## EVERY BRITISH SOLDIER WHO HAS FALLEN ON BATTLEFIELD IN FRANCE HAS BEEN REPLACED


TWO HOUR BATTLE IN CLOUDS ENDS IN VICTORY FOR ALLIES' AIRMEN

Fight Witnessed by Large Crowd from Safe Peints of Vight Vantage - Allies put Enemy to Fight.

Geneva, April 21. -The Rhine from Basel to Muelhausen was the sceene of an aerial engagement yesterday afternoon. The action last-
ed from five until seven ${ }^{\circ}$ clock, and li was witnessed by gatherings of people at many points of vantage.
Fuor aierplanes of the Allies, two British and two French, moved out from French territiory to attack a group of German machines. Num-
erically the Germans were stronger, and as the aircratt of the Allies
were subjected to a bombardment from Fort litein, they retired. Later hey returned with reinforcements. Outrumbering the Germans, they drove them away.
Later, at 9.30 oclock, two Zeppelin airshipe, accompanied by sovof the Rhine, two miles from Basel. Their coming was followed by firing for two hours.
