At ten a. m. the Attorney General, in answer to his Honor, said he was ready to proceed in the criminal case of the Crown against Joseph Maher...

The indictment was then read by the Clerk of the Peace, S. Thomson, Esq., charging Joseph Maher the prisoner, with having on the 25th of March, 1879, murdered one William Connick in New Brunswick...

The Attorney General, for the Crown, then addressed the jury, saying it was unfortunate that such a crime as the prisoner was charged with had been committed...

The Grand Jury then retired and witnesses in the Criminal case were sent before them. The Civil Docket was made up as follows: John Peabody and Stephen Peabody vs. the Northwest Boom Company...

The Grand Jury having reported a bill for murder against Joseph Maher, he was arraigned, and in answer to the usual formalities pleaded not guilty. In this case the Crown was represented by Hon. Attorney General Fraser, Q. C., Adams and Wm. Wilkinson Esq., Q. C., appearing for the defence. Adjourned.

sworn--Am a physician and surgeon, residing in Newcastle when summoned to attend Connick. I arrived at Carroll's between 11 and 12 o'clock. Connick was lying on the floor in the kitchen. He was conscious and sensible of pain, and wanted me to let him alone. My own opinion was that he was not drunk. I found a clean cut wound about one inch below the navel, slightly to one side, with a coil of the small intestine protruding between 7 and 8 inches. After slightly enlarging the wound to return the bowels which had become inflated, I returned them. There were wounds about half an inch long on the external coat of the bowel. The wound appeared to correspond with the cut on the clothing. He had some vomiting of the same. I believe the wound to be caused by some sharp pointed instrument, but was sharp on both sides. The wound in the bowel confirmed this opinion. A dirk knife would give a wound of this description. I sewed up the wound and dressed it. I saw Connick two or three times after. He died in 36 or 40 hours after inflammation of the bowel produced from this wound. Connick made no personal statement to me. Cross-examined by Wm. Wilkinson, Esq., Q. C.--Taking everything together in the case of a wound like this, the chances are unfavorable to the man who had the knife. It would not be long before the wound in the bowel itself. The enlargement was only slight and was made with a knife and director. I think now I smell liquor from his breath. Next day I gave him liquor internally, and applied carbolic acid lotion externally. There was every indication of inflammation--fullness and pain upon pressure. It is possible, but not probable that an ordinary pocket-knife might produce the external wound, but not the internal one on the bowel.
