Militia and Brigade Majors, of the Province of Quebec, shall be members "ex-officio" of the Council. Five members of Council shall form a quorum, and in the event of vacancies occurring in the elective members, from any cause whatever, the remaining members of the Council shall have the power of filling such vacancies. All members of Council, excepting representatives of affiliated Associations, must be individual members of the Association.
- 10. Representatives to the Council shall be chosen by the Associations they represent, and the names of delegates when changed shall be sent to the Secretary at least one month prior to the annual meeting.
- 11. The Council shall, at its first meeting, choose from its members a chairman.
- 12. There shall be a Secretary and a Treasurer, both to be appointed annually by the Council, and holding office during pleasure.
- 13. The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be an-

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ncome yearly a perbe annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts or deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

- 14. The Council shall be regulated in their proceedings by such by-laws as may from time to time be enacted by them; no by-law being in any case altered or new one proposed, without at least one month's notice of such intention being given to each member of Council.
- 15. The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held at such time and place as may be determined on by the Council, and the prizes shall be competed for in accordance with such regulations as may be passed from time to time by the Council.
- 16. An Annual Report, embracing an audited account of the finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, and shall (having been previously submitted to the Council) be published as soon after the prize meeting as may be found practicable.
- 17. An Annual Business Meeting of the members of the Association, for the election of Officers and Council, who shall assume office on first day of succeeding January, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at such time and place as may be determined on by the by-laws.
- 18. No alteration in the Constitution shall be made, except by a resolution duly passed at the annual business meeting or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed, unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof shall have been given to the Secretary one month at least previous to the annual business meeting, at which the same is to be proposed, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all members of the Association of such proposed amendments, and also to post them on the bulletin board at the opening of the annual matches.

## BY-LAWS.

As Revised 5th May, 1881.

- 1. The Annual Business Meeting of the Association shall be held on the second day of the annual matches.
- 2. There shall be two ordinary meetings of Council, the first of which shall be held immediately after the annual business meeting of the Association, and the second at such other time as the Council may then determine upon.
- 3. Extraordinary meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required, by any six members of the Council; notification being sent to each member of Council at least ten days previous to such meeting, and the requisition for the meeting and the notices to the members must state the object or objects of such extraordinary meetings.
- 4. The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary, open to the inspection of all members of the Council, and published with the annual report.
- 5. There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council, to be chosen at their first meeting.
- 6. The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time, in such chartered bank as the Finance Committee may direct, all sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association.
- 7. All expenditure for current expenses, which may be required by the Secretary, must be authorized by the signature of a member of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner. Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.
- 8. A detailed statement of all Receipts and Expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer.

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#### THE SEVENTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

## PROVINCE OF QUEBEC RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

The past year has been one of unusual difficulty, owing to causes which are well known; but on the whole we have succeeded better than was at one time anticipated.

#### SUGGESTIONS OF LAST YEAR.

To begin with the suggestions of last year; we regret to report that we have not yet obtained the Provincial Grant, all efforts in that direction having been unsuccessful.

The new offices at the ranges, though much needed, could not be built this year, through lack of funds.

The question of drains was not proceeded with by the Corporation, as anticipated last spring.

The improving of the ranges and the care of targets was settled by the spring floods injuring both the fixed works and portable targets.

In consequence of the extensive damage by the floods, the Government undertook to restore the ranges, which was proceeded with under the supervision of Lieutenant-Col. Kennedy, Montreal Engineers, and finished in a most substantial manner. He made some improvements to the wooden targets and they worked this year as well as could be desired.

#### FINANCES.

As will be seen from the financial statement, the collections from the General Public in aid of the Association are reduced. A circular was sent out and other means were used but our success was small. One special reason for our want of success was owing to the collections for aid to the families of the Volunteers in the North-west and subscriptions for the reception on their return, a certain proportion of which would probably have come to us.

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Our affiliations memberships are also reduced this year, as well as the Individual Memberships, and some consideration should be given as to what means should be taken to increase the membership.

The assets of the Association are represented by the Portable Property as per list, which includes 3446 Rounds of Snider Ammunition English Mark IX, and 60 Rounds Martini Henry, and cash in the Bank \$24.58.

#### PRIZE MEETING.

The Special Committee charged with the arrangements for the meeting, considered fully the various changes suggested, and finally decided on issuing a Prize List very similar to that of the previous year, leaving out one match and reducing some of the prizes.

There were 11 matches, 319 Individual and 22 Team prizes amounting to \$1650, in cash, and 29 prizes in kind, besides 5 Cups, 6 Medals and the Champion Badge.

The Range officers were Lieutenant-Col. Worsley and Major LeSueur. The timing and statistics being kept by Lieut.-Col. Fraser, everything ran smoothly and the whole meeting was very satisfactory.

The Cups were won as follows, viz:-

Accident Cup, finally by the Royal Scots Team, with 487 pts.

Dolan Cup, by Pvt. D. Smith, R. S., "93 "

Steward Cup, by Col. Sergt, Waters, 6 F. "61 "

Markers were again brought from Ottawa, did their work well, and gave no trouble to the Executive.

The Expected Public Presentation of Prizes, could not take place, much to our disappointment, a good committee had charge of this matter, but owing to the absence from town of several of its members, it was found impossible to make the necessary arrangements this year. Owing to numerous complaints from different parts of the Province, of the quality of the D. C.

spec 2nd—The p Ammunition, it was decided to obtain a supply of English mark IX, which we succeeded in doing, through the kindness of Lieut. Col. Macpherson, general storekeeper, Ottawa.

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#### D. C. R. A.

As usual, we were fully represented at the Dominion Rifle Association meeting in Ottawa, but failed to obtain the much coveted Provincial Cup, though, as individuals, the representatives from the Province did very well.

We would suggest that the Team to represent the Province, in the competition for the London Merchants Cup, should be chosen from the highest aggregates at Annual Prize Meeting in August, and that an inducement should be added to the prize list, in the shape of free tickets to Ottawa, to the ten highest aggregates who attend the D. R. A. meeting.

#### THANKS.

Our thanks are due to His Excellency the Governor-General for the gift of his two Medals Silver and Bronze, also to his Honor the Lieut.-Governor of the Province, for a handsome Silver Medal, donated by him.

We have also to thank those friends who continued their subscriptions.

#### COMPETITORS' MEETING.

At their special meeting of which a report will be found at page 18, some suggestions were made which are worthy of careful consideration, the prize meeting being organised for them, it should be carried out, as far as practical, in a manner to meet their wishes.

#### Suggestions.

Following the course of the last two or three years, some suggestions might be submitted for the consideration of the incoming committee:

1st-Our collections ought to be improved in some way and a special committee appointed to consider this question.
2nd—The public presentation of prizes should again be attempted.

- 3rd—Some means should be taken to shorten the time of the prize meeting if the old prize list cannot be restored.
- 4th—Some better means should be taken for the care of the association property.
- 5th—That the association should dispense with the sale of ammunition during the matches.
- 6th—That the Provincial Team should be chosen from the aggregates at the August meeting.
- 7th—That ten tickets to Ottawa, be given to the highest aggregates attending the D. R. A. meeting.
- 8th—That sighting and fouling shots be abolished, and extra series matches added to the programme to make up the loss of revenue.

The minutes of the ex-Committee meeting, 16th Feby. were read and confirmed.

The Secretary read a letter from Captain Balfour, 8th Batt. R. R., resigning his position in the Association.

Moved by Capt. Hood, seconded by Lt.-Col. Fraser.

That the Council of the P. Q. R. A. in accepting the resignation of Capt. Balfour of the position which he held with so much credit to himself and benefit to the Association, desire to place upon record their appreciation of the many valuable services rendered by Captain Balfour, and the general regret of the council at the loss of so active a member.

Carried unanimously.

Resolved.—That the annual prize meeting for 1885 be held on the Point St. Charles Ranges, during the week commencing Tuesday 11th August next. The prize list to be limited to \$1,700. The Executive Committee, to draw up the programme and carry out the matches, was appointed, viz:—Lt.-Cols. Van Straubenzie, Martin, Fletcher, Fraser and Scott; Majors Bond, Blaiklock and Mudge, Capt.
